# AAP's Sanjay Singh also suspended; Rajya Sabha sees another washout

20 suspended MPs begin relay protest in Parl

NEW DELHI: AAP's Sanjay Singh on Wednesday became the 20th MP to be suspended for unruly behaviour from Rajya Sabha sittings for the rest of the week as the Upper House saw no business transaction during the day with four adjournments and vociferous protests by opposition members.

The latest suspension triggered protests from other AAP MPs while the opposition parties insisted on a discussion on price rise. As soon as the proceedings commenced at 2 pm, opposition members, mostly from the AAP, trooped to the Well of the House. Bhuvaneshwar Kalra, who is in the chair, asked suspended AAP member Sanjay Singh to exit the House.

"Sanjay Singh ji you are suspended for the rest of the week so please withdrawing from the House," he said. Kalra also asked other protesting members at the Well of the House to return to their respective seats but they kept on raising slogans.

With the MPs refusing to budge, Kalra adjourned the proceedings for the day.

The proceedings were adjourned three times during the pre-lunch period amid uproar by the opposition members and Singh was suspended for the remainder of the week.

Earlier, the House was adjourned soon after it met at 11 am and then twice during the Question Hour - first for 15 minutes and then till 2 pm. As soon as the House met after the first adjournment at 12 noon, Deputy Chairman Harvansh invoked Rule 236 and named AAP member Singh.

Thereafter, Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs V Muraleedharan moved a motion to suspend and adjourn the House for the remainder of the week. The motion was adopted by voice vote, even as opposition members continued to raise uproar in the Well of the House. The deputy chair-



Trinamool Congress MPs — who were suspended on Tuesday over unruly behaviour and disrupting proceedings on Wednesday — staged a sit-in protest at the Gandhi statue outside Parliament on Wednesday.

man asked Singh to leave the House soon after the motion was adopted.

Later, Singh said he had raised the issue in the House. The Nationalist Congress Party and the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha who have no members suspended will also join the protests, sources said.

"Question: What were Opposition MPs demanding Answer: A discussion on #PriceRise #GST hurting millions of people Action: Dictatorial behaviour in the House created 24 MPs from #Parliament Next few days 24x7 dharna at Gandhi statue. Peaceful satyagraha will always WIN," tweeted TMC's Rajya Sabha member Derek O'Brien. While the Congress and other Opposition parties were protesting at different venues in the morning, by the evening, it seemed they had come together on the issue of price rise. Sources in the Opposition also said a detailed plan of action has been drawn out for the dharna and a roster of duties created which is being circulated on a dedicated WhatsApp group.

## 84,405 posts vacant in paramilitary

"to be filled up by 2023"

NEW DELHI: A total of 84,405 posts are lying vacant in six Central Armed Police Forces, with the Central Reserve Police Force having the highest number of vacancies at 29,985, Rajya Sabha was informed on Wednesday.

Union Minister of State for Home Nitinandan Prasad said the government has decided to fill up the existing vacancies in CAPFs by December 2023.

The total strength of CRPF, BSF, CISE, SSB, ITBP and Assam Rifles is 1,03,579. He said the CRPF has the highest number of vacant posts at 29,985, followed by 19,254 in the BSF, 11,402 in the SSB, 10,918 in the CISE, 3,187 in the ITBP and 9,659 in the Assam Rifles. The minister said the examination for filling up 25,271 posts of constable (general duty) has already been conducted.

## Protectees list being circulated not official, says Punjab police

CHANDIGARH: The Punjab Police on Wednesday clarified that the documents allegedly mentioning security categorised protectees being circulated in a section of the media are not official documents and cautioned against attributing the document to the Punjab Police. Sharing the details, a spokesman of the Punjab Police said that the circulating document is in fact a part of Annexure-5 of the Writ Petition No. 11872 of 2022 filed by O.P. Soni in the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court. These attached documents are in no way the official documents of Punjab Police, he said.

## Gujarat hooch death toll rises to 40, nearly 50 people still admitted to hospitals; 10 held

AHMEDABAD: The death toll due to the consumption of spurious liquor in Gujarat's Botad district has reached 40 with seven more people succumbing in the last 12 hours, a police official said on Wednesday.

Out of the deceased, 31 belonged to different villages in Botad and nine were natives of nearby townships. Dhondhuka taluka in Ahmedabad district, the official of Botad police control room said.

Nearly 50 people were still admitted to hospitals in Ahmedabad, Botad and Ahmedabad, he said.

The Botad and Ahmedabad police on Tuesday registered three First Information Reports (FIR) against nearly 20 culprits under Indian Penal Code Sections 302 (murder), 328 (causing hurt by poison) and 120-B (criminal conspiracy) and have arrested at least 10 of them so far.

The Vadodra rural police on Wednesday nabbed Janabhai Rathod, one of the accused in an FIR registered by Barvala police in Botad and absconding since being booked, an official said.

The hooch tragedy had come to light early Monday morning when some people living in Rojid village of Botad and other surrounding villages were referred to government hospitals. Primary investigations by police have revealed that some small-time bootleggers of different villages of Botad district had made spurious liquor by mixing water with methyl alcohol or Methanol, a highly poisonous industrial solvent, and sold it to villagers for Rs 20 per pouch.

## NCST reports since 2018 under process: Centre responds to Abhishek's question

NEW DELHI: Answering an unstarred question by Trinamool Congress (TMC) Lok Sabha member Abhishek Banerjee, the Centre informed the Parliament on Monday that reports of the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes since 2018 are still under process in the Ministry of Tribal Affairs. Three annual reports — 9th, 10th and 11th of NCST — have been laid by the ministry before the Parliament since 2018, MoS Tribal Affairs Bishweswar Tudu said.

The Union minister added: "As per Clause 6 of Article 338A of the Constitution of

India, the President shall cause all such reports to be laid before each House of Parliament along with a memorandum, explaining the action or proposed to be taken on recommen-

Tudu also mentioned: "For preparations of the Explanatory Memorandum, the concerned stakeholders i.e. Central Ministries/Departments of the Government of India, State Governments, Statutory Bodies, Autonomous Institu-

tions, Public Sector Banks and undertakings are requested to furnish Action Taken Reports/commitments' inputs." Banerjee also asked for the expected time frame for the tabling of these reports, where the minister answered: "As and when the reports are ready, the reports/commitments/inputs are received from various stakeholders, an Action Taken Memorandum on Recommendations and Policy issues are compiled and prepared. Thereafter, getting the approval of the Hon'ble President of India, the Reports of the NCST along with Action Taken Memorandum are laid in both the Houses of the Parliament."

## No significant brain drain, Govt tells LS

NEW DELHI: No significant brain drain to such an extent of affecting the country's development in the field of science and technology has been observed, the Centre informed Lok Sabha on Wednesday. Minister for Science and Technology Jitendra Singh said multi-faceted approaches have been adopted in terms of creating adequate opportunities in the country to retain highly skilled talent pool. He said efforts have also been made to encourage the return of the best-in-class scientists from abroad to India, for enhancing the nation's capabilities in various areas of scientific research, development and deployment.

## SC 5 PMLA RULING

## BJP hails it as 'landmark verdict', Cong expresses disappointment

NEW DELHI: As the Supreme Court upheld certain powers of the Enforcement Directorate (ED) under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), the Congress on Wednesday said that the judgment will have far-reaching implications for India's democracy, especially when governments are anchored in "political vendetta".

In contrast to the Opposition party, BJP has hailed the verdict by calling it a "landmark judgement". Soon after the verdict, BJP president JP Nadda said that the law of the land must be respected.

"The Supreme Court has passed a judgement on the powers and jurisdiction of the PMLA and the ED. The Supreme Court has upheld the jurisdiction of the ED. We honour and respect our Supreme Court and also our Constitution and our law," said BJP spokespersons Gurav Bhatia and Nalin Kohli, both of whom are also Supreme Court lawyers.

In a statement, Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh said that the judgment pronounced by the Supreme

Court on the powers of the ED will have far-reaching implications for "our democracy, especially when governments are anchored in political vendetta."

"However, there is one specific aspect of the judgement I would like to address immediately; I had moved the Supreme Court on the blatant misuse of the Money Bill route by the ED to bypass various quarters" and asserted the government has "no role in determining any case".

The judgement has made it amply clear agencies don't do anything which is illegal and unconstitutional, Rijju said, adding that the actions by probe agencies are truly in the spirit of the government's intention to check corruption and punish the corrupt.

Gehlot further said: "Ashok Gehlot voiced disapproval and said that the apex court's ruling will increase the possibility of "political misuse" of the ED by various quarters."

"The pronouncement of the Supreme Court on the rights of PML Act and ED is disappointing and worrying," the chief minister tweeted.

Gehlot further said: "A dictatorial atmosphere has prevailed in the country for the last few years and after this decision, the possibility of political misuse of ED by the Centre will increase further."

Meanwhile, Law Minister Kiren Rijju said that the SC verdict on PMLA has cleared all doubts regarding various quarters" and asserted the government has "no role in determining any case".

## Will do whatever needed to curb air pollution: Kejriwal

May give cash incentive to Punjab farmers

NEW DELHI: Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Wednesday said the Punjab government has sent a proposal to the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) to give cash incentive to farmers in the border state for not burning stubble.

The proposal says Rs 2,500 per acre should be given to farmers in Punjab to wean them away from stubble burning, the chief minister said after inaugurating charging stations for electric vehicles here.

"The Punjab government has sent a proposal to the CAQM to give cash incentives to farmers in the state for not burning stubble. The proposal says that Delhi and Punjab should give Rs 500 each and the Centre should provide Rs 1,500. The Delhi government will do whatever is needed to curb air pollution," he said.

"PTT had on Monday reported that the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) governments in Punjab and Delhi plan to provide cash incentive to farmers in the border state for not burning stubble and have requested the Centre to share the cost.

Paddy straw burning in Punjab and Haryana is a major reason behind the alarming spike in air pollution levels in the national capital in October and November.

Farmers set their fields on fire to quickly clear off the crop residue before cultivating wheat and paddy. Punjab generates around 20 million tons of paddy straw annually.

"Delhi will share the cost since smoke from farm fires impact air quality in the national capital," a Punjab government official had said. He had said the Punjab and Delhi governments will implement the scheme even if the Centre doesn't agree.

## Agnipath: Navy receives 5.62 lakh applications till Wednesday

NEW DELHI: The Indian Navy has received 5.62 lakh applications under the Agnipath military recruitment scheme till Wednesday, the defence ministry said.

The Indian Navy had on July 2 began the recruitment process under the scheme. "Registration Update: A total of 5,62,818 aspirants have registered, as of 9 AM on July 27," a Defence Ministry spokesman tweeted while talking about the Navy's recruitment process. Under the Agnipath scheme, youths between the ages of 17- and a half and 21 years would be inducted for a four-year tenure, while 25 per cent of them will be subsequently inducted for regular service.

## '117 endangered languages, mother tongues chosen for study, documentation on priority'

NEW DELHI: A total of 117 endangered languages and mother tongues from across India have been chosen for study and documentation on a priority basis, Union Minister of State for Education Subhas Sarkar said on Wednesday. He said there is no centralised data on the number of endangered languages in India. Sarkar said, "The government has initiated a scheme known as 'Scheme for Protection and Preservation of Endangered Languages of India (SPEEL)'. Under this scheme, the Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL), Mysuru,

works on protection, preservation and documentation of all the mother tongues and languages of India spoken by less than 10,000 people which are called endangered languages. He said, "117 endangered languages and mother tongues have been chosen from all over India for study and documentation on a priority basis."

Stating that there are no centralised data on the number of endangered languages in India, Sarkar said Rs 48.90 crore has been released by the University Grants Commission and CIIL under their schemes for protection of endangered Indian languages during the years 2015-16 to 2021-22. On the progress of books to be published in Indian languages for engineering and law the government proposes to make more study material available in Indian languages, he said, "To provide engineering course material in Indian Languages, AICTE has introduced AICTE Technical Book Writing and Translation in 12 Scheduled Indian languages namely Hindi, Marathi, Bengali, Tamil, Telugu, Gujarati, Kannada, Punjabi, Odia, Assamese, Urdu and Malayalam. "For the first year, 22 books have been translated into nine languages for engineering and law. The second year's original book writing in English, 88 subjects (42 at degree level and 46 at diploma level) have been identified by AICTE for the second year and its chapter-wise translation into 12 Indian Languages has been initiated. A budget of Rs 18.6 crores has been earmarked by AICTE," Sarkar said.
