Railways to expand Mumbai local services from today, but only essential workers allowed

New Delhi The Railways will expand its suburban services to Mumbai from Wednesday and run 350 trains each in the Central and Western Railway Zones, Minister Piyush Goyal said on Tuesday. The trains will, however, only carry essential services provided identified by the State government. Railways to expand to 150 local trains in Mumbai from tomorrow. As identified by State govt., essential staff incl employees of Centre, IT, GST, Customs, Postal, Nationalised Banks, MBPT, Judiciary, Defence & Raj Bhavan allowed. No services yet for general passengers. Goyal tweeted: Both the railway zones that cater to Mumbai had resumed their select suburban services, for essential staff only, from June 15. On the Mumbai Division of Central Railways, presently 200 trains are being run and 150 will be added from Wednesday, taking the total to 350.

Kolkata's potters' lane Kumartuli suffers blow due to coronavirus, 90% fall in orders from abroad

Kolkata As Kumartuli looks at a bleak business this Durga Puja, the nimble fingers of Chitra Paul, the first female professional idol maker in Kumartuli glide through one of the shortest Durga idols she is making. Some idols meant for festivities like Vishwakarma Puja or Ganesh Puja post-summer are now full of cobwebs, keeping Chitra Paul busy in cleaning the dust gathered on hundreds of such idols left in her store and workshop. Instead of painting the idols, she is cleaning them as she stores at an uncertain idol market this year. She is trying the jute threads to prepare the first skeletal structure for the idols which are usually in huge demand every year before Durga Puja. But this year is different. She has not received a single order from abroad and is still waiting for confirmation from the local puja organisers.

Fire at commercial building in Mumbai; no casualty

Mumbai A fire broke out at a seven-storey commercial building at Hirsanand Garden in Parel area here on Wednesday morning, a fire brigade official said. No casualty was reported, he said. The blaze erupted on the fifth floor of the building around 6.15 am and spread to the electric wiring, insulation and cables, false ceiling of an office and split AC unit in 3,000 square feet area. Smoke spread on the fifth and sixth floors of the building, the official said, adding that it was declared a level-2 fire around 7 am. Five fire engines, a foam tender and four jumbo tankers were rushed to the spot and efforts were on to douse the flames, he said. The cause of the fire was yet to be established, he added.

PIL for display of country of origin on products sold on e-commerce sites: HC seeks Centre's stand

New Delhi The Delhi High Court on Wednesday sought response of the Centre on a plea seeking directions to e-commerce sites to display the country of origin on products being sold on e-commerce sites. A bench of Chief Justice D N Patil and Justice Pradeep Kumar issued notice to the Centre and e-commerce platforms Amazon, Flipkart and Snapdeal seeking their stand on the plea by July 22. The court also issued notice to some other e-commerce platforms like Reliance Retail's Ayo life, Nykaa retail and Decathlon Sports. The Centre government's standing counsel Ajay Dignid accepted notice on behalf of the Ministry of Consumer Affairs. The plea by a lawyer has sought implementation of the Legal Metrology Act 2009 and the rules framed under it which mandate that country of origin has to be displayed on products being sold on e-commerce websites. The petition has claimed that the mandate was not being enforced with respect to e-commerce entities. It has contended that enforcement of the mandate was important in the current scenario when citizens intend to comply with the central government's appeal to purchase and purchase Indian goods and not from some foreign countries. Therefore, it was essential that the country of origin is displayed on products being sold on e-commerce platforms, the petition has said. The petitioner, during the hearing, contended that the Government e-Marketplace (GeM), a special purpose vehicle under the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, had issued a notification making it mandatory for sellers to enter the country of origin while registering new products on the platform, for promoting 'Make in India' and 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat'.

Odisha: Jagannath Rath's return journey Bahuda Yatra begins; 12 test positive in Puri

Bhubaneswar The return journey of Lord Jagannath's Rath Yatra at Puri began on Wednesday. As the symphony of gongs, blowing of conch shells and beating of cymbals filled the air, Lord Jagannath, Balabhadra and Devi Subhadra started their journey on their chariots from Gundicha Temple at temple city Puri on Wednesday. The sweeping ritual 'Cheraghara' was performed by Puri Maharaj Gajapati Dibhasingha Deb. After spending a week inside the Gundicha temple, the Holy Trinity will return to the Lions' Gate of Simandiri on the occasion of Bahuda Yatra. The three chariots had taken the 'Dakshini Moda' on Sunday (June 28). After reaching Simandiri, the three chariots will be outside Singhbada for rituals over the next three days. Suna Hesha and Adhama Para will be performed followed by the Nilidri Bijie the concluding part of the rituals of the Bahuda Yatra. Meanwhile, a total of 5,569 Covid-19 samples were collected last week from Puri town. Out of these, 12 tested positive for the deadly coronavirus, the health department said. All the confirmed cases have been shifted to the Covid-dedicated hospitals.



Punjab issues fresh guidelines for next phase of coronavirus lockdown

Interstate and intrastate movement of buses will be allowed without any restriction and transportation vehicles can utilise the entire seating capacity, an official spokesperson said.



Chandigarh The Punjab government on Tuesday issued fresh guidelines for the next phase of the coronavirus lockdown from July 1 to 31, saying there will be no restriction on interstate and intrastate movement of persons and goods. No separate permission/approval/permit will be required for such movements, according to the guidelines issued for the period. Interstate and intrastate movement of buses will be allowed without any restriction and transportation vehicles can utilise the entire seating capacity, an official spokesperson said. He said schools, colleges, educational and coaching institutions will remain closed till

July 31. Online/distance learning shall continue to be permitted and be encouraged, he said. Training institutions of the central and state governments will be allowed to function from July 15 for which standard operating procedures (SOP) will be issued by the Union Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT). The state government has also allowed the district authorities to impose such restrictions as deemed necessary in areas outside the containment zones, the spokesperson said. Prohibition on cinema halls, gymnasiums, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres,

bars, auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places will continue. The spokesperson further said the restrictions will remain in force in the containment zones till July 31 and such zones will be demarcated by the district authorities as per the guidelines of the Union Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW). Only essential activities shall be permitted in the containment zones, said the spokesperson. The movement of individuals for all non-essential activities will remain prohibited between 10 pm to 5 am throughout the state. Restaurants were allowed to open till 9 pm with 50 per cent occupancy or 50 guests, whichever is less. Liquor can be served provided the restaurant has a valid permission from the excise department. However, the bars shall remain closed, said the spokesperson. All shopping malls and shops, including those at main markets in both urban and rural areas, are allowed to open between 7 am to 8 pm. Liquor vendors will, however, remain open from 8 am to 9 pm, said the spokesperson. The official added that shops dealing essential commodities will be allowed to operate till 8 pm on all days.

June jeopardy: How Covid-19 picture changed for India

New Delhi June was tough on India. The country recorded more than 4,00,000 new cases of Covid-19 in the 30 days of June. This number alone would have made India the fourth worst-affected country by coronavirus case count. India anyway is the fourth worst-affected country after the US, Brazil and Russia in absolute terms. India reported the first highest number of new coronavirus cases in June after the US and Brazil. In fact, India was fourth with Mexico recording more deaths to stand behind the US and Brazil. Through the month of April when a strict lockdown was in place, India recorded 33,148 fresh cases of Covid-19. The number tapered to just 1,348 in May. At the end of May, India was the eighth worst-affected country in the world. But sharper spike in the number of Covid-19 cases saw India jumping to fourth position among the countries with maximum coronavirus caseload. By June 15, India had touched 3.22 lakh confirmed cases of Covid-19. The month ended with approximately 5.67 lakh cases. In June itself, India added 4,00,447 fresh Covid-19 cases. This means India reported over 70 per cent of all its cases only in June. The month also

saw a sharp rise in death toll due to Covid-19. On May 31, the Covid-19 death toll stood at around 5,200. It is now nearing the 17,000-mark. Approximately 12,000 people died due to complications caused by Covid-19 in June alone. Around 1,100 people had lost their lives due to coronavirus infection in April and about 4,100 in May. Comparatively, India reported about a 2-3 times higher coronavirus caseload in June compared to May, and 2-3 times more deaths during the period. The severe lung for India continues to be the biggest recovery rate. At the end of May, India had 1.93 lakh people who had recovered from Covid-19. The month of May saw a recovery of almost 87,000 coronavirus patients. In June, 2,47,842 people recovered from Covid-19. This makes the recovery rate of patients for June against the reported cases at about 62 per cent. However, many of these patients would have been diagnosed as Covid-19 patients in May itself. They recovered during June. Why did June see such a sharp spike in Covid-19 numbers? June saw relaxation in lockdown rules to a great extent with the government notifying Sikkim & 10

Assam records highest single-day spike of 613 cases, Covid-19 tally crosses 8,000-mark

Guwahati Assam recorded its highest single-day spike of 613 new Covid-19 cases on Tuesday and one Covid-19 patient died at a government run hospital in Guwahati. Confirming the numbers, Assam Health Minister Dr. Hritanta Bhowmik Sarma said a total of 613 Covid-19 positive cases were detected in the state in the last 24 hours. With the new cases, the state's Covid-19 tally for Covid-19 has now increased to 8,407. Out of the new cases, 380 cases were found alone in Guwahati city. The Assam Health Minister said in a tweet, "572 new COVID-19 cases detected today. Today, 380 cases were reported in Guwahati City alone, and need for caution can't be overemphasized. Total cases 8407. Recovered 5647. Active cases 2745. Deaths 12. 11:55 PM, June 30, Day's total 613". On June 21, Assam had reported 331 positive cases of Covid-19. According to the State Health Department's data, Assam has reported 3,152 Covid-19 cases in the last 10 days. The state had reported 351 cases on June 21 while 267 cases were recorded on June 22, 209 cases on June 23, 314 cases on June 24, 276 cases on June 25, 273 cases on June 26, 246 cases on June 27, 327 cases on June 28, 302 cases on June 29 and 613 cases on June 30.
