Imran Khan Interrogated in attack jail over Missing cipher copy : Report

Imran Khan Reuters The FIA launched investigations against the ex-prime minister for allegedly making public a confidential diplomatic.

ISLAMABAD : (AGENCY)

A joint investigation team (JIT) of the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) interrogated former Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan inside the Attock jail, in a case related to the cable gate saga, ARY News reported on Wednesday. The matter pertains to March last year when the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman brandished a letter claiming that it was evidence of an "international conspiracy" backed by the US to topple his government. Last month, the probe agency had grilled the deposed prime minister — who was removed from office via a no-confidence motion in April last year — for nearly two hours in the case after the Lahore High Court (LHC) withdrew a stay order against the call-up notice to Khan by the FIA into the audio leak involving the US diplomatic cable,



ARY News reported. The FIA launched investigations against the ex-prime minister for allegedly making public a confidential diplomatic cable and keeping it in his possession.

Earlier today, FIA's Counter-Terrorism Wing registered a case in connection with the "missing cipher" from the official record of the Prime Minister's Office and indict-

ed Khan in the case, ARY News reported citing well-placed sources said. They also confirmed that the JIT grilled Khan in Attock jail on Tuesday (yesterday). "The JIT met Khan in the office of the deputy superintendent jail," according to FIA sources. Last week, reports emerged that the JIT probing the cipher issue was nearing the conclusion of its findings but the latest publi-

cation of alleged content of the secret cable document in an online American news organisation has forced it to expand its investigation to cover the aspect of the leak to the media.

ARY News reported citing sources said the JIT was keen to see how and who had leaked the document's content to the media and whether the content of the cipher, as shared by The

Intercept, is original or exaggerated.

Last month, the cipher case took a new turn when PTI Chairman's then-principal secretary Azam Khan "recorded" a statement, terming the US cipher a "conspiracy" used by the ex-PM to "manipulate for creating a narrative against establishment and opposition. Azam, who had been "missing" since June this year, recorded his statement under CrPC 164 before a magistrate, ARY News reported citing sources.

Imran, while making the claims did not reveal the contents of the letter nor mention the name of the nation that had sent it. But a few days later, he named the United States and said that "Assistant Secretary of State for South and Central Asia Affairs Donald Lu had sought his removal". Months later, two audio leaks took the internet by storm and shocked the public after these events.

Netherlands Slips into Recession as Economy Contracts for 2nd Quarter

THE HAGUE : (AGENCY)

The Dutch economy contracted for the second consecutive quarter, according to an initial estimate by the national statistics bureau Wednesday, signalling a "mild recession" for the Netherlands.

The fall recorded over the second quarter was 0.3 percent, after the first three months of 2023 showed a contraction of 0.4 percent, the Central Bureau of Statistics (CBS) said in a statement.

A decline in household consumption was a major contributor to the contraction in the last quarter, as the Dutch "mostly bought less furniture and clothing", even though spending was up in the culture and leisure sectors, the CBS said.

Foreign trade was another significant factor in the slowdown with an increase in imports and decrease in exports, particularly from the Dutch chemical industry.

"This means according to the most common definition that the Netherlands is in recession," said Peter



lated into a decline in the labour market, van Mulligen said. Compared to the rest of Europe, after the decline linked to the Covid-19 pandemic, the Dutch economy "recovered more quickly and strongly", but for the past year, it's turned the other way, he noted.

The contraction of 0.3 percent in the Netherlands contrasts with mild growth seen in France and Belgium at 0.5 and 0.2 percent respectively in the second quarter.

90 Flights Cancelled, 23 Diverted As Storm Causes Floods At Germany Airport

FRANKFURT : (AGENCY)

Germany's biggest airport was Thursday scrambling to book passengers on new flights after a massive storm caused dozens of cancellations, and also triggered flooding that deluged streets and toppled trees. The storm swept over southwest Germany late Wednesday, dumping huge quantities of water and reportedly unleashing over 25,000 bolts of lightning in about an hour. Frankfurt Airport said it was forced to axe 90 flights while 23 more were rerouted to land at other airports.

Some passengers slept on camp beds while many spent the night at the airport hotel. "Today, the situation will probably stabilise again," a spokesman told AFP. "There are still passengers here who need to be booked onto new flights." The fire service in Frankfurt's financial capital said they lunched over 500 operations from late Wednesday to early Thursday related to the storm. There were more than 350 instances of water flooding.

Bungalows, Cars Worth \$734.32 Million Seized In Singapore Money Laundering Case

SINGAPORE : (AGENCY)

Singapore's police said they have seized \$81 billion (\$734.32 million) in assets from a gang of foreigners laundering proceeds from organised crime, including plush bungalows in the most sought-after addresses, bundles of cash, luxury cars, jewellery, handbags and gold bars. In one of its biggest money-laundering cases, police said 400 officers fanned out across Singapore on Tuesday and launched simultaneous raids on residences across the city-state, from the Orchard Road shopping belt to the resort island of Sentosa. The raids on at least nine locations netted



assets totalling a staggering \$81 billion, police said. These included 94 properties, bank accounts with \$810 million, 50 vehicles, stacks of cash amounting to more than \$23 million, hundreds of luxury handbags and watches, fistfuls of jewellery and two gold bars.

At least 10 foreigners aged between 31 and 44 were arrested, including one man who jumped out of the second-floor balcony of the second-floor balcony of the neighbourhood and was found hiding in a drain. The man, a 40-year-old Cypriot national, sustained injuries in the fall and was taken to hospital. From his home, police seized cash amounting to more than \$2.1 million, four bank accounts

were linked to each other. A police statement said the group was suspected to be laundering proceeds from overseas organised crime, including scams and online gambling. The Monetary Authority of Singapore said it takes this case seriously and has contacted the financial institutions "where the potentially tainted funds have been identified."

David Chew, director of commercial affairs at the police force, said Singapore has "zero tolerance" for being used as a safe haven for criminals or their families and for banking facilities to be abused. "Our message to these criminals is simple - if we catch you, we will arrest you.

"Playing With Fire On Taiwan Question": China Warns US

Speaking at the Moscow Conference on International Security, Li Shangfu has said reunification of Taiwan with the mainland was "inevitable."

Days after Beijing condemned Taiwan's Vice President William Lai for making stopovers in the United States calling him a "troublemaker", China's Defence Minister Li Shangfu on Tuesday cautioned against "playing with fire" when it comes to Taiwan, Chinese Defence Ministry reported.

In an apparent attack at the US, Li cautioned any attempts to "use Taiwan to contain China," and said it would "surely end in failure," China's defence Ministry said in a statement and Xinhua news Agency quoted. Speaking at the Moscow Conference on International Security, Li Shangfu has said reunification of Taiwan with the mainland was "inevitable."

"Li mentioned that the Taiwan question is China's internal affair that brooks no external interference. "The reunification of China is an inevitable historical trend," the Chinese Defence Ministry said in an official statement.

"Playing with fire on the Taiwan question and attempting to 'contain China with Taiwan' will undoubtedly end in failure," the statement quoted Li as saying. Li's comments echoed previous statements by Chinese officials but the location of his speech was significant and symbolic given Moscow's ongoing invasion of Ukraine, as per CNN. Meanwhile, Li's comments on Taiwan come on the heels of a backlash from



Beijing as Taiwan's Vice President William Lai, a front-runner in the island's upcoming presidential race, made planned stopovers in the United States during travel for an official visit to Paraguay. China's foreign ministry condemned the stopover on Sunday, calling Lai a "troublemaker through and through." In a speech to

supporters at a lunch banquet in New York, Lai portrayed Taiwan's long-term survival as something the international community should take an interest in.

"When Taiwan is safe, the world is safe, and when there is peace on the Taiwan Strait, there will be world peace," front-runner in the island's upcoming presiden-

tial race, Lai said, according to Taiwan's presidential office.

"No matter how great the threat of authoritarianism is to Taiwan, we absolutely will not be scared nor cower, we will uphold the values of democracy and freedom."

It said China firmly opposes any official interaction between the US and Taiwan and any "Taiwan independence" separatists to the US. "In a pre-recorded message to the same Moscow conference, Russian President Vladimir Putin accused the US of adding 'fuel to the fire' of global conflicts, including through its support of Ukraine. China has used similar rhetoric in its own official comments about the conflict, despite maintaining that it remains a neutral party and a proponent.

Where summer heat hits Hard : Middle East and North Africa



BAGHDAD : (AGENCY)

Climate change has impacted the Middle East and North Africa where summer is already very hot. Many in Iraq, Syria, Tunisia and Saudi Arabia still labour in the heat. Heat is a tool of the trade for blacksmith Murad Haddad in the city of Idlib in northwest Syria. "We make everything by hand here. We get up early to try to avoid the extra heat we're exposed to as well as the flames," the 30-year-old told AFP. He and

his five brothers take it in turn to use skills handed down by their grandfather as they toil in torching temperatures. As he strikes the glowing iron with his hammer, a tattoo on his forearm states categorically that "My life is painful". From time to time he removes his shirt and wipes away the sweat dripping from his beard.

"We work up close to the fire for five or six hours, until two or three in the

afternoon. It consumes us," he said.

"The heat is killing us. I have six kids, and I can hardly look after them. But if I don't work, I can't make ends meet."

Maoula al-Tai is 30 and delivers takeaway food in Baghdad where he roams the city on a backfiring moped.

When the mercury rises above 50 degrees Celsius (122 Fahrenheit), as it did at the beginning of the week, he is one of the few to venture out onto deserted streets.

"Sometimes it hits 52, 53 or 54. That's not normal. Nobody can handle that!" he said. To try to protect himself from the heat, Tai wears a balaclava that covers his nose and mouth.

The United Nations says Iraq is one of the five countries most impacted by some effects of climate change. It is now enduring its fourth consecutive year of drought.
