India surpasses China in Covid count

India has surpassed China in the number of Covid-19 cases, with nearly 86,000 cases as of Saturday morning, becoming the 11th country with the most Covid-affected people.

In the last 24 hours, 3,970 new cases were added, taking the total count to 85,940. The toll on Saturday was 2,752, of which 103 deaths were registered in a single day, according to the health ministry data. The total number of active cases is 53,035, and more than 30,152 have been cured.

China, which has dropped two spots on the global tally at the 13th position so far, reported 84,038 Covid-19 cases, 4,637 of whom have died.

Cases in Maharashtra are nearing the 30,000-mark, with 1,068 deaths so far, the highest among all states. Covid-19 cases have seen a sharp rise in Tamil Nadu, now reporting the second-highest number of cases in the country with 10,108 positive cases and 71 deaths.

Gujarat, with a doubling time of over two weeks, has 9,931 coronavirus positive cases of whom 606 have died.

The third-highest number of cases are in Delhi with 8,895 testing positive, recording 606 deaths so far.

India has ramped up its testing capacity to nearly 100,000 tests per day. In the last one day, more than 94,000 tests were conducted, taking the total number of tests conducted so far to over 2.1 million.

Besides, the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) is working with Intel India and International Institute of Information Technology (IIT), Hyderabad to develop faster and less expensive Covid-19 testing and coronavirus genome sequencing.

The health ministry has also issued guidelines for the safety of health workers in Covid and non-Covid areas of the hospitals. It has suggested a "buddy system" where two of more members of the hospital staff will form a team and share responsibilities for their partner's safety in terms of safety gear and hygiene, among other things.

25 migrant workers killed, 40 injured in UP

At least 25 migrant workers were killed and 40 others injured when a trailer and a stationary truck, on which they had hitched rides, collided on a highway near UP's Auraiya in the early hours of Saturday, the latest in a string of accidents involving migrants returning to their states.

Most of the victims were sitting on sacks of wheat flour loaded on the trailer, and were crushed when the vehicles overturned.

PMO announces ₹2-lakh ex-gratia for victims

The Prime Minister's Office (PMO) has announced an ex-gratia payment of ₹2 lakh each to the next of kin of the migrant workers killed in the road accident. It also announced ₹50,000 each for those injured in the trailer-truck collision.

Aviation minister reacts

Civil Aviation Minister Hardeep Singh Puri said he was deeply pained by the accident, and stressed that the incident underlines the necessity for states receiving migrants to allow limited air, road, and rail travel.

Migrant workers a neglected lot, says Madras HC

The Madras High Court (HC) has said it is not only the duty of the native states of migrant workers but also the duty of the states where they work to take care of them, but this has not been the case.

The court, while observing that the migrant workers and agricultural workforce are a neglected lot in the crisis, asked the central and state governments to file a report on such workers by 22 May.



Modi thanks Trump, says nations must work together

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday said that in these times of a global health crisis caused by Covid-19, it is important for nations to work together and do as much as possible to make the world healthier.

The prime minister was responding to a tweet by US President Donald Trump, announcing the US' decision to donate ventilators to India, and the cooperation between the two countries in developing a vaccine to treat the virus.

"Thank you @POTUS @realDonaldTrump. This pandemic is being fought collectively by all of us," the prime minister tweeted.

He said in such times, "it's always important for nations to work together and do as much as possible to make our world healthier

and free from Covid-19".

On Friday, Trump had tweeted about the cooperation between India and the US on vaccine development and the decision of his administration to donate ventilators to India to help those critically affected by Covid-19.

"I am proud to announce that the United States will donate ventilators to our friends in India. We stand with India and @narendramodi during this pandemic," Trump had said. "We're also cooperating on vaccine development. Together we will beat the invisible enemy," he said.

On Wednesday, the PM CARES Fund Trust had decided to allocate ₹3,100 crore for the fight against Covid-19.

Out of ₹3,100 crore, approximately ₹2,000 crore will be earmarked for purchase of ventilators, and ₹100 crore to support vaccine development.

Stop being a moneylender, reconsider package, Rahul Gandhi tells Centre

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Saturday said an economic storm faces India, and the ₹20-trillion package of the government would fail to fire up the country's economic engine as it has offered bank loans to the people instead of putting money into their pockets. He appealed to the prime minister to "reconsider" the package.

In a video conference, Gandhi said the package was disappointing as it addressed supply side issues when the need is to spur demand and consumption.

"When a child is hurt, the mother doesn't offer a loan...today, when migrant workers are walking on the roads, money needs to be put in their pockets. *Bharat Mata* (Mother India) should not act as a 'moneylender' (*sahukar*) to her children. *Bharat Mata* should give money to her children because they are in need," Gandhi said.

Later in the evening, the former Congress president took to the road and interacted with dozens of migrant workers in south Delhi's Sukhdev Vihar. In his conference earlier in

the day with journalists of regional media. Gandhi said the government should have put money directly into the pockets of farmers, migrant labourers, and small businesses, but it is worried more about fiscal deficit and country's credit ratings by international rating agencies.

Gandhi said any rating would be meaningless if the Indian economy does not restart, and that can only happen if the money is put into people's pockets. "It will be catastrophic if we do not. It will overshadow the (damage by) disease," Gandhi said.

Gandhi said his job as an Opposition leader was to create pressure on the government, and that is what he is trying to

do with his critique of the package. In his recent press conferences, Gandhi has spoken of providing constructive opposition, and that this was not the time for finger pointing. "We are in the Opposition and can choose to create pressure on the government either with hatred, or with warmth," Gandhi said. He said his approach is the latter. On Maharashtra's handling of the crisis and whether he is putting pressure on that government as well, Gandhi said there is a difference between a Congress-run government and an alliance government.

He said he cannot put the same kind of pressure on an alliance government that he

can on a Congress government. He said Congress governments in states such as Chhattisgarh have been aggressive in helping migrants, farmers, and the poor by putting money in their pockets.

Gandhi said all state governments, including those run by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), have complained that the Centre is not providing them with enough funds. He said the strategy of the Centre should have been decentralised, to be a manager and let the states be at the forefront of fighting this battle. "I have heard the reason for not giving money to people is the government's worry that an increased fiscal deficit would downgrade India's ratings by international rating agencies," he said.

Gandhi said he would suggest the government to not pay heed to the ratings at the current juncture, which would be fine if India's workers and farmers start working. "Make policies with India in your mind, not what foreigners would think," he said. He also interacted with a group of migrant labourers in Delhi and asked them about their problems as they walked home.

Local conditions to guide lockdown 4.0: Shivraj

Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Saturday said that local circumstances are likely to dictate the next phase of the lockdown as he spoke of the sufferings of the poor and pitched for kickstarting economic activities outside places where the spread of the coronavirus infection is high.

Speaking to reporters through a video conference, he also called for coordination among states to ensure that migrant workers are provided transport to reach their homes so that tragedies like the

road accident in Uttar Pradesh, that killed 24, are avoided.

Huge numbers of migrant workers have been walking hundreds of kilometres from several big cities towards their villages as an extended lockdown has made their financial condition precarious.

His government has deployed 1,000 buses to ferry migrant workers and drop those who are from other states at the Madhya Pradesh border point, nearest to their destination, Chouhan said, asserting that no labourer will have to walk on roads or be hungry as long as he is in Madhya Pradesh.

BMS slams govt for opening up 8 sectors

The Bharatiya Mazdoor Sangh (BMS), the trade union arm of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), termed Saturday's announcements by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman to increase privatisation in sectors such as coal, defence, and six others as against "national interests".

The BMS said it was "a sad day for the nation and its people". It said the government was going in the "wrong direction" and it was "highly condemnable" that it did not discuss the proposed changes with trade unions and other stake-

holders.

The BMS said, "corporatisation and PPP (public-private partnership) are the routes for privatisation, and privatisation is the route for foreignisation."

It slammed the government for taking advantage of the crisis to push these measures.

The BMS, which has also opposed the changes in labour laws announced by some of the state governments, said the government's plea that it has no option but to privatise sectors such as coal, airspace, defence production, and others shows a "dearth of ideas on economic revival in times of crisis".
