Biggest Aero India to take off with self-reliance pitch

PM Modi to inaugurate expo in Bengaluru today; 809 companies, including 699 Indian, among exhibitors

Bengaluru, 12 February

The day before the inauguration of the 16th Aero India 2023 — billed by the Ministry of Defence (MoD) as Asia's largest aerospace and defence (A&D) exposition — Bengaluru is alight with activity. With Prime Minister Narendra Modi scheduled to fly down from the national capital to India's aerospace capital, Bengaluru, exhibitors are trying to make things to make their displays just so. Defence executives in sharp suits are going over their sales pitches; aircraft technicians are tuning their flying machines to coax out their maximum performance, while flight pilots pull out all aerobically fit tricks that makes daredevilry seem commonplace.

HAL's 'Next Gen Supersonic Trainer' on display

Bengaluru, 12 February

Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) will display for the first time the scale model of Hindustan Lead in Fighter Trainer (HLFT-42) at the Aero India, HLFT-42 is the "Next Gen Supersonic Trainer" that will play a "critical role" in modern combat aircraft training with state-of-the-art avionics like active

electronically scanned array, electronic warfare suite, infrared search and track with fly by wire control system, the HAL said. As part of the five-day event, HAL will display "Atmanirbharta Formation" flight of 15 helicopters consisting of all variants of advanced light helicopter, "Prachand" light combat helicopter, and light utility helicopter.

The same is true for civil airlines. India's commercial airlines operate more than 150 Boeing air-

joint venture to manufacture fuselages for Apache helicopters and vertical lift structures for the 737 family of airplanes," says a company statement. The company, sourced from India, stands at over \$1 billion. Boeing currently employs over 5,000 people in India, and more than 13,000 people work with its supply chain partners. Boeing's employee efforts and country-wide engagement will make an impact on more than 500,000 lives," it says.

The indigenous defence aircraft and technologies on display are being fielded mainly by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO). The India Pavilion will showcase over 350 products catered into 12 zones, such as combat aircraft and unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs), missiles and strategic systems, engines, electronic warfare systems, artificial intelligence, machine learning and cyber systems.

The DRDO's flagship products on display are the 4th generation Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft, the Tejas Mark 3 light combat aircraft (LCA), the Akash, Astra, Htkema, Nag and Pradyum missiles, the Kaveri dry engine prototype, Netra Airborne Early Warning and Control system.

Aero India 2023 will feature the flying debut of the TAPAS-BI tactical aerial platform for advanced surveillance beyond the horizon, which is an indigenous medium altitude long endurance (MAL) UAV. The TAPAS-BI will cover the static and aerial displays, with its live video streamed throughout the venue. TAPAS is the DRDO's solution to the air services intelligence, surveillance, target acquisition and reconnaissance (ISTAR) requirements.

Other companies such as Airbus are using the exposition as a high-visibility opportunity for recruiting Indian employees. The company says candidates can explore career opportunities in airframe design, avionics, aircraft systems simulation, data analytics, cybersecurity and cabin engineering.

Rage rooms are all the rage

Places where people pay to smash things to let out their anger might just be a temporary fix, say experts

It was 2017 and Anushka Gupta (name changed on request) was looking for a way to "let it all out." So she did something that was a bit unorthodox. Instead of venting her anger at a friend or family member, she headed to a scrapyard near her house in New Delhi. She paid the worker there ₹500 as he looked at her incredulously, armed herself with a sledgehammer and furiously started attacking everything she saw in that small shed.

The smashed tin, the TV, the music systems and the metal cans she stomped on and crushed the many discarded earphones. Then she turned her attention to a lawn teddy bear and proceeded to rip it apart. It was some 40 minutes before she finally stopped — exhausted but feeling better. "Butter," she says.

Gupta, who had been hit by her rage for weeks after a traumatic encounter, had just given herself what psychologists call "destruction therapy."

A few thousand kilometres away in India, the concept was already in business. At Mallikarjuna 54, had opened late in 2017, a place where one could go to vent anger by breaking things — for a small fee.

Rage rooms — also called break rooms — are rooms for destruction of smash rooms — are one-way wall, angle-resistant Indian cities. One recently opened in Bengaluru.

The Hyderabad one, however, has had a rocky start. It closed some years ago. The Hyderabad place, which was started by 25-year-old Saurabh Usarla, who works as a start-up. The idea took him while he was sitting with friends and discussing how to vent their anger. "It was acceptable to break things to express what you were feeling, sometimes as adults, you need to vent just like that."

registrations are from those who are genuinely angry and want an outlet for it. Here's how it works. Visitors pay between ₹800 and ₹2,000 for a 20-minute rage session, where they get to smash things like crockery, weapons and toys. They wear a protective suit, a helmet with a visor, gloves and shoes to prevent injuries.

"The waste from the sessions goes for recycling and new material is sourced every Sunday. The Rage Room has seen more than 500 customers in the last 100 days," says Usarla.

In India, the experience is personalised. The actual anger room is filled with stuff related to the kind of anger one is feeling. So, for a lover's rage, the room is filled with all boxes, heart-shaped balloons, bedsheet and paintings that one can break, burst or tear. For anger related to the workplace, it is customised with an office lookalike tables, chairs, pens, staplers, etc.

"It programmes the brain to violently express the emotion, which is not healthy," says Shrikant Sathoo, a Delhi-based anger management expert.

"I came across the concept when I was travelling to Germany and Australia," says Mallikarjuna, the man behind it. "I understand that anger is a basic emotion and needs to be let out." He adds, "There are different ways to do that. Some people hit the gym, some listen to music, break things and so on."

He also has therapists on call to help people who might need more than just a temporary fix. In the six years since he started the anger room in India he has had over 7,000 visitors.

What experts say

While it may be therapeutic for some to break things to let out negative emotions, anger management specialists feel that the concept is only a temporary

fix and can lead to long-term damage if not handled properly.

"It is a dumb idea, but it works like some other dumb ideas," says Ashish Singh, a Mumbai-based anger management specialist.

"While breaking things can be cathartic in that moment, the release is only temporary," he adds. "It has its benefits, but I don't think those are intelligent benefits. It draws from destruction therapy but takes a very anti-therapeutic approach to the problem where the mind is programmed to not think of the consequences."

The consequence theory begs people to ask the question: What will be the consequences of my actions?

Agrees Shrikant Sathoo, an anger management specialist with Sathoo, a counselling service based in New Delhi. "The question one needs to ask is: In the absence of such smash rooms, how will someone express their anger? Will they go back home and beat their things there? Will they hit people? It programmes the brain to violently express the emotion, which is not healthy."

Both Singh and Sathoo say that small acts like having a sip of water or counting back from 20 can help dissipate the urge to violently express anger in five or 10 cases.

In a society recovering from a life-altering experience of a pandemic and changing workplace scenarios, economic instability, how can society come together to tackle anger?

"I would agree that Covid has thrown people off-balance and they have been living on the edge. The first thing is to acknowledge that people are angry and taking it seriously," says Sathoo, adding, "We should have more support groups, where people can talk openly about negative emotions without feeling cornered and blamed." There is also a case to be made for affordable therapy.
