Kutch-Saurashtra region gets 100% rainfall in record time



AHMEDABAD: On Sunday, the Saurashtra region consisting of 11 districts completed 100% of the seasonal rainfall. The region receives 722 mm of annual rainfall against which till Sunday morning it recorded 721 mm of rain. With rain on Sunday, the 100% mark was crossed, said the state disaster management authority officials. Likewise, Kutch district crossed the 100% mark on July 8. Both the regions got 100% seasonal rainfall in record time. Since 2019, the regions are getting 100% of the rains, indicate Gujarat State Disaster Management Authority (GSDMA) data. However, in the past four years, the quickest 100% rainfall recorded in Kutch and Saurashtra regions was in 2020 on August 15. In the other three years, it was in mid-September. From 2015 to 2018, only 2017 saw 100% rainfall in the two regions that is on August 31. The year 2018 recorded the lowest rainfall for Kutch (26%) and Saurashtra (73%) which was below normal average. In 2015 and 2016, Kutch and Saurashtra received 100% rain respectively. The impact of cyclone Biparjoy gave ample rainfall to the region in June. In July, too, two back-to-back good systems that brought significant rain to the region resulting in a surplus, said a weather department official. "For the next two days, some parts of Saurashtra are likely to get moderate to heavy rains. The rain is likely to slow down from Tuesday onwards." Several districts have recorded widespread devastation along with loss of life.

Tourism gets boost from World Cup fever



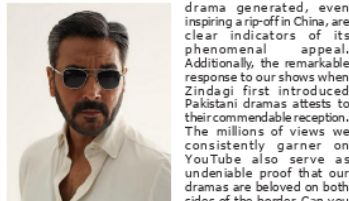

Two cheat land owner of 26 lakh with forged papers

Surat: Based on a complaint was filed by Katargam resident Hardik Miyani, the Singaporer police filed a Rs 26 lakh cheating and forgery case against Gausi Shah Solanki and Ashok Vala, who allegedly sold the former's plot to others over forged documents. According to case details, Miyani bought a plot owned by Vinod Morajiya and Parsotam Hun in Sabyam Sundaram society in 2012 and prepared documents for Rs 4.5 lakh for plot number 28. Later, the complainant went to his native in Bhavnagar district. In January 2023, a relative told Miyani to check the veracity of his plot as a couple of bogus sale had taken place in his society. When Miyani checked, he found a building on his plot owned by Anil Raval. When he asked Raval, he said that he bought the plot from Vinod Prajapati and Pravin Pumbhadiya in October 2022.

Pumbhadiya told Miyani that he bought the plot from Ashok Vala. On inquiring in Surat Municipal Corporation, Miyani found that Kaushik Solanki had forged the occupancy receipt of plot number 18 to 28. After forged, Vala sold the plot to Raval. As both, Vala and Solanki conspired to sell the plot by forging the documents, a cheating complaint was filed with police on July 19.

Disqualify Manjalpur corporator: Congress

Vadodara: The city unit of Congress sought the disqualification of Kalshesh Patel alias Jay Ranchhod. VMC corporator from Manjalpur who was convicted in a cheque bounce case recently. Congress submitted a memorandum to mayor Nileshsinh Rathod seeking the VMC's disqualification, citing provisions in the Gujarat Provincial Municipal Corporations (GPMC) Act in this regard. According to Congress, any corporator who has been awarded imprisonment for over six months has to be disqualified. The memorandum states that Patel was sentenced on July 19. It states that the VMC should have disqualified Patel on its own, but had not done so. Patel was held guilty under the Negotiable Instruments Act after the cheque he issued against money taken towards investment in real estate from one Upendra Shah had bounced. Shah had issued a notice to Patel following which he filed a suit in a court here.
