

G20 Health Minister's Meeting to kick-off today in Gandhinagar

The focus of the meeting will be on the three key priorities of the G20 Health Track

The G20 Health Ministers' meeting under G20 India Presidency will be held from 17-19 August at Gandhinagar in Gujarat.

India assumed the presidency of the G20 on 1 December 2022 and is currently part of the G20 Troika comprising Indonesia, India and Brazil. India's G20 Presidency marked the first time that the troika consisted of three developing and emerging economies.

The focus of the G20 Health Ministers' Meeting will be on the three key priorities of the G20 Health Track, including health emergencies prevention, preparedness and response with a focus on antimicrobial resistance and One Health framework; Strengthening cooperation in the pharmaceutical sector with a focus on access and availability to safe, effective, quality and affordable medi-



cal countermeasures (Vaccines, Therapeutics and Diagnostics); and Digital Health innovations and solutions to aid universal health coverage and improve healthcare service delivery.

Besides the G20 Deputies Meeting on 17 August and G20 Health Ministers' Meeting on 18-19 August, there will be four side events including One Earth One Health Advantage Health Care - India 2023; WHO Traditional Medicine Global Summit; India MedTech Expo 2023; and 'Sustain, Accelerate and Innovate to End TB in South-East

Asia Region' Conference.

A Joint Finance-Health Ministers' Meeting will also be held on 19 August as a focus event of the G20 Health Ministers' Meeting. There will also be combined sessions of G20 and side events during the course of the G20 Health Ministers' Meeting, Lav Agarwal, Additional Secretary in the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare said at a media briefing today.

"The G20 is a unique opportunity to showcase India's leadership in the field of traditional medicine. In the last 9 years, India has

developed 8 folds in the field of traditional medicine. By the end of the year, more than 12,500 Ayush-based Health & wellness centers will be functional across the nation, out of which 8,500 are already in place," Rajesh Kotecha, Secretary, AYUSH, said.

He highlighted that the Global Centre on Traditional Medicines in Jamnagar, Gujarat, established by the WHO, is the first such centre in a developing country. He also informed that the WHO will convene the Traditional Medicine Global Summit, co-hosted by the Ministry of

AYUSH, on 17-18 August in Gandhinagar which will explore the role of traditional, complementary and integrative medicine in addressing pressing health challenges and driving progress in global health and sustainable development.

The side event on Medical Value Travel, Advantage Health Care India 2023 is a G20 co-branded event which will focus on global collaborations and partnerships for building resilient healthcare systems.

Congress charges Centre with CAG reports, alleges corruption in govt schemes & projects

SNS & AGENCIES NEW DELHI, 16 AUGUST

The Congress on Wednesday charged the Centre over alleged irregularities in several government schemes and projects as highlighted by the Comptroller Auditor General of India (CAG) and demanded Prime Minister Narendra Modi to break his silence. Addressing a press

conference at the party headquarters here, Congress spokesperson Supriya Shrinani said: "It is a big issue of scams. The CAG, which does the auditing of the government accounts, has highlighted seven scams. Now we feel that Prime Minister and the government should carry out a raid on CAG, as how they are questioning the government."

Raj CM launches Nishulk Annapurna Food Packet Yojana for 1.04 cr families

To provide relief by bringing the public welfare schemes to the grassroots, Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot launched a "Nishulk Annapurna Food Packet Yojana" for 1.04 crore families in the state.

More than 1.04 crore fam-

ilies will get free Annapurna Kit every month, containing Pulses, Sugar, Salt, Edible Oil, Chilli, Coriander and Turmeric in the food packet, the CM announced on Independence Day at Birla Auditorium..

Non-NFSA (National Food Security Scheme) families who got economic assistance during the Covid pandemic will

also be benefited, he added.

Mr Gehlot said that the state government was taking its decisions with an intention to provide maximum relief to the common man.

He launched the scheme by distributing the food packets to the beneficiaries.

The state government by bringing all the public wel-

fare schemes on the ground has provided relief to the general public, he said

These public welfare schemes are not freebies, but it is the responsibility of the democratic government towards the general public, he added.

Towards realising the resolution of 'No One Sleeps Hungry', this Annapurna Food Packet containing one kilogram each of chana dal, sugar and iodised salt, one litre soybean refined edible oil, 100 gm each of chilli powder and coriander powder and 50gms from turmeric, will be given free through PoS machine. Families who got economic assistance during the Covid pandemic will also get free ration kit.

The Chief Minister said that many needy families are deprived as the Government of India has fixed the maximum limit in the National Food Security Scheme. During the Covid, after a survey of destitute families, around 32 lakh NFSA and non-NFSA families were provided economic assistance of Rs 5500 in Rajasthan, he said.

Sushil Modi slams Nitish for drawing comparison between PM, Vajpayee

Slamming Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar for drawing comparison between former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, senior BJP leader Sushil Kumar Modi on Wednesday said JD(U) chief makes such statements to create a wedge and divide the saffron party, as per reports.

"Nitish admire Atal Ji and Advani Ji on one hand and criticise Narendra Modi on the other hand. I want to tell him that Narendra Modi is taking forward the political legacy of Atal Ji.

If Nitish Kumar supports Atal Ji, he has to support Narendra Modi as well. Atal Ji and Modi Ji are no different," Modi said.

"Nitish always tries to make a picture of Atal Ji versus Narendra Modi or Advani Ji versus Narendra Modi. When he admires Atal Ji or Advani Ji, his intention is not to respect them but to create a divide in the party. When Advani Ji was the PM face of NDA, Nitish Kumar was the one who objected to him the most.

Now, he is turning out to be his biggest supporter. Whatever Nitish achieved in his life is because of Atal Ji and Advani Ji," the BJP leader said, according to reports. "Nitish Kumar's work place is Bihar but several leaders of JD(U) and its alliance partners like Upendra Kushwaha, RCP Singh, Jitan Ram Manjhi left him within one year of Mahagathbandhan government," he said.

Not invited to unfurl Tricolour, MP Dalit sarpanch alleges

A Dalit sarpanch of a village in Vidisha district of Madhya Pradesh has alleged that he was not invited to hoist the tricolour on the 77th Independence Day yesterday in the village school only because he is a Dalit.

The sarpanch, Barelal Ahirwar of Bhagwantpur village panchayat in Sironj, leveled the allegations against the Principal of the village school. The sarpanch said he was not invited and someone else unfurled the national flag in his absence. Ahirwar also charged that he was insulted because he is a Dalit.

The sarpanch claimed that under the Panchayati Raj rules, it is the right of the village sarpanch to hoist the national flag.

SC orders status quo on demolitions near Krishna Janmabhoomi in Mathura

The Supreme Court on Wednesday issued directions to maintain status quo for the next 10 days in connection with the ongoing demolition drive being carried out by railway authorities to clear alleged illegal constructions near the Krishna Janmabhoomi in Mathura city of Uttar Pradesh.

Directing maintenance of status quo and posting the matter for hearing after one week, a Bench of Justices Aniruddha Bose, Sanjay Kumar and S.V.N.

Bhatti issued notice to the railway ministry and Uttar Pradesh government.

The matter relates to the demolition drive being carried out by railway authorities to clear alleged illegal constructions near the Krishna Janmabhoomi in Mathura.

Earlier, the Shri Krishna Janmabhoomi Mukti Nirman Trust had moved the top court on 14 August against the Allahabad High Court's dismissal of its plea for a survey of the premises of the Shahi Idgah mosque that is adjacent to the Shri Krishna Janmabhoomi temple in Mathura.

The petitioner, Yakub Shah, in his plea filed before the Supreme Court said that he had filed an application seeking permanent injunction against demolition in civil court of Mathura but the Railway administration commenced demolition in the meantime.

The lawyer appearing for Mr Shah told the Bench that 100 houses have been bulldozed. "There are around 70-80 houses left. Whole thing will become infructuous. They conducted the exercise on a day when Uttar Pradesh courts were closed," the lawyer told the Bench.
