Statement of Standalone Audited Financial Results for the Quarter and Year ended 31st March 2021

Notes: 1. The Audited Standalone Financial Results have been reviewed and recommended by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their meetings held on 30th June, 2021. In compliance with Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirments) Regulations, 2015 ("SEBI Listing Regulations"), an Audit of the above result has been carried out by the Statutory Auditors of the Company. The Statutory auditors have expressed an unmodified opinion on the said financial results.

- The Audited Standalone Financial Results have been prepared and published in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards, section 133
 of the companies Act, 2013 read with Rules framed thereunder and Regulation 33 of SEBI Listing Regulation, as amended from time to time.
- The company is primarily engaged in the business of natural stones, building materials and allied building business activities which is considered as a single segment. There are no separate reportable segment as per IndAS-108 - Operating segments.
- 4. In March 2020, the World Health Organisation declared COVID-19 a global pandemic. Consequent to this, Government of India declared a nation-wide lockdown from 24th March, 2020. Subsequently, the nation-wide lockdown was lifted by the Government of India, but regional lockdowns continue to be implemented in areas with significant number of COVID-19 cases. Although, the Company witnessed significant improvement in its operations during the second half of the year, the Company remains watchful of the potential impact of COVID-19 pandemic, particularly the current "second wave", on resuming normal business operations on a continuing basis. Accordingly, the Company has assessed the impact of this pandemic on its business operations and has considered all relevant internal and external information available up to the date of approval of these financial results, to determine the impact on the Company's revenue from operations and estimation of sales related expenses over the foreseeable future and the recoverability and carrying value of certain assets such as property, plant and equipment, investments, inventories, trade receivables, deferred lax assets and input tax credit receivables. The impact of COVID-19 pandemic on the overall economic environment being uncertain may affect the underlying assumptions and estimates used to prepare Company's financial results, which may differ from impact considered as at the date of approval of these financials results. The Company continues its business activities, in line with the guidelines issued by the Government authorities, take steps to strengthen its liquidity position arid further explore cost restructuring exercise. The Company does not anticipate any challenges in its ability to continue as going concern or meeting its financial obligations. As the situation is unprecedented, the Company is closely monitoring the situation as it evolves in the future.
- 5. Due to the impact of Covid-19, the company has renegotiated the lease contract which has modified the value of the Right-to-Use asset, Lease Liability and the Finance cost with retrospective approach. Accordingly, compartitives for the year ended march 31, 2020 have not been retrospectively adjusted. The effect of this adoption is not material to the loss for the year.
- 6. The figures of the last quarter ended 31st March, 2021 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the financial year and published year to-date figures upto the third quarter of the respective financial years and there are no material adjustments made in the results of the quarter ended 31st March, 2021 which pertain to earlier periods. These have been sujected to limited review by the auditors.

7. Previous year/ period's figures have been regrouped and/or rearranged wherever considered necessary.

Opinion

- 1. Statement of Consolidated Audited Financial Results for the Quarter and Year ended 31st March 2021

Notes: 1. The Audited Consolidated Financial Results have been reviewed and recommended by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their meetings held on 30th June, 2021. In compliance with Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirments) Regulations, 2015 ("SEBI Listing Regulations"), an Audit of the above result has been carried out by the Statutory Auditors of the Company. The Statutory auditors have expressed an unmodified opinion on the said financial results.

- 2. The Audited Consolidated Financial Result have been prepared and published in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards, section 133 of the companies Act, 2013 read with Rules framed thereunder and Regulation 33 of SEBI Listing Regulation, as amended from time to time.
- The company is primarily engaged in the business of natural stones, building materials and allied building business activities which is considered as a single segment. There are no separate reportable segment as per IndAS-108 - Operating segments.
- 4. In March 2020, the World Health Organisation declared COVID-19 a global pandemic. Consequent to this, Government of India declared a nation-wide lockdown from 24th March, 2020. Subsequently, the nation-wide lockdown was lifted by the Government of India, but regional lockdowns continue to be implemented in areas with significant number of COVID-19 cases. Although, the Company witnessed significant improvement in its operations during the second half of the year, the Company remains watchful of the potential impact of COVID-19 pandemic, particularly the current "second wave", on resuming normal business operations on a continuing basis. Accordingly, the Company has assessed the impact of this pandemic on its business operations and has considered all relevant internal and external information available up to the date of approval of these financial results, to determine the impact on the Company's revenue from operations and estimation of sales related expenses over the foreseeable future and the recoverability and carrying value of certain assets such as property, plant and equipment, investments, inventories, trade receivables, deferred lax assets and input tax credit receivables. The impact of COVID-19 pandemic on the overall economic environment being uncertain may affect the underlying assumptions and estimates used to prepare Company's financial results, which may differ from impact considered as at the date of approval of these financials results. The Company continues its business activities, in line with the guidelines issued by the Government authorities, take steps to strengthen its liquidity position arid further explore cost restructuring exercise. The Company does not anticipate any challenges in its ability to continue as going concern or meeting its financial obligations. As the situation is unprecedented, the Company is closely monitoring the situation as it evolves in the future.
- 5. Due to the impact of Covid-19, the company has renegotiated the lease contract which has modified the value of the Right-to-Use asset, Lease Liability and the Finance cost with retrospective approach. Accordingly, compartitives for the year ended march 31, 2020 have not been retrospectively adjusted. The effect of this adoption is not material to the loss for the year.
- 6. The figures of the last quarter ended 31st March, 2021 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the financial year and published year to-date figures upto the third quarter of the respective financial years and there are no material adjustments made in the results of the quarter ended 31st March, 2021 which pertain to earlier periods. These have been sujected to limited review by the Auditors.
- 7.The consolidated financial results of Solid Stone Company Limited (the company) and an Associate, Global Instile Solid Industries Limited(Accounts made for the year ending 31st March, 2021), collectively known as "the Group", are prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standard (Ind AS-28) "Investments in Associates"
