BARAPULLAH Man dead, his cousin injured as scooter falls off flyover

A 36-YEAR-OLD man died and his cousin received serious injuries, after the scooter they were travelling on hit the guard rail and fell off the Barapullah flyover Saturday evening. Initial investigation has revealed that the duo were allegedly travelling in the wrong direction on a carriageway, and lost control of their scooter, police said. An FIR of rash driving and causing death by negligence has been registered against unknown persons.

DCP (South East) Chinmoy Biswal said they were informed of the incident around 5 pm. "We rushed to the spot under the Barapullah flyover loop going towards Ashram. We found two injured men, identified as Rohit Makol and his brother Pradeep, and took them to AllMS Trauma Centre. Makol was the one driving," he said.

Police found the scooter lying on the road and a broken helmet nearby. Makol succumbed to his injuries during treatment while Pradeep is recuperating. The family of the men have been informed, police said.

There were no CCTV cameras near the accident site, police said, adding that forensic teams of the South East district were

called to the spot.

"After visiting the spot and recording statements of eyewitnesses, experts found the two men were coming from Sarai Kale Khan and heading to INA. They were allegedly travelling on the wrong carriageway when they lost control and hit the guard rail. Due to the impact, they were thrown off the vehicle and hit the base pillar of the flyover on their way down. Forensic experts have found tyre skid marks near the base pillar," said a senior officer.

Makol's brother Mayank said he had been working at a private firm in Noida as a trainee manager for the last two years, and stayed with his family in Tilak Nagar.

"It was his day off, so he called our cousin to celebrate Janmashtami. They were going out for dinner when the accident took place. Authorities should increase the height of the guard rail to curb such accidents," Mayank said.

The body of the victim was handed over to his family following a post-mortem.

People in high positions drift away, but not Jaitley, recalls school principal

IT WAS the annual dinner of the Old Boys Association, St. Xavier's Senior Secondary School, Civil Lines. Arun Jaitley, one of its most illustrious alumni, was among the invitees.

Most of the other guests had gathered to greet Jaitley in the courtyard, assuming he would drive straight inside.

But the BJP veteran's car stopped outside, and he alighted only to realise some young students had not recognised him. He got his car parked at Raj Niwas Marg, a little away from the school. At the school gate, he bought a coupon for the dinner and quietly walked in.

"You know the title of minister matters a lot. And when you get into such a high position, you gradually drift away, get distant. He did nothing of that sort. It reflects the human being he was. I think it was a beautiful gesture," said Father Thomas V Kununnal (94), recalling the evening from "four-five years ago".

Jaitley was a student at the school between 1957-69. On his official website, he described his time at St Xavier's as "the most memorable because here I moulded my thoughts, which later shaped my political vision".

"At that time, students from the commerce background had the tendency of going into activism, politics. They were usually considered the 'dadas' in that sense. He was good in academics as well as sports, especially cricket. But most importantly, he was very active as a debater, in giving speeches, participating in dramas. The world saw his oratory skills in Parliament," said Kununnal, who was then the school's principal.

How tryst with DUSU shaped his politics

AFTER EMERGING as a student leader at Delhi University in the volatile campus of the early 1970s, Arun Jaitley's early engagement with politics was closely tied to the national mood of anti-government student politics of the time.

Jaitley joined the B.Com (Honours) programme at Shri Ram College of Commerce in 1970, after completing school at St Xavier's School in Civil Lines. It was there that he met Sri Ram Khanna, an Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) activist, who persuaded him in 1971 to stand for elections for the position of Delhi University Students' Union (DUSU) Councillor — at that time, elec-

tions to DUSU were indirect and the president was selected by 10 councillors. Jaitley won that first tryst with electoral politics. That year, he also joined his college's union as debating secretary.

BJP MP Vijay Goel, who was his junior at SRCC, recalls him being an avid debater. "We went to many different colleges for inter-college debate competitions — sometimes we were on the same team, most times on different ones. He was a very talented debater and would win many awards," he said. The following year, in 1972, Jaitley contested for the post of college president and won that election as well.

Khanna, who became DUSU president that year, recalls the time when they were drawn into student protests that culminated in a 50-day student strike in 1972-1973.

"The ABVP rank and file was involved in the movement and we were at its core. Arun was a prominent speaker. He took a leading part in rallies and demonstrations, some of which were lathi-charged and tear-gassed by police. This firmly gave our movement an anti-establishment colour. Arun began to rub shoulders with ABVP activists," he said.

In 1973, the first direct elections to DUSU were held and all four seats were won by the ABVP — Jaitley, who had secured a seat in the Faculty of Law, became vice-president. The next year, Jaitley's political journey in DU culminated in him being elected union president.

By that time, in 1974, campuses across the country were seething with political unrest, with the Nav Nirman student movement in Gujarat and the

burgeoning movement in Bihar, where Jayaprakash Narayan took the lead. Jaitley and his peers in DU supported the JP Movement, and he became the convener of the movement's committee of student organisations, going to both Ahmedabad and Patna to support the agitation.

When the Emergency was declared in June 1975, Jaitley too, was caught up in its wave. Goel recalls that the day after its declaration, "he held the first procession against the Emergency on campus" and was arrested the same day.

He was to remain in prison for the next 19 months. "It was in jail that his baptism into the RSS-BJP school took place, while sharing jail cells with the arrested leaders. He was a hardcore political activist when he was released in early 1977," Khanna said.

Man shoots at himself to implicate landlord, held

IN ORDER to avoid paying pending rent of Rs 2.25 lakh, a 22-year-old man was arrested along with his brother from Amar Colony for allegedly shooting at himself to implicate his landlord. DCP (South East) Chinmoy Biswal said that the accused have been identified as Sumit Bhadana and his brother, Naveen Bhadana (20), both residents of Gurgaon.

"Sumit was running a paying guest (PG) facility in a residential building in Amar Colony. On August 22, Sumit called up police around 5 pm, claiming that his landlord had fired at him and that he was going to the hospital. He had sustained two gunshot wounds on his shoulder and thigh," he added.

In his statement, Sumit alleged that his landlord, Varun Juneja, fired at him. "Sumit alleged that Juneja shot him after a heated argument over the rent on August 22," said Biswal. Juneja, however, denied doing so and stated that on August 22, he went to collect rent from Sumit but he was asked to come at 8 pm. He also alleged that Sumit was framing him in a false case to avoid paying the rent, the DCP added.

During investigation, police found contradictions in the statements of the injured regarding the sequence of events. "Sensing trouble, Sumit left the hospital... Later, he was apprehended from his sister's house," Biswal said.

According to Biswal, Sumit hid the pistol in his scooter and made the PCR card. The weapon had been procured from a friend in Badshahpur, police said.

Four held for spreading child kidnapping rumours in Ghaziabad

FOUR PEOPLE were arrested by Ghaziabad Police Sunday for allegedly spreading rumours of child kidnapping. The accused, Raisuddin, Jeetendra Sharma, Dileram and Ved Prakash, had allegedly spread the word in Akash Nagar that two men had kidnapped a minor, after which

they were cornered by a mob. "We received information of a message circulating in Indragarhi Colony that two men had allegedly kidnapped a minor girl. Police reached the spot and it soon came to light that it was a false rumour, and the men were merely collecting donations for an orphanage. The four men were arrested for disturbing the peace in the region," said Shloka Kumar, SP,

Ghaziabad. Police said the actions came after several such rumours of child kidnapping were circulated in several parts of western Uttar Pradesh, including Saharanpur, Baghpat, Ghaziabad and Noida. A few days ago, a mentally challenged person heading to a hospital was attacked by a mob at Ghaziabad's Dasna railway station, after an unknown per-

son spread the rumour that he was an alleged child kidnapper. He was later rescued by Railway officials, police said. "These arrests send a strong message to all people who indulge in such rumour-mongering. A worrying pattern has emerged in which innocent people get beaten up on the accusation of child kidnapping. Since it is a matter of children, people get aggressive. We constantly urge

people not to pay heed to such messages and take law into their own hands," said an officer from Masuri police station. No evidence of any child kidnapping gang has been found in the area, police added. On Sunday, similar information was given to Gautam Budh Nagar Police that a six-year-old had been kidnapped by a man on a black Pulsar bike. Officials, on reaching the spot, found that

the child was safe at his residence. "Rumours of child kidnapping are being spread in various districts by some anti-social elements. People are also alleging there is an entire gang operating. This is leading people to attack innocents. The public is advised to inform police in case they see a message of child kidnapping," said Gautam Budh Nagar Police in a statement.

Shahberi residents live under shadow of fragile buildings

A YEAR after the Shahberi building collapse that claimed nine lives, more than 1,400 buildings in the area between Greater Noida West and Crossings Republik in Ghaziabad are under scanner over issues of safety and illegal construction.

The Uttar Pradesh government had earlier suggested demolition of weak buildings and rehabilitation of residents in the area. According to officials of the Greater Noida Industrial Development Authority (GNIDA), IIT-Delhi will be conducting a safety audit for which modalities are being worked out. "At present, only the safety estimation of buildings will take place; other necessary steps will be taken after that. Residents are also being requested to vacate unsafe structures. The priority of the Authority is the buyer," said a GNIDA official.

Many residents said they felt betrayed by the builders as they were living in fear of a mishap. On the eve of Independence Day, almost 28 people were detained for

protesting outside the GNIDA office to demand action against erring builders and a quicker assessment of building safety. A few were arrested for causing damage to property.

Sachin Raghav, one of the first residents to file an FIR against a builder, said: "We need to be compensated in the event buildings are demolished. We have paid the builders and they gave us unsafe buildings. Our building has five floors and they started constructing a sixth, after which cracks developed. Builders need to be punished and an alternative has to be given for buyers."

Locals also alleged that fresh registry of flats had taken place in August despite the Allahabad High Court's stay order on notification of the area.

The Gautam Budh Nagar administration is also escalating action against erring builders who made sales despite court orders. "Almost 20 FIRs have been registered against buyers not complying with the rules. Some of them have been booked under the Gangster Act. We also request buyers to not take law and order into their hands during protests," said B N Singh, District Magistrate, Gautam Budh Nagar.

Delhi govt floats tender for 11,000 WiFi hotspots

THE DELHI government Friday floated a Rs 97.55 lakh tender for the installation of 11,000 WiFi hotspots in the capital's public places.

According to the tender document, the agency which wins the bid will have to execute the project within three months.

It says the 11,000 figure is approximate in nature and the actual number of hotspots may vary "30 percent on the plus or

minus side". "There should be a limit of 15 GB data per month per user and 1.5 GB per day per user, whichever is earlier. Each user shall get minimum 1.3 Mbps at any time when connected," it says.

Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has said that each user will get to access the internet at a speed of 200 Mbps at every hotspot.

"Bidder to provide secure WiFi, with capability to block certain type of websites like adult or any other banned websites," it adds.

Haryana CM's yatra to reach Gurgaon this week

HARYANA CHIEF Minister Manohar Lal Khattar's Jan Ashirvaad Yatra is set to reach Gurgaon and surrounding districts this week, with PWD and Haryana Forest Minister Rao Narbir Singh clarifying that the vehicle will reach the city on Tuesday. On Monday, the CM will address people in Jhajjar.

"On August 27, the yatra will reach near Jhund Sarai village around 4 pm, where people will welcome it and bless the CM to

form the government again. During his tenure, several development works have been undertaken in Gurgaon and the Ahirwal region," said Singh.

"A major event has been organised in the area for the Chief Minister, in which BJP leader J P Nadda will also be present. From there, the yatra will progress to Wazirpur, Hayatpur, Gadhi Harsaru, Gadoli, and Kadipur Chowk," he added.

Prior to Gurgaon, through Monday and part of Tuesday, the yatra will travel through the Jhajjar, Bahadurgarh and Badli constituencies.

व्यापक भ्रूति को दूर करने के लिए यह अवगत करवाया जाता है कि हरियाणा राज्य ने किसी प्रकार के बसों के किराए में किसी प्रकार की कोई बढ़ोतरी नहीं की है। पड़ोसी राज्य पंजाब द्वारा दिनांक 19.08.2019 को नोटिफिकेशन जारी कर उनके क्षेत्र में संचालित होन वाली साधारण बसों का किराया 5 पैसे प्रति किलोमीटर बढ़ाया गया है, जो अब 109 पैसे प्रति किलोमीटर से बढ़कर 114 पैसे प्रति किलोमीटर हो गया है। जबकि हरियाणा राज्य में वर्ष 2016 से अभी तक साधारण बसों का किराया 85 पैसे प्रति किलोमीटर ही है, जिसे बढ़ाया नहीं गया है।

इस संबंध में यह स्पष्ट किया जाता है कि किसी भी राज्य के मार्ग से होकर जाने वाली बसों पर उस राज्य द्वारा लागू बस किराया ही वसूल किया जाता है, चाहे बस किसी भी राज्य की हो। अतः नियमानुसार पंजाब राज्य द्वारा पढ़ाए गए बसों के किराए का असर केवल पंजाब क्षेत्र से होकर जाने वाली बसों पर ही लागू होगा और जो बसे हरियाणा के क्षेत्र में ही संचालित होंगी उन पर इस बढ़ोतरी का कोई असर नहीं होगा।
