Ban, recession push Gujarat fish exports down by 35%



RAJKOT: While the nets are cast for fresh catch, sea food export from Gujarat is in doldrums - down by 30 to 35% in the beginning of the fish season itself - thanks to inflation, recession in Europe and the US and a weak euro against the dollar.

Reduced purchasing powers of consumers in European countries is a major reason for declining exports, says sea food exporters. Factors like devaluation of euro, high energy price, average electricity bill per household going by five to seven times besides various other economic reasons

have had an adverse impact on the Indian exporters as well. High-end varieties like cuttlefish, pomfrets, lobsters and Jumbo shrimps go to the European market. But fish has now become an exotic item in the European market thus diverting the fish eaters to find alternative source of protein owing to the rocketing prices of sea food. The average cost of fish in Europe is 12 euro per kilo.

Gujarat's sea food export market depends on China, Europe and USA. China accounts for 40% export while Europe accounts for 30% export. And therefore, Gujarat's exporters are still far away from pre-Covid levels in export figures to China.

Veraval town in Gir Somnath district, which has over 100 fish processing units, commands yearly export to the tune of Rs 5,000 crore. President of Seafood Exporters Association of India (SEAI), Jagdish Fofandit told TOI, "The impact of world recession has started from Europe. High fuel cost and energy cost because of war between Russia and Ukraine resulted in high inflation. We fear that it will wipe out our growth in exports in the last several years."

The US has declined import owing to inflation, unemployment and several other trade-related problems. Vietnam get preferential tariff in USA because of trade agreements and also the shipping charge is lower compared to India due to its proximity. Kenny Thomas, a leading exporter who exports exclusively in the European market, said, "I have been in this business for the past 35 years but found this year to be one of the slowest. My inventory is 20% higher than last year."

2,00,000 children in India are born with congenital heart disease

Ahmedabad, The term 'congenital' means present at birth - any defect that is congenital therefore has the clock ticking on it already. Early detection is a game changer. Medical Journal of Indian Pediatrics suggests that 2,00,000 children are born with Congenital Heart Disease (CHD) in India every year. One-fifth of these children are likely to be serious, requiring surgery within a year. The numbers reflect India's genetic vulnerability to heart defects. Narayana Multi Speciality Hospital Ahmedabad Dr. Vishal Changelal - Pediatric Cardiologist - said that according to a 2018 report published in the National Library of Medicine, considering a birth prevalence of congenital heart disease as 9/1000, the estimated number of children born with congenital heart disease in India is more than 200,000 per year. In spite of advanced cardiac care being available in the country only a minority of such children are getting benefited. Early detection is the key to treating congenital heart disease. "Of the 240,000 children born with CHD each year in India, about one-fifth would need early intervention to survive the first year of life. (13-9)

Pardhi gang members nabbed



RAJKOT: Three members of Pardhi gang were arrested by the local crime branch of Jamnagar for committing a theft in the house of an advocate in August when the house was locked. The gang had allegedly stolen cash and ornaments worth Rs 34 lakh. The police arrested Raju Mogiyia, Chavla Mogiyia and Ajay Pangli and recovered cash and jewelry worth Rs 20 lakh from them. Earlier, they had committed burglary on a big scale in Telangana, Andhra Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh. They came to Jamnagar to sell balloons at the mall.

Rajkot: The police arrested three persons of Kalawad town of Jamnagar district for selling country-made liquor in the name of ayurvedic drugs. The police had raided their factory in May but they were arrested on Wednesday night after a forensic report. The police arrested Gopal Parmar, Dilip Jadaje and Ketan Jananiya. During the raid, the police had found various bottles with pills on them that gave the impression that they were ayurvedic drugs.

The police found 200 litres of country-made liquor, 160 litres of ethanol, and 200 litres of isopropyl alcohol. The forensic report suggested that the liquor was a highly poisonous liquid and dangerous for human consumption.

Shot fired during brawl, doctor hurt

AHMEDABAD: A shot was fired in the Chandlodia area of the city late on Thursday during a fight between the owners of two shops in a commercial complex. A doctor named Rahul Yadav, 25, suffered injuries to his face and a fracture in his right shoulder after which his father Satish Yadav, 55, who runs a security agency, fired one round in air.

A Sola police has registered complaints from both parties in the case. In the first complaint, Vijaypal Chauhan, 46, a resident of New

Saraswatinagar in New Ranip, said he runs a nursery in Bhadaj. Vijaypal had bought a shop in the Rudram Flats building in Chandlodia a year ago. On Thursday, when Vijaypal's son Satish Chauhan and friend Vijay Koti went to see their shop. They found that Dr Rahul Yadav, the owner of a shop in the neighbourhood, had kept some furniture in Vijaypal's shop. When Satish Chauhan asked Rahul about this, he allegedly began abusing Satish Chauhan and Kori. After this, Satish Chauhan called his father who also went there. Rahul called his father, Satish Yadav, to their shop and they began fighting with each other. During the fight, Rahul was struck with a blunt object by Satish Chauhan and his family members, according to the FIR by filed Satish Yadav.

Vadodara: Family of four missing from Kapurai flat



VADODARA: A family of four members has gone missing for a week from their residence at Kapurai Crossroads. The Panigate police have filed a complaint of a missing persons and began searching for the family. Financial problems seem to be the reason behind their disappearance. Rahul Joshi, a temporary teacher, had taken a loan of Rs 29 lakh to start a hotel by mortgaging his flat. But the business didn't take off and he faced severe difficulties in repaying the loan. The disappearance was detected only after Joshi's elder brother called him on the phone last week but all his calls went unanswered. When he rushed to their residence, he found the flat locked. He then alerted the police. Cops on Tuesday opened Joshi's flat and found two letters inside. In the letters, Joshi has accused four persons of being responsible for his and his family's death. The police, however, are trying to trace Joshi who has disappeared along with his wife Neeta, son Parth and daughter Pari.

MSU inks MoU for climate change study

Vadodara: MS University has signed an MoU on Saturday with Gujarat government's climate change department for promotion of research and innovation in the area of climate change. Pact was inked on the sidelines of the Pancharmit climate change: Youth outreach fortnight in presence of Gujarat chief minister Bhupendra Patel. "It is a strategic MoU that we have signed with the climate change department to connect youth for propagation of renewable energy," said a university official.

Till when the evil of Rape will continue ?

Don't we think that violence against the weaker sex brings out the many demeanor of our society where oppression of women is deemed as a custom? Women were silently suffering earlier but due to presence of media and sensitization of police, they are now coming forward to speak against all types of crime. While serious law reform is the need of the hour, it also should be taken into consideration that the planners, administrators, and law enforcement agencies work efficiently and diligently in that direction. This diminishing social protection has made vulnerable, especially working and college going women in the city to crimes like eve-teasing, molestation and rape. It is noticed that the prevalence of crimes against women in a certain place depends on a large extent to the social ambience of that place. The punishment for battering, molestation, sexual harassment and unlawful threat must be increased. Projects must be launched for a better cooperation between the police, the social services and other relevant parties. Government should come out with much more essence and urgency to check the indecent behaviour against women folks, and the need to chart out stern measures on the part of administrative authorities for curbing down such events. People also need to come out with determination against the such evils and not be a moot spectator wherein a daughter,

or a sister, or a wife, or a mother is crying for alms.

One would find that the scenario for women seems grim indeed and this will continue so long as the basic social and economic structures remain unchanged and the implementing and law and order agencies show indifference. Public display of big hoardings only serves to excite the young mind. Law alone cannot put an end to evils that are endemic in the social structure; the government can at least make some attempt to take its own enactments seriously. Crime is endemic to the human condition, but a crime specifically directed at one sex is most despicable and unfortunately, the one that is punished least. According to the Government's statistics twenty five rapes are committed in the country every day but the unofficial record is in very large number. One would find that Rape is a sexual as well as cultural attack which has become a great social problem today. There are many rape cases which do not make the headlines of the leading newspapers but the timely actions are not taken. It is obvious that there is much to be done to change our laws on rape. While Sections 375 and 376 of the Indian Penal Code are the major laws dealing with rape, they have failed to match the international standards of addressing the crime. Making tougher laws will only be as effective as its implementation. Violent crimes against women are symptomatic of a deep societal dysfunction. Any new law on rape should include the conduct of the defence lawyer and bar unethical questions against the rape victim. If an FIR is registered against a person in a rape case, he should be automatically disqualified from contesting elections. The prosecution for rape and sexual harassment should have toughest lawyers pleading the case to have 100% conviction and not one in over 1000 cases.

In view of the increasing incidence of the rape incidents, it is absolutely necessary to review the rape law humanely and progressively as the existing law is not only partial but also outdated. The subject needs a comprehensive review and should include various types of assault, violence and torture, and with gender neutrality. Indian women are far too vulnerable to violent assaults. Sexual violence in villages, though little reported, keeps haunting the women indoors after dark. The pity is that to change attitudes to rape so many young women have had to suffer and die. An act the police never prosecute and the public ignores. Women are routinely groped and harassed on public buses and trains. The reason behind is the vulgar display by even top grade heroines in the form of 'item numbers' has become a must for any successful movie. All these adds to the frustration where the age of sexual maturity does not match with the permissible age for marriage. A piece of fool-proof legislation is needed to safeguard innocent victims. One should see that by giving a deterrent punishment to the rapist the evil of rape would not be solved. Once it is proved that the person is guilty of rape he should be hanged and the women for their self-defense should learn the art of Karate, Judo and if not they should keep a chilly powder in order to escape from the rapist. Before the dignity of more women is sacrificed, we need to have a real change for the better democracy, greater freedom, full transparency, strict law enforcement, and mandatory punishment for heinous crimes against women.
