# COVID-19 situation in Delhi shows 'remarkable' improvement: MHA

New Delhi rith a recovery rate of over 72 per cent and doubling rate of nearly 30 days, the COVID-19 situation in the national capital has shown remarkable improvement in recent days because of joint efforts, the Union Home Ministry said Thurs-

Addressing a press conference, Home Ministry Joint Secretary Punya Salila Srivastava said the ministry has been holding regular meetings with the state governments in the Delhi-NCR region for improving the pandemic situation.

She said in these meetings, national-level experts also participate and some important decisions have been taken.

These include controlling the cost of COVID treatment in private hospitals, arrangement of additional



beds in the national capital, increasing the number of tests using rapid antigen technology, careful demarcation of containment zones, contact tracing of all affected persons, effective use of Information Technology systems and AIIMS Delhi consultancy telemedicine facility now available to all COVID hospitals in the country for clinical management of the disease.

"Joint efforts have improved the situation in Delhi. Rapid antigen technology is being used at a large scale which has increased testing capability," she said.

"Till July 8, over 6.79 lakh tests have been done which translates into 35,780 tests per million population. Now every day over 20,000 tests are being done but in spite of increase in tests, active cases are under control," Sri-

vastava said.

## Delhi Police's Special Branch **ASI** dies of COVID

A 53-year-old assistant sub-inspector of Delhi police died on Thursday morning at a hospital here, weeks after he tested positive for Covid-19, officials

The deceased, Jeevan Singh, posted at Delhi Police's Special branch, was attached with the Motor Transport section of the department, they said.

The SI was tested positive for Covid-19 on 21 June and was admitted at IBS Lajpat Nagar on 23 June.

On 27 June, he was shifted to Gangaram Hospital where he underwent plasma therapy but could not recover.

He was on ventilator support and died on Thursday around 4.30 am, said Suman Nalwa, deputy commissioner of police (Special Branch).

He lived with his family in Noida and is survived by his 49-year-old wife, 19year-old son and a 23-yearold daughter who is working with a private firm in Noida, police said.

Around 2,000 Delhi Police personnel have tested positive for the virus, out of which, 1,300 policemen have resumed their duties after recovery.

At least 12 policemen have died due to Covid-19 so far, according to police.

On Tuesday a 40 - year old head constable of Delhi Police died of Covid-19 at Singh joined Delhi Police a hospital.

### Dreaded gangster Noida all set to promote EVs; inks pact with EESL held from Siliguri

A 42-year-old murder convict and dreaded Gangster Sandeep alias Dhillo, who had escaped from Delhi police custody two years back, has been arrested from West Bengal's Siliguri by a team of Delhi Police's Special Cell, said Delhi police on Thursday.

In 2018, Gangster Dhillo

had escapd from police custody during a visit to hospital as his associates threw chilli powder and opened fire on police party. He was brought form Tihar jail for medical diagnosis at Delhi's Maulana Azad Medical College when the incident had taken place, said the po-

Sandeep alias Dhillu Pahalwan is a resident of Jasor Khedi, Haryana. He is a sharp shooter of desperate criminal Neeraj Bawana and Sunil Tillu alias Tillu Tajpuria gang, currently

lodged in jail, they added. A reward of Rs. 2 Lakh was declared on his arrest.

On July 5, a specific inputs was received to police team that Sandeep Dhillu has established his new hide out somewhere in Siliguri, West Bengal, said DCP Special Cell Pramod Singh Kushwaha.

"A police team led by Inspector Umesh Barthwal under the close supervision of ACP Lalit Mohan Negi immediately immediately rushed to Siliguri in West Bengal and traced Sandeep Dhillu in the market of Siliguri on July, 8. He was arrested with minor scuffle and brought to New Delhi, said DCP Kuswaha.

As soon as Dhillu was arrested in Siliguri, Wife of



the accused posted a video on social media where she anticipated that her husband might be killed in a encounter by Delhi police.

DCP Special Cell Pramod Singh Kushwaha said that earlier Dhillo was arrested in 2013 and was lodged in Tihar jail. But he escaped from police custody on February19, 2018 from Maulana Azad Medical College Delhi where he was brought for Dental checkup," DCP added

"When he was taken to jail van, his associates threw chilli powder in the eyes of escorting police party and Dhillu managed to free himself after scuffle with escort party and ran away.

He was on the run for the last two years," DCP further

Accused Sandeep Dhillu is involved in 22 cases criminal cases including mueder, extortion, dacoity, robbery and assault on police party, said a police official.

The EESL will make an upfront investment on services pertaining to the agreement along with the operation and maintenance of public charging infrastructure by qualified manpower. The NOIDA authority will be responsible for the provision of space for the charging infrastructure. The initiative is estimated to save over 3.7 tonnes of CO2 emissions

per e-car per year. The Noida has been sanctioned 162 Public EV Charging Stations (PCS) comprising 54 Bharat DC001 (15kW) and 108 122kW (50kW CCS2+ 50kW CHAdeMO+ 22kW Type2) fast chargers under the FAME India Scheme PhaseIndustry (DHI). EESL is the selected or-

ganization for deployment of public charging stations in NOIDA City. So far, the EESL has installed 20 EV chargers, 13 are commissioned and 7 are under commissioning. These EV chargers have been installed around the prominent places of Noida such as the ganga shopping complex (Sector 29), near the electronic city metro station (Sector 63), opposite shopprix mall (Sector 61), near RTO office (Sector 33), Advant Chowk (Sector 142) and main market of Sector II of Department of Heavy 50 to name a few.

# 100-bed isolation ward facility at Balakram Hospital soon: North DMC

### Pregnant women's COVID-19 test issue turned into bureaucratic nightmare: HC to AAP govt

New Delhi The Delhi High Court pulled

up the AAP government on Thursday for not clarifying whether every pregnant woman who goes to a hospital for delivery or urgent treatment is required to undergo COVID-19 test, symptomatic or not, saying a genuine problem has been turned into a "bureaucratic nightmare".

The high court also said if the test is required then sample collection and declaration of results should be done in a minimum period of time.

A bench of Chief Justice D N Patel and Justice Prateek Jalan said it has given the Delhi government four to five opportunities since the filing of a PIL, seeking expeditious testing and results of pregnant women, but it has not clarified this

"A genuine human problem has been made into a bureaucratic nightmare. It is totally inexplicable.. How long do we wait (for clarification)? Four to five opportunities have been given to address the issue since filing of the petition," the bench said.

It further said that the concerned officials appeared to be "confused" and were "unable to understand that pregnant women do not go to a hospital 48 hours before the delivery".

"When a woman goes for delivery or surgery, they cannot wait for 48 hours for a result. Sometimes they go at the last moment. Your (Delhi government) secretaries should understand that pregnant women do not go 48 hours before a delivery.

### Levy sewerage charges on all households in Delhi: NGT

New Delhi The National Green Tribunal has directed the Delhi government to comply with the Supreme Court order to levy sewerage charges on all households in the national capital for discharge of untreated effluents in Yamuna.

The green panel noted that 2.3 lakh people in unauthorised colonies in Delhi have not taken sewage connection which was resulting in emission of pollutants in the

The NGT said as per "Polluter pays Principle, every individual household causing pollution by release of sewage into open environment or in the sewer network is liable for payment for its treatment.

"The Delhi Government



may forthwith comply with the order of the Supreme Court dated October 24, 2019 on the subject of levy and recovery of the sewage charges," a bench headed by NGT Chairperson Justice A

K Goel said. In 2015, the green panel had directed the authorities to charge every household in Delhi an environmental

compensation amount for generating sewage, based on the polluter pays principle. Later, the apex court upheld the NGT order asking

Delhi government to start

levying sewerage charges on all households in the capital within two months.

The NGT said major problem continues to be pollution caused by discharge of sewage, industrial effluents and other pollutants.

"If Yamuna is to be rejuvenated such discharges either directly or through drains need to be stopped. This is possible only if the Integrated Drain Management Cell performs its functions effectively to prevent discharge of untreated sewage into the drains or into Yamuna," the bench said.

It said Delhi Pollution Control Committee needs to ensure that polluting industries are stopped and new industries are not allowed without safeguards.
