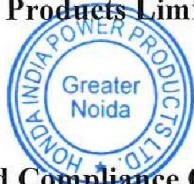

'If not resolved, farmers' agitation will spread'

NEW DELHI: Hitting out at the government, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Friday warned that if farmers' agitation is not resolved, it will spread from villages to urban cities of the country.

In a no-holds-barred attack at the Centre, Gandhi accused the government of trying to intimidate and discredit the farmers, using the National Investigation Agency (NIA).

"It is very obvious that the farmers are very agitated because the government is destroying their livelihood. It is destroying the livelihood of our labourers and it is going to give the middle class a shock in the coming times because the prices of food are going to sky-rocket," the former Congress chief said at a press conference.

"What is being done to the farmers is absolutely criminal. You (government) are beating them, you are threatening them, you are bullying them, you are trying to discredit them," he said, adding that the government needs to talk to the farmers and provide a solution to them.

Gandhi asserted that the only solution is repealing these laws and "putting the laws into the waste paper basket".

"The government must not think that the farmers are going



back home. They are not going home and my concern is that this situation is going to spread. We do not need this situation to spread, we need a conversation with farmers and we need a solution," Gandhi asserted.

Explaining about the impact of three farm laws on farmers, he said, "The first law destroys the mandi system and agricultural markets of this country, while the second law allows unlimited storage of grain and other materials and will make it practically impossible for our farmers to negotiate their prices and the third law basically says that if the farmers have a grievance, they cannot go to court."

Responding to a question, he said, "The farmers' movement is going to spread to other states and cannot be suppressed. The whole issue is not just about farmers and this will go from farmers to workers to urban areas and slums."

FIR against Tharoor, 6 scribes

BHOPAL: Madhya Pradesh police have filed a First Information Report (FIR) against Congress MP Shashi Tharoor and six journalists over their 'misleading' tweets on the violence during the farmers' tractor rally in Delhi, an official said on Friday. The FIR was registered in Bhopal after a complaint lodged by one Sanjay Raghuvanshi late on Thursday night, Misrod Police Inspector Niranjan Sharma said.

The journalists named in the FIR are Mrinal Pande, Rajdeep Sardesai, Vinod Jose, Zafar Agha, Paresh Nath and Anant Nath. An unidentified

person has also been named in the FIR, he said.

The case against them was registered under IPC sections 153 A (promoting enmity between different groups on ground of religion, race, place of birth, residence, language, etc), 153 A (1) b (any act which is prejudicial to the maintenance of harmony between different religious, racial, language or regional groups and which disturb or are likely to disturb public tranquility) and 505 (2) (statements creating or promoting enmity, hatred or ill-will between classes)

Oppn raises slogans against 3 farm laws in Lok Sabha

NEW DELHI: As the Budget session of the Parliament commenced on Friday, the members of various opposition parties raised slogans in Lok Sabha demanding repeal of the three new farm laws.

As soon as the House paid tributes to late Union minister Suresh Angadi and 26 former members, including Jaswant Singh, Tarun Gogoi, Motilal Vora, Ahmed Patel and Ram Vilas Paswan, members from the Congress, DMK and the Left parties entered the Well of the House raising slogans. The members of Shiv Sena were also seen raising slogans from their seats.

The opposition members were demanding repeal of the three new farm laws. They were also demanding that obituary be paid to the farmers who have died during the agitation by farmers against the legislations.

Notably, over 20 opposition parties boycotted the President's address to the joint sitting of Parliament in support of the demand of the protesting farmers for the repeal of the three farm laws. Congress leader Rahul Gandhi was present in the House when his colleagues were raising slogans in the Well near the Speaker's podium.

However, Speaker Om Birla urged the agitating members to return to their seats and adhere to the Covid-19 protocols, including distancing norms.

Soon after the House met for the day, JD(U) leader Sunil Kumar, who had won the bypoll from Valmiki Nagar parliamentary seat, took oath as a member.

Kovind defends new farm laws and condemns R-Day violence

Government is 'vigilant', says President amid standoff with China

NEW DELHI: President Ram Nath Kovind on Friday strongly defended the three new agri laws saying their benefits have begun reaching 10 crore small farmers instantly and condemned as "very unfortunate" the Republic Day violence and "dishonour" to the tricolour during the tractor parade by the protesting farm unions here.

In his customary address to the joint sitting of Parliament that marks the start of the Budget session, Kovind, without naming China, also slammed that country for its efforts to disrupt peace at the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in "utter disregard" of bilateral relations and agreements.

Hailing the security forces for foiling attempts to change the status quo at the border amid an "unprecedented escalation" in tension, Kovind, who is also the Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces, said the government is "vigilant" and that additional forces have been deployed to safeguard India's sovereignty.

The President's hour-long address was boycotted by over

20 opposition parties including the Congress in support of the demand of the protesting farmers for the repeal of the three farm laws. Congress MP Ravneet Singh Bittu raised slogans like 'Jai Jawan Jai Kisan' during the address. Some opposition MPs were heard raising slogans in the Central Hall's gallery.

The government's efforts to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic and the massive vaccination drive also came in for praise from President Kovind whose address is cleared by the Union Cabinet.

With his speech outlining the government's work and agenda coming at the time of a lengthy agitation by farmers at Delhi's border, Kovind highlighted the Modi dispensation's efforts to give fillip to agriculture, especially small farmers, and also dwelt at length about its measures to boost economy, infrastructure, industry and helping the poor among others.

He also noted that the new farm reform laws enacted in September last year have immediately benefited 10 crore small farmers, and said various parties in the past had sup-

ported these measures.

Criticising the violence which marred the farmers' protest on the Republic Day on January 26, he said if the Constitution gives us the right to freedom of expression, it also teaches us to take laws and rules seriously.

Noting that the Supreme Court has put the implementation of the three laws on hold, Kovind said the government

will respect whatever is the decision of the apex court.

"My Government has always respected freedom of expression and holding of peaceful agitations in a democratic set up. However, the recent acts of dishonouring the National Flag and showing disrespect to the auspicious occasion of the Republic Day are unfortunate," he said.

The need of the hour in the

agricultural sector is to focus our attention on the small and marginal farmers who own only less than two hectares of land and comprise more than 80 percent of the farmers in the country, he said, putting their numbers at over 10 crore.

"My government accords priority to these small and marginal farmers too. In order to provide expenditure support to these farmers, almost Rs 1,13,000 crore have been directly transferred to their bank accounts under Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi."

Acknowledging that the Budget session is being held at a challenging time of COVID-19, he said no matter how big the challenge is, India will remain undeterred and asserted whenever the country has remained united, it has attained even seemingly unattainable goals.

The President expressed his satisfaction over the government's measures to fight the pandemic and asserted that its timely decisions saved lives of lakhs of people while its record package helped the economy. Over 80 crore poor people were provided free ration for eight months, he said.

Smriti Irani accuses Rahul of giving a call for 'violence'

NEW DELHI: The BJP on Friday accused Rahul Gandhi of declaring "war" on Indians and giving a call for "violence" after the Congress leader warned the government that if farmers' protest is not defused then their agitation will spread across the country.

At a press conference,

Smriti Irani alleged that Gandhi has said if Prime Minister Narendra Modi does not support his political stand, then cities will "burn".

"Never before in our democratic history have we witnessed a political leader asking for fire of violence to spread instead of seeking and promoting peace," she said, alleging



that Gandhi wants violence during the national capital saw during the farmers' protest on Republic Day to be replicated across the country, including in slums where the poor live.

She also hit out at the Congress leader for not speaking a word of support and consolation to over 400 police personnel who were injured in

violence during the farmers' tractor parade on Republic Day and not speaking against the attacks on cops and others.

This is shocking but expected of him, Irani said.

He not only wants law and order breakdown but also supports anarchic elements daring to insult tricolour and break country, she alleged. MPOST
