The Maldives relies on tourism as the largest sector of its economy, providing more than 28% of GDP and 60% of foreign exchange.

"We are yet to see an impact on bookings," said Rajiv Mehra, President, IATO (Indian Association of Tour Operators), the national body of the tourism industry...

In an island nation like Maldives, where Indians are driving the economy and is the number one source market, Jyoti Mayal, president, Travel Agents' Association of India (TAAI), said, "We are noticing many travellers and members asking to cancel their Maldives bookings as safety is a concern for many tourists."

Lakshadweep, on the other hand, has generated a lot of interest, and Mehra feels, "It is far from challenging Maldives as a destination, which is a well established tourism destination. At present, Lakshadweep despite its pristine beauty is really not on the tourism map for multiple reasons like quality hotels, police clearance issues and only one direct flight from Cochin International Airport to Lakshadweep's Agatti Island with Air India subsidiary Alliance Air operating four days a week. Other infrastructure like restaurants, transport, sea sports are not developed. For tourism to prosper, we need these vital things in place."

The Federation of Hotel & Restaurant Associations of India (FHRAI), India's apex body and voice of the hospitality industry, has also extended its appreciation for Lakshadweep. "Lakshadweep will catalyse substantial investments in infrastructure, connectivity and hospitality services, making the archipelago an accessible and coveted destination for global tourists," said Pradeep Shetty, president, FHRAI, & president, The Hotel And Restaurant Association (Western India) - HRAWI.

AFC Asian Cup: India go down fighting against Australia

INDIA KEPT FORMER champions Australia at bay till the 50th minute before eventually losing their AFC Asian Cup football tournament opening group match 0-2 in a gritty performance on Saturday.

Australia were the overwhelming favourites to win the Group B match and nobody gave India a chance but Igor Stimac's men denied their mighty opponents any success in the first half and then five minutes into the second session, dishing out a superb defensive show.

The Indians, though, ran out of steam later on in the face of waves of attacks from the rampaging Australians, who won the title in 2015 and are ranked 25th in the world as against 102nd of Stimac's team. Jackson Irvine (50th minute) and Jordan Bros (73rd) scored for Australia to take home full three points from the match at the Ahmad bin Ali Stadium. India, however, did better than their 0-4 loss to Australia in a group match in the 2011 Asian Cup.

The Indians would not be too disappointed by the margin of loss. Perhaps, they would be happy to have conceded just two goals, which may prove beneficial later on when the third-place team is decided from the group.

The top two teams from each group, along with four best third-placed sides from across six groups, progress to the knockout round of 16. A knock-round berth will be a huge achievement for India.

Setback for Xi: Taiwan elects Lai Ching-te as president

TAIWAN'S VICE PRESIDENT, Lai Ching-te, who has faced sustained hostility from China, won the island democracy's presidential election on Saturday, a result that could prompt Beijing to step up pressure on Taiwan, deepening tensions with Washington.

For many of the Taiwanese citizens who lined up at ballot booths on Saturday, the vote centred on the question of who should lead Taiwan in an increasingly tense standoff with its much larger, autocratic and heavily armed neighbour, China.

They chose Lai, of the governing Democratic Progressive Party (DPP), which wants to keep steering Taiwan away from Beijing's influence, over the opposition Nationalist Party, which has vowed to expand trade ties and restart talks with China.

After most of the votes had been counted, Lai's main opponent, Hou Yu-ih of the opposition Nationalist Party conceded, apologizing to his

supporters at a party event. The election drew a strong voter turnout of nearly 70%.

In the afternoon, the main parties held gatherings for supporters to watch as the votes were being counted after the polls closed at 4 pm.

At the DPP's gathering outside its headquarters in Taipei, thousands of supporters, many of whom waved pink and green flags, cheered as Lai's lead grew during the counting of the votes, which was displayed on a large screen on an outdoor stage.

Many described feeling hopeful that a Lai presidency would protect Taiwan's sover-

eighty and unique identity.

"I support Lai Ching-te because I believe he will uphold the democratic values of Taiwan," said Huang I-hsuan, 45, a financial analyst who was at the gathering.

Lai had been widely seen as the front-runner. But in the days leading up to the vote, the race was too close to call.

Hou, the Nationalist candidate, had narrowed Lai's lead to only a few percentage points in many polls in recent weeks. He had promised to ease tensions with Beijing, arguing that stronger ties with China would help reduce the risk of conflict.

NASA prepares for mishaps in its moonshot strategy

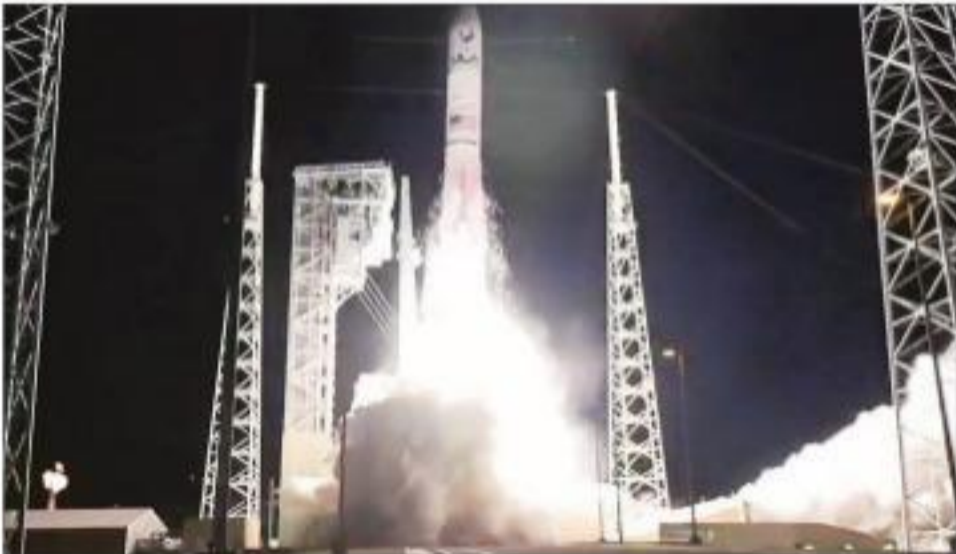

WHEN THE FIRST US-made moon lander launched in more than 50 years experienced a critical failure shortly after reaching space on Monday, the news was initially a shock. But NASA was prepared.

The Peregrine lander, built by a Pittsburgh-based startup called Astrobotic, had barely been deployed into orbit before it suffered an apparent propulsion error, causing it to leak propellant into space. After a day, the company said there was no chance the space-rocket would reach the moon.

NASA actually anticipated a few low-stakes mishaps like this while carrying out its moonshot strategy, drawing inspiration from Elon Musk's SpaceX and Wall Street. The agency's grander plan is to send humans back to the moon some time this decade.

Astrobotic's Peregrine lander was created in partnership with NASA's CLPS program,

which stands for Commercial Lunar Payload Services. The idea of the program is to help foster development of privately made lunar landers that can carry NASA payloads, while accepting that some partners get further than others.

"Unlike other NASA programs, if there's a failure in this program, it's not a total loss," Jim Bridenstine, the former administrator for NASA

who oversaw the creation of CLPS, said before Astrobotic's launch. "We modelled this after venture capital." NASA has increasingly embraced this type of framework since the turn of the century. The thinking goes: Partially fund the development of a company's hardware, then buy rides or services when the hardware's complete.

That stands in contrast to the way NASA used to do

things. For years, if the space agency wanted something made, it usually funded and oversaw the entirety of a vehicle's development. That path was typically slow and expensive. As part of the CLPS program, NASA gave Astrobotic some starter capital and shared expertise with the company, though mostly let the company build Peregrine as it saw fit.

To speed things up, NASA also selected multiple companies to make landers, creating a race to become the first private US company to land on the moon. "Those operators, they have to go raise private capital; they need to get customers that are not NASA and they have to compete against each other on cost and innovation," Bridenstine, now an independent consultant and member of Viasat's board of directors, said.

NASA knew some companies wouldn't even make it as far as Astrobotic did.
