R-Day celebrations end with 'Beating the Retreat' ceremony

New Delhi, Jan. 30: Republic Day celebrations culminated on Friday with the Beating the Retreat ceremony that featured 26 soulful band performances, including special composition 'Swarnim Vijay' to commemorate 50 years

of India's victory in the 1971 war against Pakistan.

Indian tunes were the flavour of this year's ceremony that brought the curtains down on the four-day-long Republic Day celebrations.

Fifteen military bands

and an equal number of pipes and drums bands from regimental centres and battalions participated in the ceremony. Besides, there were performances by one band each of the Navy, the Air Force and Central Armed Police Forces

(CAPFs).

As many as 26 musical performances enthralled the audience at the historic Vijay Chowk.

The entry band was a massed one with 'Swarnim Vijay' theme. It was a special new composition to commemorate 50 years of victory of India in the 1971 war against Pakistan that led to the creation of Bangladesh.

A contingent of 122 soldiers of Bangladesh armed forces had participated in the Republic Day Parade on the Rajpath on January 26. India had last month started golden jubilee (Swarnim Vijay Varsh) celebrations commemorating the 1971 war victory.

The Swarnim Vijay performance at the Beating Retreat was followed by pipes and drums bands, and the bands of CAPFs, Air Force, Navy, Army and massed bands.

The ceremony ended with the ever-popular tune of 'Sare Jahan se Acha'.

The flag was then lowered and the Rashtrapati Bhavan, North Block, South Block and Parliament House were illuminated in unison.

B-1B Lancer heavy bomber to perform fly-by at Aero India

Bengaluru, Jan. 30: Don Heflin, US Charge d'Affaires, will lead a high-level delegation of U.S. Government officials and defence industry representatives to the Aero India 2021 to be held here from February 3.

"I am pleased to head this year's U.S. delegation to Aero India to show our continued commitment to strengthening US-India defense cooperation, in line with India's status as a Major Defense Partner, Heflin was quoted as saying in a US Consulate General Chennai press release on Friday.

"U.S. participation in Aero India 2021 reflects our increasingly close bilateral defense ties and our shared vision of a free and open Indo-

Pacific region," he said. US participation in Aero India 2021 provides both US industry and the US military services the opportunity to strengthen military-to-military relations and defense cooperation with India, the statement said.

"Our two militaries work together to uphold a rules-based international order in the Indo-Pacific. Public and private participation by the United States in Aero India 2021 demonstrates the importance the United States places on its strategic partnership with India," it said.

Leading US defence companies are also participating in Aero India 2021, including Aerospace Quality Research & Development

LLC, Airborn Inc., Boeing, IEH Corporation, GE Aviation, General Atomics, Hi-Tech Import Export Corporation, L3Harris, Laversab India, Lockheed Martin, Raytheon, and Trakka Systems.

Among the highlights of the show, a B-1B Lancer heavy bomber of the 28th Bomb Wing based out of Ellsworth Air Force Base in South Dakota, will perform a "fly-by". The B-1B Lancer, a supersonic heavy bomber, is a truly remarkable aircraft, capable of carrying out missions worldwide from its bases in the United States, as well as from forward deployed locations.

Farmers' protest: Crowd swells at venue, security beefed up

Ghaziabad, Jan. 30: Bharatiya Kisan Union (BKU) supporters stayed put on the Delhi-Meerut Expressway on Friday as the crowd swelled there, notwithstanding the Ghaziabad administration's ultimatum to vacate the UP Gate protest site where security force in large numbers was re-deployed.

On a call of the BKU, more farmers from western Uttar

Hazare withdraws fast

Social activist Anna Hazare on Friday said he won't be proceeding with the indefinite fast against the new farm laws and claimed that the Central government has agreed to some of his demands.

Union Minister for Agriculture Kailash Choudhary and BJP leader and former Maharashtra chief minister Devendra Fadnis met Hazare during the day.

A high-level committee, with some members nominated by Hazare, will consider his demands and

submit a report in six months, said Choudhary. "The Union government has agreed to some of my demands and also announced setting up a committee to improve the lives of farmers. I have decided to suspend my proposed indefinite fast starting from Saturday," Hazare said on Friday.

While announcing the hunger strike, he had said, "I have been demanding reforms in the agriculture sector, but the Centre doesn't seem to be taking the right decisions."

Pradesh districts such as Meerut, Baghat, Bijnor, Muzaffarnagar, Moradabad and Bulandshahr reached the UP Gate by early morning to join the stir, even as the security forces at the protest site thinned out overnight.

A confrontation was building up at the UP Gate in Ghazipur even as frequent power cuts were witnessed on Thursday evening at the protest site, where BKU members, led by Rakesh Tikait, are staying put since November 28 last year.

Ghaziabad District Magistrate Ajay Shankar Pandey and Senior Superintendent of Police Kalanidhi Naithani visited the protest site post midnight to review the situation there even as hundreds of security personnel in anti-riot gears were deployed since Thursday.

Many of these personnel, including those from the Provincial Armed Constabulary (PAC) and the Rapid Action Force (RAF), left the protest site in the dead of the night following official instructions.

Flanked by supporters

at 1 a.m., Tikait remained at the centrestage of the protest site - the Delhi-Meerut Expressway, which has been barricaded from both sides, prohibiting regular traffic movement.

He remained there throughout the day, with some political leaders visiting and expressing solidarity, support to the

farmers' movement.

Around 3,000 security personnel, including those from the Provincial Armed Constabulary (PAC), the Rapid Action Force (RAF) in anti-riot gears and civil police, were deployed in and around Ghazipur protest site, DSP Indiapuram Anshu Jain told PTI.

'Locals' want protesters out

The Tikri border, one of the main venues of the agitation against the Centre's farm laws, witnessed tense moments on Friday as a group of people claiming to be locals staging a protest demanding removal of the farmers there.

"Everyone saw how the national flag was dishonoured at Red Fort during tractor rally by farmers. We cannot allow such elements to stay here and work against the country in the garb of farmers," one of the group members said.

Heavy police force present on the spot persuaded the group to go back after some time.

"We have nothing against the farmers and their demands. But we also have our rights and problems. Our livelihood has been hit and we cannot move about freely due to closure of the border for over two months," said another group member. In a similar protest at Singhu Border, police fired tear gas and resorted to baton charge Friday to break up a clash between farmers and a large group of men claiming to be local residents who hurled stones at each other.

China seeks to get bilateral ties on 'right track'

Beijing, Jan. 30: China on Friday said the border issue with India should not be linked with bilateral ties, even as it welcomed External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar's remarks on the significance their ties and the importance New Delhi attached to relations with Beijing.

"I have noted his remarks," China's Foreign Ministry spokesman

Zhao Lijian told a media briefing here while responding to a question on the online address by Jaishankar to the 13th All India Conference of China Studies on Thursday. "External Affairs Minister Jaishankar's stress on the significance of China-India relations showcases the importance of China-India side attaches to its ties with China. We approve

of that," Zhao said in comments posted on the Chinese Foreign Ministry website. "Meanwhile, I need to stress that the border issue shall not be linked with bilateral relations. This is also an important lesson learned through the two countries' efforts over the past decades to keep our ties moving forward," he said.
