Chennaiyin enter last eight of Durand Cup football

The Group C game was the 40th and final of the Group stages, with the quarterfinals scheduled in Kolkata between September 9-12.

Anirudh Thapa scored one and assisted in the other, to do the star turn for CFC in what was a game CFC could not lose and Neroa had to win, to survive in Asia's oldest football tournament.

Chennaiyin looked the better side throughout and had the more quality fire-power at this stage of the tournament, to come through quite comfortably in the end, it was what was a pressure game in front of a boisterous home crowd.

It helped Tomas Brdaric's side that the goal came early. A long ball meant for Croat striker Petar Sliskovic, missed his head but

struck his marker's and fell on the path of Anirudh Thapa's run. The diminutive midfielder took one touch to burst into the box and let go of a right footer which beat the Neroa keeper Soram Poirei for power.

Neroa could have equalized at the half-hour mark when John Chidi snatched the ball from Iranian defender Vafa, just outside the CFC box and drove in, but his curler round the keeper missed the target.

CFC kept attacking and creating chances and the Chidi effort turned out to be the only effort of note for the homeside in the end.

The CFC midfield, in particular Thapa, began taking total control of the game in the second half. Regular forays by Rahim Ali and

Sliskovic, brilliantly maritaled by Thapa as well as Sajal Bag on the wings made it a matter of time that CFC would score.

Vafa Hakhamaneshi finally provided that insurance when he leaped up to a beautifully delivered Thapa free-kick, to bang home a header. Soirei did not move.

The experienced CFC side played out the rest of the game without much fuss and with Neroa already deflated. The best they could do was a Johnyachand Singh header from a Thomyo cross in the final seconds of added time, which was off target.

Anirudh Thapa, now has five goal contributions in the nine goals that CFC has scored so far in the tournament.

AIFF executive committee to decide on foreign coach

Kolkata, Sept 6: The fate of Indian men's senior team head coach Igor Stimac will be known after the September 18 meeting of the All India Football Federation's executive committee, new president Kalyan Chaubey said.

Stimac's contract ends in September. After guiding the national team to the 2023 Asia Cup with a dominant show in the qualifiers in June, Stimac had expressed his desire for the AIFF to take a call on his contract

quickly.

At that time, the AIFF was being run by the Supreme Court-appointed Committee of Administrators (CoA).

Chaubey said the technical committee, appointed on Saturday with the legendary I M Vijayan as its head, will submit a report of the performance of the national team under Stimac, and the new executive committee will take a decision on whether the Croatian coach will continue or not.

"The technical commit-

tee will prepare a report based on the performance of the national team and submit it on September 18. The executive committee will discuss the report and take a decision on Stimac," Chaubey said in an interview.

The new executive committee of the AIFF is expected to meet on September 18 in Kolkata.

Stimac, a part of Croatia's 1998 World Cup third-place finishing team, was appointed as India head coach in May 2019 on a two-year contract.

His tenure was extended till September 2021 before another one-year extension till September 2022.

If Stimac is given another extension or new contract on September 18, he will straightforward head to Vietnam for the Indian team's two international friendly matches there. India are scheduled to play against Singapore on September 24 before taking on Vietnam on September 27 in Ho Chi Minh City.

Indian golfer Anirban finishes 2nd after 3-way play-off

Boston, Sept 6: Top Indian golfer Anirban Lahiri made a memorable debut on the LIV Golf Tour by finishing second after a three-way play-off in the Boston Invitational here.

Lahiri made a big dash in the closing stages and went into the play-off alongside eventual winner Dustin Johnson and Joaquin Niemann.

It was also one of the biggest paydays for Lahiri who won \$ 1,182,400 and an additional \$ 375,000 as his share from the second place in the team event.

Johnson earned \$ 4 million for the individual win and an additional \$ 750,000 for his quarter share of the \$ 3 million team prize.

It was Johnson's first win in the rebel series but his team 4Aces won the team competition for the



third time in a row.

Johnson holed a 60-foot eagle putt on the first play-off hole to beat Lahiri and Niemann, two of the six players making their debuts this week. All three players finished regulation at 15 under.

The play-off was the first in either the individual or team competition in this inaugural season.

Johnson's final-round 65

was one of three counting scores for 4 Aces GC to go along with Patrick Reed's 66 and Talor Gooch's 69.

Lahiri, playing for Crushers GC, shot a 6-under 64. Lahiri had a chance to reach 16 under with a brilliant second shot into the par-5 18th hole, but his eagle putt lipped out.

Two others fell just short in making the playoff. Lee Westwood shot the lowest round in any of the first four events with an 8-under 62 but bogeyed two of his last three holes and finished at 14 under. Smith shot 64 but also suffered a late bogey.

The total team prize money for each event is \$ 5 million, with the winning team dividing \$ 3 million, second place dividing \$ 1.5 million and third place dividing \$ 500,000.

cash given by the shopkeeper. "The bags are okay," he said, leaving the shop along with a very disturbed me, "They are the right thickness!"


"How do you know?" I whispered feebly.

'Showman' Nick stuns defending champ Daniil

New York, Sept 6:

Australia's Nick Kyrgios stunned defending champion Daniil Medvedev at the US Open with a brilliant performance to reach the quarterfinals at Flushing Meadows.

Kyrgios delivered one of the best performances of the tournament on Sunday night, overcoming world No. 1 Medvedev, 7-6 (13-11), 3-6, 6-3, 6-2 at Arthur Ashe Stadium to advance to his first

quarterfinal in New York.

Aiming his maiden semifinal appearance at the US Open the 27-year-old will play Russian player Karen in the quarterfinals.

The 23rd seed Australian entered the match with a 3-1 ATP Head-2-Head lead against Medvedev and in the best

form of his career, but taking out the top seed at a Grand Slam was an entirely new challenge. He passed the test with

flying colours, playing his aggressive game to triumph after two hours and 53 minutes.

After the loss, Medvedev will lose his top spot in the ATP Rankings after the US Open. Rafael Nadal, Carlos Alcaraz or Casper Ruud will become World No. 1.

Kyrgios is up seven places to No. 18 in the ATP Live Rankings and has replaced Alex de Minaur as Australia's highest-ranked player.

He has not been ranked that high since August 2018. The Australian was World No. 137 six months ago on 22 February.
