Rashid could make difference for Gujarat

Kolkata, May 26: Mumbai Indians' charismatic captain Rohit Sharma also received plaudits for the way he led his team in IPL 2023 because no one really counted the five-time champions as favourites in the competition after the shaky start.

Former Australia cricketer Aaron Finch lauded 'world-class' bowler Rashid Khan and captain Hardik Pandya for utilising his resources beautifully.

Speaking on Stat Sports' Cricket Live, Aaron Finch said, "GT are a strong team to beat because they have a world-class bowler in Rashid Khan. They have a good captain in Hardik Pandya, who's shown a lot of maturity. Thirdly, their fast bowling attack is also balanced." Former India cricketer Irfan Pathan hailed Rohit Sharma for marshalling his troops exceptionally well despite missing some of the key players. Irfan said, "Rohit Sharma has delivered once again for Mumbai Indians. He was faced with a crisis at the



start of the competition when key pacer Jasprit Bumrah was out. Jofra Archer struggled with his form and fitness but this captain marshalled his troops well. He first guided MI to the eliminator and then took his team to the qualifiers with his astute captaincy." The stage is set for the much-awaited Qualifier 2 in the IPL 2023 after Mumbai Indians booked the seat with their comprehensive win over Lucknow Super Giants in the Eliminator.

The five-time IPL champions will lock horns with the defending champions in the penultimate match of this season. Both teams who are lined up with potential match-winners will be raring to win and set up the summit

clash with Chennai Super Kings on Sunday (May 26).

Former India cricketer Harbhajan Singh believes the presence of senior India pacer Mohammed Shami makes GT tough opponent for even a team like MI.

Harbhajan said, "Mohd Shami is a bowler every team looks to have. He's a good new-ball bowler. He nails quick yorkers in the death overs. He has a brilliant seam position and becomes an unplayable bowler when there's swing." Harbhajan Singh also hailed star Afghan spinner Rashid Khan for his all-around performance in the TATA IPL 2023.

Windies cricketer Thomas suspended on 7 counts of corruption

Dubai, May 26: The International Cricket Council (ICC), on behalf of Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC), the Emirates Cricket Board (ECB) and the Caribbean Premier League (CPL), has charged West Indies player Devon Thomas with seven counts under their anti-corruption codes and he has been provisionally suspended with immediate effect.

The ICC, in its capacity as the Designated Anti-Corruption Official, has charged Thomas under the SLC Anti-Corruption Code for Participants in the SLC Code, the ECB Anti-Corruption Code for Participants of the T10 Cricket League (the ECB Code) and the CPL Anti-Corruption Code for Participants (the CPL Code).

The charges are:

Article 2.1.1 of the SLC Code - contriving or being party to an agreement to fix or attempt to fix, contrive or influence improperly the result, progress, conduct or other aspects of matches in the Lanka Premier League 2021.

Article 2.4.4 of the SLC Code - failing to disclose to the Designated Anti-Corruption Official, without unnecessary delay, full details of an approach or invitations received to engage in corrupt conduct in the Lanka Premier League 2021.

Article 2.4.6 of the SLC Code - failing or refusing, without compelling justification, to cooperate with the Designated Anti-Corruption Official's investigation by failing to provide accurately

and completely any information and/or documentation requested by the Designated Anti-Corruption Official.

Article 2.4.7 of the SLC Code - obstructing or delaying the Designated Anti-Corruption Official's investigation into Corrupt Conduct, including (without limitation) concealing, tampering with or destroying any documentation or other information that may be relevant to that investigation and/or that may be evidence of or may lead to the discovery of evidence of Corrupt Conduct.

Article 2.4.4 of the ECB Code - failing to disclose to the Designated Anti-Corruption Official, without unnecessary delay, full details of an approach or invitations received to engage in

Corrupt Conduct at the Abu Dhabi T10 2021.

Article 2.4.4 of the CPL Code - failing to disclose to the Designated Anti-Corruption Official, without unnecessary delay, full details of an approach or invitations received to engage in

Corrupt Conduct in relation to the CPL 2021.

Article 2.4.2 of the CPL Code - failing to disclose to the Designated Anti-Corruption Official (without unnecessary delay) the receipt of any gift, payment, hospitality or benefit (a) that he knew or should have known was made in order to procure a breach of the CPL Code, or (b) could have brought the player or the game of cricket into disrepute. Thomas has 14 days to respond to the charges.

Indian women go down fighting 2-3 to Australia 'A'

Adelaide, May 26: The Indian women's hockey team put up at fighting show in the fourth game of their tour but Australia 'A' won the closely-fought tie 3-2 here on Thursday.

Salima Tete (40')

and Sangita Kumari (54') netted a goal each for India after Alice Arnold (18') and Ruby Harris (20', 35') had put the hosts in front.

India dominated and Australia 'A' with high pressing in the first

quarter, earning a penalty corner in the 10th minute but was unable to capitalise. The hosts then won a couple of penalty corners, but India's defence held strong to prevent them from taking the lead,

and the first quarter ended goalless.

India focused on maintaining ball possession in the second quarter, but Australia 'A' took the lead when Alice Arnold (18') scored a field goal. Ruby Harris (20', 35') doubled the hosts' lead moments later as she was free at the far post, allowing her to easily put the ball in India's goal.

With the scoreline stacked against them, India began to play aggressively and even made some good attacks, but couldn't find the back of the net as Australia 'A' went into the half-time break with the 2-0 lead. Australia 'A' extended their lead early in the third quarter when Ruby Harris (35') scored her second goal of the game to make it 3-0 for the hosts. However, a few minutes later, Salima Tete (40') scored India's first goal of the match with a brilliant shot from just inside the D. The third quarter didn't see any more goals and it came to a close 3-1 in favour of Australia 'A'. Indian Women's Hockey Team will next take on Australia A in their last game of the tour on May 27 at 14:45 IST.

India in Group G of AFC U23 Asian Cup qualifiers

Kuala Lumpur, May 26: The India U-23 men's team were placed alongside United Arab Emirates, Maldives and China PR in Group G of the AFC U23 Asian Cup-Qatar 2024 qualifiers after the official draw held at the AFC House here in Malaysia, on Thursday.

Group G of the qualifiers will be hosted by China between September 6 to 12. The draw saw 43 teams divided into 10 groups of four and one group of three. Each group will be played at a centralised venue in a single round-robin format, with the 11 group winners and four best-second-placed teams qualifying for the AFC U23 Asian Cup Qatar 2024.

They will join Qatar, who have received

automatic qualification as hosts, to form the final cast of 16 at the tournament, to be played between April 15 to May 3, 2024.

The AFC U23 Asian Cup Qatar 2024 will also serve as a qualifier for the Men's Olympic Football Tournament Paris 2024. The top three teams will directly qualify for the Olympic Games as the AFC representatives, while the fourth-best team will play in the AFC-CAF Play-off.
