Czech President injured after motorcycle mishap

Prague: Czech President Petr Pavel was injured while riding a motorcycle, the Presidential office said. Pavel had a fall while riding at low speed through rough terrain on a closed training ground. He then spent the night under observation at the Central Military Hospital in Prague. The injury is said to be not serious. The newspaper Blesk reported that Pavel may have broken a rib. Pavel's schedule will remain unchanged in the coming days, including a planned trip to Jordan next week, where the president is due to meet with King Abdullah II.

100 feared dead in landslide

Melbourne: More than 100 people were feared dead in a landslide that buried a village in a remote part of Papua New Guinea on Friday. The landslide hit Kaokalam village in Enga province at roughly 3am. Residents said estimates of the death toll were above 100, although authorities have not confirmed that figure. Villagers said the number of people killed could be much higher. Prime Minister James Marape said authorities were responding and he would release information about the destruction and loss of life when it was available.

Cop held for killing 48-yr-old man

Paris: The French prosecutor for New Caledonia said a police officer was taken into custody after shooting and killing a man on Friday. Yves Dupas said the officer was believed to have fired one shot, killing a 48-year-old man. It's the seventh shooting death reported since unrest erupted May 13 on the archipelago over contested voted reforms, and comes a day after French President Emmanuel Macron made an emergency round-trip from Paris to de-escalate the violence in New Caledonia, where Indigenous Kanak people have long sought independence from France.

Hunt for survivors in Majorca

Madrid: At least four people were killed and over 20 were injured after a beachfront restaurant on the Spanish island of Majorca partly collapsed on Thursday. Videos showed that parts of the terraces had collapsed down to the ground floor, and rescue workers were working to pull out the victims from the debris. It was unclear whether any of the structure behind the terraces also fell in the collapse, which occurred about 8 pm (local time). Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez said that he was closely following the recovery effort.

Putin sets terms to halt war

Russian President Vladimir Putin is ready to halt the war in Ukraine if a negotiated ceasefire that recognises the current battlefield lines can be agreed, but will continue to fight if Ukraine and its allies do not agree, Russian sources said, according to a Reuters report.

Putin had expressed frustration to a small group of advisers about what he views as Western-backed attempts to stymie negotiations and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky's decision to rule out talks, some of the sources who are familiar with the discussions told Reuters.

"Putin can fight for as long as it takes, but Putin is also ready for a ceasefire to freeze the war," said a senior Russian leader who has worked with Putin and has knowledge of top level conversations in the Kremlin.

Russia is open to dialogue to achieve its goals and does not want an eternal war, Putin's spokesman Dmitry Peskov said.

Ukraine's foreign and defence ministries did not respond to questions. Kyiv has said categorically that a full Russian withdrawal is necessary for any talks to go ahead, a condition that makes up one of the points in Ukraine's 10-point peace formula, first outlined by President Volodymyr Zelensky in the fall of 2022.

Putin, re-elected in March for a new six-year term, would rather use Russia's current momentum to put the war behind him, Reuters quoted the sources as saying. The Russian President was of the view that gains in the war so far were enough to sell a victory to the country's citizens, two of the sources said. Tens of thousands of lives

have been lost on both sides in Europe's biggest ground conflict since World War Two, which has also led to sweeping Western sanctions on Russia.

Putin understood any dramatic new advances would require another nationwide mobilisation, which he didn't want, the report quoted two of the sources as saying. The President's popularity dipped after the first mobilisation drive in September 2022, one person said. The mobilisation led to hundreds of thousands of draft age men leaving the country.

Man stabs eight to death in China

A man killed eight people and injured one with a knife in central China, state media reported on Friday, citing local authorities.

The stabbing took place on Thursday morning in the city of Xiaogan in Hubei province, state broadcaster CCTV said. The 53-year-old attacker, surnamed Lu, had previously been treated for mental illness, it added. He is being held by police, who are investigating the attack.

The injured person's wounds were not life-threatening, according to state news agency Xinhua. Mass violent crime is relatively rare in China, which strictly prohibits citizens from owning firearms, but there has been a spate of stabbings in recent years.

On Monday, a woman wielding a fruit knife killed two people and injured four at a primary school in central Jiangxi province.

China stages mock strikes on Taiwan

As part of a two-day exercise that Beijing said was launched on Thursday to "punish" Taiwan's new president, Lai Ching-te, China staged mock missile strikes and dispatched fighter jets carrying live missiles and bombers on Friday, state television CCTV said.

The bombers set up several attack formations in waters

ter Lai took office on Monday. Taiwan has condemned China's actions.

The Eastern Theatre Command of the People's Liberation Army said in a statement on Friday that the exercises, dubbed "Joint Sword-2024A", were to "test the ability to jointly seize power."

Ukrainian military intelligence directly involved: Bortnikov

Ukrainian military intelligence is directly involved in the terrorist attack at Crocus City Hall in the Moscow suburb, Alexander Bortnikov, the director of Russia's Federal Security Service, said on Friday.

A shooting at Moscow's Crocus City Hall concert venue on March 22, followed by a massive fire, resulted in at least 144 deaths and 551 injuries, according to official statistics.

"The investigation is ongoing, but it is already safe to say that Ukrainian military intelligence has a direct connection to this attack," Bortnikov said at a meeting of the Council of Heads of Security Agencies and Special Services of the Commonwealth of Independent States in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan.

"All circumstances of the crime will be established and everyone involved in it will not escape punishment," Bortnikov promised those who attended the meeting.

Raisi's chopper caught fire soon after crash: Military

The helicopter carrying Iran's late President Ebrahim Raisi caught fire soon after it crashed into a mountain and there was no sign it was attacked, state media reported, citing the military's crash investigators.

The statement from the general staff of the armed forces in charge of investigating the crash was read on state television late Thursday.

The first statement on the crash did not lay blame but said more details would come after further investi-



gation. Raisi, the country's foreign minister and six others died in the crash on Sunday.

The general staff's statement said the communications between the control tower and the crew of the

helicopter before the crash contained nothing suspicious. It said the last communication of the crashed helicopter was between it and two helicopters accompanying it some 90 seconds before the crash.
