Institution of Parliament. Also, all important decisions regarding the country are taken in the name of President.

The plea further states that Parliament, consisting of the President and the two Houses, Rajya Sabha and Lok Sabha, is the supreme legislative authority in India and the President possesses the authority to summon and prorogue the Parliament or dissolve the Lok Sabha. Citing Article 79 of the Constitution, the plea also states that the President is an integral part of Parliament; hence she should not be kept away from the inauguration. To do so, smacks of lack of application on the part of the Lok Sabha Secretariat.

In a joint statement on Wednesday, the 19 'recalcitrant' political parties had said, "When the sole of democracy has been sacked out of Parliament, we find no value in a new building." The BJP-led NDA had shot back, condemning the "contentious" decision. "This is not merely disrespectful, it is a blatant affront to the democratic ethos and constitutional values of our great nation," it was said in a statement.

consistently from Day 1 and that got me the marks," said the Commerce top scorer, who refused to quit her hobby during boards. "I really enjoy singing and practised even during the board exams. I continued to do so even for I prep for my CA exams now," she said. Pooari resident Meher Mehtani topped her batch at St Xavier's College, securing 95 per cent in the humanities. "Switching boards, from CBSE to ISC was a very daunting experience, but opting for Maths with Humanities did the trick. After HSC, I hope to crack the UPSC exam too," said Meher, who plans to pursue economics at the same college.

With a pass percentage of 89.25 per cent, students from the Minimum Competency and Vocational Courses were not far behind in making their mark. Ghatkoti's Deep Patel topped the stream at the S. Komaya College, with 90.67 per cent, though he says, "In my wildest dreams, I did not think I would score." "I did not know what to pick after Class 10. I saw my cousin enroll in MCV and went with him. Things have worked out for the best and I managed to learn a lot about accounting," said the student, who hopes to be an entrepreneur one day.

The HSC exams were held from February 21 to March 23, 2023, with 5,033 exam centres across the state for students across all three streams — arts, science and commerce. A total of 14,28,194 students appeared for the examination, with 3,29,337 students appearing from the Mumbai division. Of these, 1,05,749 students were science students, recording a pass percentage of 91.18 per cent. 47,446 students appeared from the arts stream, with a pass percentage of 80.89 per cent while 1,71,509 commerce students took the exam with a pass percentage of 88.15 per cent.

Teen hacked 90,000...

Bharame said that the student had only hacked admit cards and no evidence of the question paper being hacked or shared was

found. However, Kamole's lifestyle has raised doubts about his source of income. "Kambole is a student and has no fixed source of income. WHAT THE CASE IS ABOUT

The Belapur police registered a case on April 25, after more than 94,000 admit cards for the MPSC non-gazetted Group B and Group C cadres' exam were leaked on a Telegram channel. The exam was scheduled on April 30 at 1,475 centres across 37 districts. MPSC Joint Secretary Sunil Harishchandra Avtade approached the Belapur police after he learnt about the illegal downloading of students' admit cards and their being published on the Telegram channel "MPSC 2023 A" on April 23.

As per the complainant, a total of 46,645 candidates were registered for the examination. The admit card or hall tickets of 94,195 students were downloaded illegally and published on the Telegram channel.

According to police, the admit cards for the examination were made available on the MPSC website on April 21, 2023. Since there were a large number of students, the commission also made available a separate link, 'Admission Certificate' on its website, https://mpsc.gov.in, under 'online facilities'. Through the external link, candidates could download the admit card by mentioning their registered mobile number with the commission and entering the OTP. Kambole used the additional link for the illegal download of admit cards.

Denying sex to spouse...

In July 1994, the couple got mutually separated before a panchayat after the man paid alimony of Rs 22,000 to his wife. She later married another man. Then the husband approached a court seeking divorce on grounds of mental cruelty and desertion. However, the trial court refused to grant divorce on the grounds of cruelty. Feeling aggrieved, he filed an appeal before the Allahabad High Court as a bench of the family court which dismissed his divorce plea. A bench of Justice Suneet Kumar and Justice Rajendra Kumar IV, while granting the husband a decree of divorce, on Thursday said: "Undoubtedly, not allowing a spouse for a long time to have sexual intercourse with his or her partner, without sufficient reason, itself amounts to mental cruelty. Since there is no acceptable view in which a spouse can be compelled to resume life with the consort, nothing is achieved by trying to keep the parties tied forever to a marriage."

Amul-Aavin milk spat...

"Recently, it has come to our notice that Amul has utilised its multi-state cooperative licence to install chilling centres and establish a processing plant in Krishnagar and has planned to procure milk through SHGs in and around Krishnagar, Dharmapuri, Vellore, Ranipet, Tirupathur, Kancheepuram and Tiruvallur districts in our state," he said. Such cross-procurement goes against the spirit of 'Operation White Flood' and will exacerbate problems for consumers given the prevailing milk shortage in the country. This act of Amul infringes on Aavin's milk-shed area, which has been nurtured in the true cooperative spirit over decades. This move by Amul will create unhealthy competition between co-operatives engaged in procuring and marketing milk and milk products," Stalin cautioned.

Regional co-operatives have been the bedrock of dairy development in states and are better placed to engage and nurture producers and to cushion consumers from arbitrary price hikes, the union leader said. He also urged the government to regulate milk procurement from the milk shed area of Aavin in Tamil Nadu with immediate effect.

Shah in Guwahati...

Clashes broke out in Manipur after a 'Tribal Solidarity March' was organised in the hill districts of the state on May 3 to protest against the Meitei community's demand for Scheduled Tribe (ST) status. ARCHAEOLOGISTS FIND NEOLITHIC STONE TOOLS IN HYD Archaeologists in Hyderabad have recently found rare stone tools, belonging to the neolithic age, with the findings indicating the city's history goes back to about 6,000 years. The Neolithic age relates to the period when humans used tools and weapons made of stone and had just developed farming. It was for the first time that neolithic tools have been found in the city, said E Sivani Reddy, a retired government archaeology official. Reddy, a noted archaeologist and CEO of Panch India Foundation, said he and S Harigopal, Kotla Telugana Charitra Brundam (an organisation working on the history of Telugana) recently visited a natural rock formation at BNR Hills in the city, locally known as 'torso rock', to explore if there any prehistoric rock paintings when they stumbled upon the said discovery. —PTI
