Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of Consolidated financial results of Trinity League India Limited ("the Company"), and its Associate for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2023 (the "Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us and based on the consideration of the report of other auditor on separate audited financial statements / financial results / financial information of one Associate, the Statement:

- i. includes the results of one Associate Company namely "M/s Agrotech Risk Private Limited".
- ii. is presented in accordance with the requirements of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- iii. give a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act) read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the consolidated net loss for quarter ended 31st March 2023 , consolidated net profit for year ended 31st March 2023 and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company and its Associate for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2023.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs), as specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013, as amended ("the Act"). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the "Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Consolidated financial results" section of our report. We are independent of the Company and its Associate in accordance with the 'Code of Ethics' issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the consolidated financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules thereunder, and

The Statement has been prepared on the basis of the Consolidated annual financial statements. The Company Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Statement that give a true and fair view of the net profit / (loss), other comprehensive income and other financial information of the company including its Associate in accordance with the applicable Indian Accounting Standard prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with the Listing Regulations. The Board of Director of the company and its associate are responsible for maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and its associates and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, which have been used for the purpose of preparation of the statement by the Directors of the Company, as aforesaid.

In preparing the Statement, the Board of Directors of the company and its associate are responsible for assessing the ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors of the company and its associate are also responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process of the company and its associate.

Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Consolidated Financial Results

For the other entity included in the statement which have been audited by other auditor, such other auditor remains responsible for the direction, supervision and performance of the audit carried out by them. We remain solely responsible for our audit opinion.

Materiality is the magnitude of misstatements in the financial statements that, individually or in aggregate, makes it probable that the economic decisions of a reasonably knowledgeable user of the financial statements may be influenced. We consider quantitative materiality and qualitative factors in (i) planning the scope of our audit work and in evaluating the results of our work; and (ii) to evaluate the effect of any identified misstatements in the financial statements.

We communicate with those charged with governance of the Company and its associate included in the statement of which we are independent auditor regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.



We also performed procedures in accordance with the Circular No. CIR/CFD/CMD1/44/2019 dated March 29, 2019 issued by the Securities Exchange Board of India under Regulation 33(8) of the Listing Regulations, to the extent applicable.

Other Matters

- (i) The accompanying statement includes the audited financial results / statements and other financial information, in respect of an associate whose financial results / statements reflects company share of net profit / (loss) and total comprehensive income of Rs. (3.74 lacs) and Rs. (.94) lacs for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2023 respectively, as considered in the statement which have been audited by their independent auditor. The independent auditor's report on the financial statement / financial results / financial information of the entity referred in para have been furnished to us by the management and our opinion on the Statement, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of the Associate, is based solely on the report of the other auditor and procedure performed by us as stated in paragraph above.

Our opinion on the statement is not modified in respect of the above matters with respect to our reliance on the work done and the report of the other auditor referred in para.

- (ii) The Statement includes the results for the quarter ended March 31, 2023 being the balancing figure between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year ended March 31, 2023 and the published unaudited year-to-date figures up to the end of third quarter of the current financial year, which were subjected to a limited review by us, as required under the Listing Regulations.
