Devotion marks Bada Mangal as city assumes saffron hue

The *bhandaras* which dotted the roads on the occasion of Bada Mangal gave the city a saffron hue even as devotees made a beeline to have *prasad* and pay obeisance to the deity.

From vegetable vendors, to businessmen, media professionals and retired government officers from all walks of life put their heart and soul into the food items which they distributed. Sanjay Verma, a vegetable vendor in Patrakarpuram, had a wide grin as sweat trickled down his forehead. He set up a *bhandara* near Mithawali crossing in Gomtinagar.

The food items included *puri-sabzi* and *boondi* which were distributed among devotees from 10 am till evening. His family members, including small nieces, served water.

"I have been setting up the *bhandara* for the last 14 years and now two years after the pandemic. I am feeling so happy to be able to feed so many underprivileged people," he said.

Vijay Verma, who organised a *bhandara* a furlong away, is into the outsourcing business. He said he was keen on organising the *bhandara* on the first Bada Mangal.

"Three days ago, I was in a position to move as I was down with a neck problem, but here I am now getting everything prepared for the *bhandara*. There is some sort of energy which helps you in these kind of activities," he said. He said he would see that the food was served to as many people as possible on the first Bada Mangal.



sible on the first Bada Mangal. "I chose the first Bada Mangal for the *bhandara* because in the following Tuesdays, many more *bhandaras* will come up and it will be difficult to find workers," he said.

Class IV employees Ajay Raj and Bipin said that Bada Mangal proves to be a boon for them. "Not only do we have a hearty fill but we also carry it in lunch boxes for the families. No one stops us from having extra food. I surveyed the *bhandaras* and picked up my meal from the one serving pumpkin *sabzi* with *puri*," Ajay Raj said.

At some of the temples, the rush of devotees was comparatively. At the Naya Hanuman Mandir in Aliganj where the rush is always maximum, the crowd was less. CEO of the temple and administrator Anil Tewari said: "The crowd was less possibly because the devotees

However, Hanuman Setu Samiti secretary Diwakar Tripathi said there was a huge rush of devotees in the temple. "We distributed almost 35,000 laddoos till late evening and we expect that 20,000 laddoos more will be distributed," he said.

Meanwhile, Mayor Sanyukta Bhatia also visited several *bhandaras* in the city and asked the organisers to ensure cleanliness. "Nagar Nigam safai karmacharis will pick up the garbage in the evening and also on the next day because it is impossible to clean the entire city in a single day," she added.

Constable, aide arrested on charges of robbery

A shopowner dealing in spectacles was shot at near Alambagh Inter College in Manak Nagar on Tuesday morning allegedly over an issue involving a woman. The victim's family lodged a case against a local youth for the murderous assault.

The accused is said to have a criminal past and he has been named in police dossiers for taking law in his hands a number of times in the past. The victim sustained gunshot wounds in the shoulder and was admitted to a private hospital. The victim was identified as Saujanya Sharan of Bholu Kheda in Krishna Nagar. On Tuesday morning, he got a call and left the house without informing any of his family members. Around 9:35 am, his mother got a call from some

unknown person who informed her that Saujanya had been shot at near Alambagh Inter College and his condition was critical. She was also informed that Saujanya was admitted to a private hospital. His wife Muskan stated in the FIR that her mother-in-law was informed by the caller that Lalit Sonkar shot at Saujanya.

Preliminary investigation revealed that Lalit had called Saujanya and asked the latter to meet him. He allegedly shot at Saujanya when the latter reached there. It further surfaced that Lalit had threatened Saujanya on Monday night as well. Both Lalit and Saujanya were said to be on the loggheads for a long time. Police teams were conducting raids to nab the accused.

ADCP, Central, Raghendra Mishra said

Saujanya and Lalit had a dispute over an issue involving a woman for a long time. "The woman who was friends with Lalit came closer to Saujanya," he said. The ADCP rubbished reports that the victim was shot over a money dispute.

Meanwhile, four members of a family were accused of attacking their neighbour following a long-standing dispute in Hasanganj on Monday. Those named in the FIR were identified as Chand Babu, Asif, Nasira and Nahid (all of Madeyganj). The victim, identified as Mohammed Azhar aka Shahab, said the accused stormed his house and reached his room where he was sitting.

"They attacked me without any provocation. I fractured my nose and also sustained head injuries. They also attacked and injured my family members," he said.

"Seven history-sheeters live in this village and many cases are registered against them. When a person was questioned by the policemen, some women and men started protesting. It created panic and the police team came back. After this, Jitendra Yadav, a resident of Bhimapur village, opened fire. The bullet hit a woman named Roshni. Jitendra Yadav used to extort money by threatening the cowslaughterers. The victim's family had handed over an empty cartridge which they found at the crime scene to the police," the SP said.

Gangster held for murder of woman

Siddharthnagar police claimed to have arrested a gangster who was said to be involved in the killing of a 53-year-old woman, who was shot dead allegedly following a police raid in Kodara Grant village May 14 night. The police claimed that the probe made it clear that the woman did not die in police firing as alleged.

The accused, identified as Jitendra Yadav, used to extort money from residents involved in cowslaughter, the police said. The arrest was made after the son of the deceased, Roshni,

filed a complaint against unidentified police officers on Sunday. The police said Yadav had opened fire while the cops were taking Roshni's son Abdul Rehman for questioning. "Yadav was produced before a court in Siddharthnagar and was sent to judicial custody," an official said. A country-made pistol was also recovered from Yadav's possession, they he added.

Siddharthnagar SP Yash Veer Singh said a team from Sadar police station had gone there on the information of cowslaughter in Tola Islamnagar village of Kodara Grant area.

CS launches 'Super Saver Card' of Lko Metro

Uttar Pradesh Chief Secretary Durga Shankar Mishra on Tuesday unveiled and launched the 'Super Saver Card' of Lucknow Metro at his office in Lok Bhawan. The card will offer unlimited rides for 30 days for Rs 1,400.

It will be available for sale at the ticket counters of all the metro stations. The card can be recharged from the ticket counter or token vending machines using cash, debit/credit cards. It can be purchased by providing names and mobile numbers of the users.

"The launch of the 'Super Saver Card' is a praiseworthy step by Lucknow Metro. It will make travelling from one destination to another even more affordable and convenient. In the current scenario where the world is grappling with the adverse consequences of global warming, traffic congestion and pollution has led to escalated transportation cost. This card will bring much needed relief to the people," the chief secretary said.

Progress of development to be monitored in 10 sectors

Lucknow (PNS): In an attempt to give an impetus to development, the state government has identified 10 sectors where the progress will be monitored regularly while the scope of aspirational districts will be further expanded. Information regarding this was given by Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath here on Tuesday.

The chief minister said that 10 presentations were made sector-wise before the cabinet in relation to the action plan of the government. "Continuous monitor-

ing of progress and implementation of the action plan should be done by appointing 10 senior officers as nodal officers for all these 10 sectors," the CM said. He said the construction of Bundelkhand Expressway is in the final stage. It should be completed by the end of June while the construction of Ballia Link Expressway be expedited further, he added.

The CM said that among the aspirational districts, all the districts of Uttar Pradesh have done commendable work on various parameters of

development. NITI Aayog has appreciated the efforts of various districts. He asked the officers to expedite the development works of 100 aspirational development blocks.

The chief minister said that in view of the huge importance of road safety, an action plan for awareness campaign is prepared with the mutual coordination of the departments concerned like Police, Traffic, Basic Education, Secondary Education, Higher Education, Technical Education, Transport, Urban Development, PWD.

Govt to expand 'Aapda Mitra', 'Aapda Sakhi' schemes

Lucknow (PNS): The UP government, in collaboration with the State Disaster Management Authority, is all set to expand its 'Aapda Mitra' and 'Aapda Sakhi' schemes to 25 districts.

Under the scheme, the volunteers in the age group of 18-40 with experience in civil defence, home guard, community service, swimming, prior experience in disaster response operations; and retired soldiers from the women's army will be given preference. 'Aapda Mitra' and 'Aapda Sakhi' will be provided flood protection equipment, safety kits and training to deal with any disaster. Under the scheme, people will be provided assistance to deal with natural calamities.

With help from the Revenue department, the authorities are working expeditiously on this action plan for relief and disaster management. Under this scheme, 10 lakh women of self-help groups will be imparted training in disaster management. Disaster Management Helpline 1070 will also be integrated with 112 helpline.

To take the State Disaster Management Plan forward, the government is planning to implement the Lightning Safety programme for celestial power in the next six months.

Simultaneously, an action plan is also being prepared to strengthen district-level emergency operation centres. The Yogi government is also in the process of strengthening the river monitoring system, including a digital elevation model, for all river basins to ensure better flood management. In the last five years, with the efforts of the Yogi government, a state-level emergency centre and relief helpline 1070 were established under the supervision of the Relief Commissioner's office. Moreover, to keep the relief helpline functional 24 hours, 15 call centres are also operating in the state.

15 dists identified for 'Food Forest' project

Lucknow (PNS): In the Yogi government 2.0, an innovative initiative of environmental protection has been rolled out by increasing greenery through 'Food Forest'. Fifteen districts of different agro-climatic zones have been identified in 15 districts where food forests will be developed.

"The districts which have been identified for this project are Bijnor, Amroha & Saharanpur of mango belt and Sambhal, Rampur & Badaun of guava belt. Similarly, other dis-

tricts are also included in one or the other fruit belt," a government spokesman said, adding that apart from being eco-friendly, these parks will also be an example of agricultural diversification.

He said plants would be selected according to the agro-climatic zone in the food forest. Pulse crops will also be planted for nitrogen fixation in a natural way.

For example, mango, guava, pomegranate and papaya saplings will be plant-

ed in the first phase of the food forest to be developed in Gorakhpur. In the second cycle, saplings of Jamun, ber will be planted. In the third cycle, tur, moong, urad, peas and gram will be sown. In the fourth phase, herbal plant parks like lemongrass, tulsi and ashwagandha will be set up. In the fifth cycle, vine species like gilly, grapes, damboti etc will be planted. "The selection of plants will be according to the different agro-climatic zones," a spokesperson said.

Chef to help jail inmates cook their way to entrepreneurship

Celebrity chef Ranveer Brar will be helping the inmates of Lucknow Model Jail interested in going into food entrepreneurship. Brar, who had a meeting with the jail inmates on Monday, said that to start with, he would help them spruce up bakery products being currently prepared in the jail and would help in their sale.

Interestingly, with little access to the outer world, the jail inmates were largely unaware of Brar's celebrity status. There are three model jails in the state of Uttar Pradesh working towards self-reliance of the inmates.

"I was approached by two in Lucknow and one in Varanasi to see how the inmates can be inspired to take up food entrepreneurship. They wanted to see how their courses can be upgraded, and also wanted to involve the community at large," Brar said.

The chef said they planned to start off with the bakery products because the jail has an infrastructure and if these products could be sold, the

income would allow them self-respect and self-sustenance.

"It was my first visit and we will soon make a roadmap on how to start a food entrepreneurship journey for the jail inmates so that they can have a brighter future," he said.

Retired employee of Revenue Board accused of extortion

A retired employee of UP Revenue Board's was named in a case of extortion of money from tehsildar naibs, tehsildar kanoongo and lekhpals by threatening adverse entries in their character rolls and service records.

The case was lodged at Kaiserbagh police station on the complaint of Ghanshyam Chaturvedi, who is an under secretary in the Revenue department. The accused was identified as Vivekanand Dobriyal. The police registered the case under sections 120 (B), 384, 389, 420, 465, 405, 471 and 504 of IPC and under sections 7 and 13 (1)(b) of Prevention of Corruption Act 1988. It was alleged that Dobriyal used to make extortion and threat calls to the victims from the number registered in the name of his aide. It was further alleged that Dobriyal used to get complaints sent against an employee who did not come under his awe. Thereafter, he would contact them to settle the issue for money. Some employees of the Revenue Board are also under the police scanner. It was alleged that Dobriyal who served as a personal secretary to a senior revenue official amassed huge wealth by way of fraud. The complainant said that the accused had invested a huge sum in properties/shares and also bought a house in Vikas Nagar.
