'Demand for housing resilient, unsold inventory overhang dips'

BACK ON FIRMER GROUND. Survey shows prices trending up on a pan-India basis

The inventory overhang in the residential real estate sector, in terms of months to sell, dipped to 33 months in December 2022, compared to 42 months a year ago, the Economic Survey for 2022-23 showed.

Housing prices are also showing a rising trend, both indicators of resilience in demand for housing.

Unsold inventories in the residential sector, were at 8.5 lakh units at the end of 2022, with about 80 per cent of the unsold stock accounted for by projects under construction, the Survey said.

"This comes on the back of sustained sales momentum as the sector steadily recovers from the impact of the pandemic," it

The Survey said going forward, measures taken to reduce the impact of rising commodity prices such as reduction in the import duties on steel products, iron

ore and steel intermediaries "will cool off the construction cost and help check the rise in housing prices.'

HOUSING PRICES

The Survey said despite the rise in home loan rates and property prices, the housing sector saw resilient demand in the current fiscal

with housing sales and launches surpassing the pre-pandemic level.

The outbreak of hostilities between Russia and Ukraine in early 2022 disrupted the global supply chain and it had an impact on the real estate sector due to the surge in prices of construction materials that

led to developers halting construction. The Survey pointed out that the wholesale price index for cement, lime, and plaster rose to 137.6 in December 2022 from 127.1 a year ago "indicating an uptick in the input cost for construction".

The Survey said the housing price tracker computed by the National Housing Bank showed that housing prices are trending up on a pan-India basis, an indicator of revival in the housing finance sector and by extrapolation to the demand for housing.

A stable to moderate increase in the index "also ofconfidence homeowners and home loan financiers in terms of the retained value of the asset," the Survey said.

The market price index, which is based on the market prices for unsold inventories went up from 100 in June 2018 (the base year) to about 115 points in the second quarter of FY23.

NHAI raised ₹10,200 crore for building roads

The National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) raised over ₹10,200 crore up to December 2022 from foreign and Indian institutional investors to meet ever-growing budgetary support for establishing a country-wide road network, the Survey said.

The sector is witnessing an increase in the construction of national highways (NHs) and roads over time, with 10,457 km of roads constructed in FY22 against 6,061 km in FY16, elaborated the Survey.

The allocation toward national highway construction by the government has registered a significant decadal CAGR of 26 per cent from ₹18,000 crore in FY13 to the ₹1,90,000 crore expected in FY23BE.

The NHAI has achieved around 90 per cent of its annual capex target of ₹1,34,000 crore by December 2022, ICICI Securities said.

NHAI launched "InvIT" in FY22 not only to facilitate monetisation of roads but also to attract foreign and domestic institutional investors, it stated.

States step up focus on boosting revenue sources

The State governments have been taking various initiatives ranging from increasing property tax and power tariffs to announcing new liquor policies and privatising state public sector enterprises to improve their own source of resource mobilisation, the Economic Survey

Citing RBI's report on municipal finances, the Survey said India's property tax collection was much lower than the OECD countries and there is a wide disparity in taxes across the States with a scope for a large-scale reform of property taxation practices in India.

The Survey said Tamil Nadu, Telangana and Kerala have revised the property taxes during the year to support their revenues while Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, Kerala, Assam and Puducherry have considered revising their power tariffs during FY23.

Since 2014, major ports' capacity has grown 76%

India's major ports have seen a 76 per cent increase in capacity to 1,534.9 million tonnes per annum over 2014 when capacities stood at 871.5 mtpa.

Major ports account for 90 per cent of the country's international trade by volume and around 80 per cent by value. Cargo handled by the major ports in FY22 was 720 mt, the Economic Survey 2022-23 said.

The 12 major ports saw a 9 per cent increase in traffic handled, year-on-year, for the April-December period. Total cargo handled include 576.63 mt for the period under review.

INLAND WATERWAYS

The Survey also points out that 26 National Waterways which are viable for cargo movement have been prioritised. Out of these, "developmental activities able National Waterways".

The cargo movement on National Waterways achieved an all-time high of 108.8 mt during FY22, recording 30.1 per cent growth compared to the previous year. "While traditional infrastructure sectors such as roads and railways have received a renewed push in recent years, sectors such as inland water transport and civil aviation. which have significant untapped potential, are also being encouraged sufficiently," the Survey

Growth in rail freight marks a pick-up in economic activity

A "sharp increase" in rail freight traffic in the last one year is indicative of "strong revival in the economic activity" post-Covid, the Economic Survey said.

Some 2,359 Kisan Rails, introduced in FY21, for movement of perishables, have transported 7.91-lakh tonnes of fruits and vegetables till October 31.

Revenue-earning freight traffic for the April-November period was 8.3 per cent higher y-o-y at 976.8 million tonnes (mt), against 901.7 mt in the year ago period.


Passenger traffic earnings are yet to recover to pre-Covid levels, the Survey said adding that in the turrent imanciai year, or ginating passenger traffic stood at 418.4 crore (up to November 2022).



FREIGHT CORRIDORS The Dedicated Freight Corridor projects – construc-

tion of Eastern and Western Freight corridors along the golden quadrilateral - is underway and it is expected to lead to "reduced transit time and (logistics) cost".

Some 21-odd GatiShakti Multi Modial Cargo Terhave been commi sioned and more than 90 more locations have been "provisionally identified", the Survey said.

Semi-high speed Vande Bharat trains have been inducted while electrical interlocking systems have been provided across 6322 stations covering 99 per cent of the stations.

The Survey added that Indian Railways plans to "develop" a demonstrative project using the Hyperloop technology.

- 1. The unaudited financial results for the quarter ended December 31, 2022 and year to date from April 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022 of Mangalore Chemicals and Fertilizers Limited ("the Company") have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on January 30, 2023 and has been subjected to limited review by auditors.
- 2. The unaudited financial results have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with relevant Rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended.
- 3. The Company is engaged in the manufacture, sale and trading of fertilisers which constitutes a single operating segment as per Ind AS 108 and hence separate segment disclosures have not been furnished.
- 4. The urea concession income for the period / year has been recognized based on management's estimate, pending finalization by the Government of India ('GOI').
- 5. The Company had during the year ended March 31, 2021 recognised urea subsidy income of INR 2,914 Lakhs without benchmarking its cost of production using naphtha with that of gas-based urea manufacturing units recently converted to natural gas, as notified by the Department of Fertilizers [DoF] for subsidy income computation, against which the Company had filed a writ petition against the DoF before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi [DHC]. Pending finalization of writ petition before the DHC, the management, based on legal opinion and considering the fact that the energy cost is always a pass-through in subsidy computation, believes that artificial benchmarking is arbitrary and discriminatory and is confident of realisation of the aforesaid subsidy income..
- 6. The Code on Social Security, 2020 ('Code') relating to employee benefits received Presidential assent in September 2020. However, effective date and the final Rules/interpretation have not yet been notified / issued. The Company is in the process of assessing the impact of the Code and will recognize the impact, if any, based on its effective date
- 7. Previous year / period's figures have been regrouped / rearranged wherever considered necessary, to conform with current period's

'Huge gap between expectation and reality'

Amit Mitra, Principal Chief Advisor to West Bengal Chief Minister and Finance Department, on Tuesday said there is huge gap between expectation and performance in terms of growth projection as indicated in the Economic Survey.

As per the Survey, India's GDP growth rate in FY23 is expected to be 7 per cent (in real term). Budget Estimate 2022-23 expects GDP growth rate to be 9.2 per cent (in real terms). "There is huge gap between expectation and performance," he said, reacting to the Economic Survey released on Tuesday.

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE On the employment front,

unemployment rate in 2020-21 is 4.2 per cent and unemployment rate (December 2022) is 8.3 per cent (Source: CMIE), which is at a 16-month high. There is a huge impact on the common

people due to high unemployment.

The country's trade deficit has doubled between 2021 and 2022 (April- Nov period). According to Ministry of Commerce data, trade deficit was at ₹8.56lakh crore during April-November 2021 and at ₹15.53-lakh crore during he same period in 2022.

"Finance Ministry is publicly appealing to the industry to invest which is an indication that private investment is not coming in the manner expected by the government," he said.

CII calls for roadmap to reduce fiscal deficit

Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) President Sanjiv Bajaj on Tuesday said the Economic Survey 2022-23 has showed that the government is on track to achieve the fiscal deficit target for the year despite fiscal pressures.

He also stated that this would help in maintaining credibility and macro-economic stability but would also create the space for increasing capex significantly, especially in the infrastructure sector, to drive the economic growth in the current year and beyond.

"CII has been advocating that spending priorities should not come in the way of achieving the fiscal deficit targets for the year and has called for a roadmap for gradually reducing the fiscal deficit to achieve the goalpost of 4.5 per cent by FY26," Bajaj pointed out.

Bajaj hailed the Economic Survey for offering a detailed, far reaching, comprehensive and in-depth analysis of the

Indian economy. He also observed that the facts and figures presented in the survey would provide a rich repository of information and insights on the economy which would hopefully provide some idea on what the budgetary numbers could look like, he stated. According to the CII chief,

the survey has rightly pointed out the contributions of proactive government policies in driving up the performance of the financial sector. According to the survey, India is poised to emerge as one of the fastest-growing insurance markets in the coming decade, which is a significant achievement.

- 1. The unaudited financial results for the quarter ended December 31, 2022 and year to date from April 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022 of Mangalore Chemicals and Fertilizers Limited ("the Company") have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on January 30, 2023 and has been subjected to limited review by auditors.
- 2. The unaudited financial results have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with relevant Rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended.
- 3. The Company is engaged in the manufacture, sale and trading of fertilisers which constitutes a single operating segment as per Ind AS 108 and hence separate segment disclosures have not been furnished.
- 4. The urea concession income for the period / year has been recognized based on management's estimate, pending finalization by the Government of India ('GOI').
- 5. The Company had during the year ended March 31, 2021 recognised urea subsidy income of INR 2,914 Lakhs without benchmarking its cost of production using naphtha with that of gas-based urea manufacturing units recently converted to natural gas, as notified by the Department of Fertilizers [DoF] for subsidy income computation, against which the Company had filed a writ petition against the DoF before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi [DHC]. Pending finalization of writ petition before the DHC, the management, based on legal opinion and considering the fact that the energy cost is always a pass-through in subsidy computation, believes that artificial benchmarking is arbitrary and discriminatory and is confident of realisation of the aforesaid subsidy income.
- 6. The Code on Social Security, 2020 ('Code') relating to employee benefits received Presidential assent in September 2020. However, effective date and the final Rules/interpretation have not yet been notified / issued. The Company is in the process of assessing the impact of the Code and will recognize the impact, if any, based on its effective date.
- 7. Previous year / period's figures have been regrouped / rearranged wherever considered necessary, to conform with current period's classification
