National Forensic Sciences University pass-outs to help Delhi cops in forensic probe



AHMEDABAD: More than 100 pass-outs from the National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU) in Gandhinagar are working with Delhi Police, assisting police in forensic probes. On August 30, Delhi Police became the first in the country to make forensic investigation compulsory through a notification. The move has come on the heels of home minister Amit Shah's announcement on Sunday at NFSU convocation that under proposed changes in the justice delivery system, a forensic expert's report would be made mandatory.

At the first National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU) convocation on Sunday, Union home minister Amit Shah had said that the new concept of criminal justice system would have forensic science as an integral part of investigation. He had said that, evidence collection and the opinion of a forensic expert will be mandatory for offences attracting more than six years of imprisonment.

Now, Delhi Police has become the first police force in the country to introduce a compulsory forensic investigation. A notification issued by Delhi Police on August 30 instructs the investigating officer (IO) or station house officer (SHO) to summon a forensic mobile van in cases where the

the university, said that currently 120-odd graduates from the university - experts in different disciplines ranging from forensic odontology to digital forensics and document forensics to toxicology - have been recruited by Delhi Police. They form a major chunk of the forensic experts with the police force. To our knowledge, Delhi Police is the first in the country to make forensic investigation mandatory. It's a matter of pride for us that these experts, who graduated from NFSU, will help the criminal justice system with their knowledge," Vyas said.

During his visit to the NFSU, Union home minister Amit Shah had also reiterated the central government's project to overhaul Indian Penal Code (IPC), Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) and Evidence Act.

Sorathiya injured in AAP, BJP clash over banner

SURAT: Workers of Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and the BJP clashed in Simada area of the city near a Ganpati Pandal over putting up the party's banner. Meanwhile, photos of Manoj Sorathiya, state general secretary of AAP, suffering head injury have gone viral on social media.

Cross police complaints have been lodged by workers of both the parties in Sarthana police station. Police have booked the accused in both the FIRs for rioting, unlawful assembly, causing hurt and other offences.

AAP spokesperson Rajesh Sanepara said, "Our workers were present at the Ganesh pandal organized by them when the BJP workers came there and wanted to put up their party's banner. The BJP men arrived with

preparation to attack us in case of a dispute." BJP workers called it a pre-planned attack. "Four workers and two labourers went to the spot to put up banners when the AAP workers attacked us. They were prepared with weapons," said Dinesh Desai, a BJP worker and complainant in one of the FIRs.

Desai alleged that he and his co-workers too suffered injuries in the attack. "We are also under treatment," Desai added.

"BJP workers went there to put up banners. Only four BJP workers were there when over 100 AAP workers attacked them. In self defence, they (BJP workers) fought back," said Kumar Kanani, a BJP MLA from Varachha.

Gujarat crosses 1 crore Covid booster doses in 18-60 years age group



AHMEDABAD: Gujarat on Thursday crossed 1 crore booster doses of Covid vaccine in 18 to 60 years age group. With about 4 crore beneficiaries, 25% of the population of the state has now got three doses of the vaccine. In the senior citizen age group, 54.73 lakh have got the booster dose, which is over 70%, said health department officials.

On Thursday, Gujarat recorded 182 new Covid cases and deaths of 20 active patients. Ahmedabad city recorded 59 cases and death of a patient. State crosses 1cr Covid booster doses in 18-60 years age group.

Other cases included 30 from Vadodra city, 27 from Surat city, and 16 from Surat district among others. Two of the 33 districts had zero active Covid cases.

Gujarat in 24 hours vaccinated 1,617 persons for the first dose and 4,631 for the second. In all, 5,43 crore are administered first and 5.39 crore second dose of Covid vaccine. The city on Wednesday recorded 57 new

Covid cases. After discharge of 83 patients, there were 495 active cases - these dropped below 500 after two-and-a-half months.

Gujarat recorded 196 Covid cases. Three active patients, one each from Bhavnagar city, Rajkot and Valsad districts, succumbed to the infection. Out of 1,673 active cases in Gujarat, 12 were on ventilators.

Other cases included 28 from Surat city, 27 from Vadodra city, 16 from Vadodra, and 11 from Valsad among others. Two out of 33 districts had zero active cases.

In the past 24 hours, Gujarat vaccinated 366 persons for the first dose and 1,562 for the second.

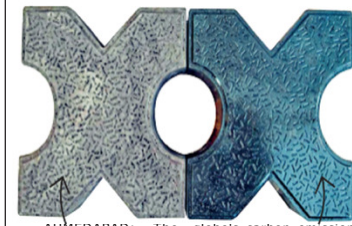
In all, 5,43 crore people were administered the first and 5.39 crore the second dose of Covid vaccine. The state administered 60,568 booster doses to the 18-59 population, taking the total to 98.94 lakh.

WB artisan flees with gold worth 28 lakh

Rajkot: A gold artisan from west Bengal disappeared with gold worth Rs 28.37 lakh from a Rajkot-based jeweller. Sanjay Dhakan, who owns a jewellery shop on Bhupendra road, registered a complaint against Robil Hussain Sheikh

and told the police that he had given Sheikh around 3 kg of gold in past three months to make jewellery items. While Sheikh returned some of the jewellery items, but he did not return gold worth Rs 28.36 lakh and suddenly disappeared.

A concrete without cement that needs no water, has more strength



AHMEDABAD: The ubiquitous concrete, quintessentially a mixture of cement and aggregate like sand or gravel, used in the construction industry just got a green makeover.

AHMEDABAD: The globe's carbon emission. Moreover, cement is next only to steel and aluminium and it uses a lot of water for curing to attain required strength," he said, adding that the search for alternatives led them to various permutations and combinations which eventually reached to fruition with a specific process.

The researchers have made blocks and pavers from the cement-less concrete - technically identified as geopolymers concrete (GPC). "These, when tested on several parameters, performed better than expectations. For example, it has compressive strength more than M75 which is much higher than the regular M30-M40 grade of concrete being used in buildings. The grade

of GPC concrete matches that of concrete being used for large infra projects such as Metro and Bullet train," said Prof Tewar.

Prof Tewar said that GPC and conventional concrete look the same. "Importantly, we have achieved the result at room temperature compared to a few global projects where the strength gain took place at high temperatures."

On the flip side, the team points to two aspects - it weighs a bit more than the cement-concrete and requires a production plant near to it. It's thus more suitable for pre-fabricated usage such as paver blocks even as further research is underway.

Prof Aanal Shah, acting dean of the Faculty of Technology,CEPT University, said that her doctoral research was on GPC, and world over the attempts are being made to find sustainable alternatives to cement. "More awareness about this material in the construction industry is needed. While countries like Australia have used the tech for building construction with separate code, it will take some time to fully understand its applications in the Indian context," she said.

Gujarat transport bus brake fails, kills one



RAJKOT: A state transport bus rammed into several vehicles in Kutch district before it hit a shop near

Kukma bus station on Wednesday afternoon.

The bus reportedly suffered a brake fail and hit a bike killing the rider Manilal Maheshwari on the spot. Thereafter, the bus rammed into six auto rickshaws, three bikes and two cars and damaged all the vehicles before damaging the shop.

District admin takes menace by the horns

Rajkot: Rajkot district administration is gearing up to take the cow menace by the horns and solve the problem without any further delay. To curb stray cattle menace in the areas adjacent to the Rajkot city, national and state highways, it has asked all the gram panchayats to create a mechanism for strict enforcement of stray cattle laws and also impound stray cattle from Monday onwards.

A meeting of all the talati-cum-mantris of Rajkot district was organized in the city on Thursday. The meeting apprised all the officials about the need to remove stray cattle from the villages that fall under five kilometre radius of Rajkot municipal corporation's jurisdiction, and also of national, highway and state highways, municipality areas and taluka headquarters.

The talati-cum-mantris were asked to call a general meeting of village panchayats falling under their respective jurisdiction on Friday. The taluka development officers have been told to arrange a meeting with persons concerned at the taluka levels. The village panchayats have been advised to fix a fine amount for stray cattle owners and create an infrastructure to impound stray cattle from their own grants. They have been told to start impounding from Monday onwards and also that the panchayat will be held responsible for any mistakes in enforcing the law strictly. Rajkot district development officer Dev Choudhary told TOI, "We want to implement the law strictly in all the 591 village panchayats. But in the first phase, we are giving priority to the villages adjoining the urban areas." According to the officials, 110 villages are located near urban areas, state and national highways in Rajkot district.

Bharuch first in country to ready startup framework

Surat: Gujarat's chemical industrial hub Bharuch has added a feather to its cap by becoming the first district in the country to introduce the District Startup and Innovation Framework. This will take entrepreneurship understanding to the level of school students, who will get financial support from the district administration if their startup idea clicks.

In the first six months, the administration plans to reach out to 20,000 students and explain to them about how they can get support for their problem solving ideas. These students will be from 44 higher education institutes and 150 schools. Further, innovation clubs will be set up in 100 schools, at least 10 in each block of nine blocks in the district and ITIs.

"Bharuch is the first district in the country that has introduced the startup framework at the district level. The initiatives taken in Bharuch are important," said Rajeev Chandrasekhar, Union minister of state for Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and Electronics and Information Technology, during his recent visit to the city. The programme will be run through the District Industries Centre as a nodal department while a District Startup and Innovation Council consisting of representatives from the government, industry, academia and society will supervise it. "There are state and central schemes for startups, but we are trying to take them to the youth in remote places, villages, and the tribal people. We have given these programmes a shape so that students from our districts fit into it," said Tushar Sumera, district collector, Bharuch.

AHMEDABAD: Lashing out at insurance companies for arbitrary and illogical rejection of Covid-19 claims despite the policy holder having a special insurance cover, the Gandhinagar District Consumer Redressal Commission said that the amount in such cases should be recovered from the erring officers of the companies.

The commission made the remark in a case involving one Pravinaben Patel, a resident of Sector 25, who had a special Corona Rakshak Policy of Rs 2.50 lakh from IFFCO Tokio General Insurance Co Ltd. April 2021.

companies to safeguard public money as its trustees, and distribute it according to the entitlements of the policy holders, but they take a myopic and hyper-technical view resulting in piling up of consumer complaints. Directing the insurer to pay Rs 2.50 lakh insurance amount with Rs 15,000 extra towards compensation to the policy holder, the commission said, "Such type of money requires to be recovered from the pocket or salary of the erring officer who has decided to deny the claim, whimsically." The commission asked the companies to keep the observations in mind so that in future, the patients do not suffer.

2 bizmen facing financial crunch end lives

Rajkot: Two businessmen ended their lives due to financial crunch in Rajkot and Morbi towns, police said on Wednesday. Mayur Bhalodiya (32), owner of a ginning mill in Devaliya village of Tankara taluka in Morbi, hanged himself to death in his mill on Tuesday evening. Police said that Bhalodiya had taken a loan of Rs 5 crore from a bank and was yet to repay Rs 2 crore. The deceased had suffered heavy losses in business and had to close down his ginning mill three months ago. Recently, Bhalodiya, a father of a 10-month-old boy, received a call from the bank for the audit of accounts so he was stressed, his family members told Tankara police. Police said that the primary investigation suggests that Bhalodiya ended his life due to financial crunch. He got married four years ago. Another businessman Lalji Patel (35) having a sewing machine parts manufacturing factory in

Kisan industries of Rajkot, hanged himself to death on Tuesday. His family members told Aji Dam police that Patel was not getting any work orders for the last three months. Patel had to let go of all his workers, however, he used to go to the factory every day. On Tuesday, Patel did not come home for lunch from the factory. His family members called him in the evening but he did not pick up the phone. Patel's elder brother and his wife went to the factory and found him hanging by the ceiling fan. Patel is survived by his wife and a five-year-old daughter. His family members told Aji Dam police that Patel was not getting any work orders for the last three months. Police said that Bhalodiya had taken a loan of Rs 5 crore from a bank and was yet to repay Rs 2 crore. The deceased had suffered heavy losses in business and had to close down his ginning mill three months ago.
