Opinion

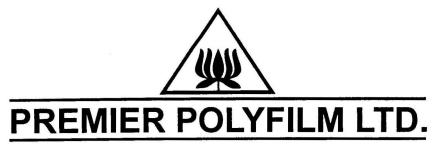

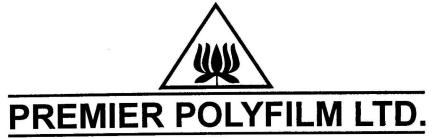
