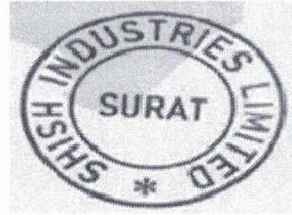

CONVICTED IN NARCOTICS CASE

Citing safety, Sanjiv Bhatt wants to stay at Palanpur jail, wife moves HC

CLAIMING THREAT to life at a central jail, former IPS officer Sanjiv Bhatt's wife Shweta Bhatt on March 28 moved the Gujarat High Court, seeking directions to the state and prison department not to shift him from the Palanpur district jail after his recent conviction in a narcotics case.

Taken up for hearing on Wednesday, Shweta Bhatt's plea has also sought that the state and prison authorities produce the court order via which Sanjiv was sent to the Palanpur district jail,

where he has been lodged since his conviction in connection to a 1990 custodial torture case.

On March 28, Sanjiv was sentenced to 20 years of rigorous imprisonment by a Palanpur court under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act in a case dating back to 1996. Bhatt had been accused of planting 1.15 kg of opium in a hotel room to frame a Rajasthan-

based lawyer.

The court had said that Bhatt would serve two consecutive sentences and his time spent in Palanpur jail would count as that of an undertrial prisoner. Further, it had directed that Bhatt would be lodged at a central jail. According to prison laws, given his two convictions, Sanjiv is required to be housed at one of the four central jails in the state.

In her petition before the HC, Shweta has submitted that as an IPS officer, Sanjiv had arrested dangerous criminals and terrorists who might be lodged at the central jails, thus posing a threat to his security.

Represented by advocate Kruti Shah, Shweta has submitted before Justice H D Suthar that Sanjiv was lodged at the Palanpur jail via a judicial order by the Jamnagar court on grounds of safety after the court convicted him in the custodial torture case in June 2019.

Shah has said the court order had also directed that Sanjiv be lodged at Palanpur jail in connection with the Jamnagar case, thus effectively implying that the time spent at the Palanpur jail would be included in his life imprisonment sentence.

However, public prosecutor and additional advocate general

Mitesh Amin on Wednesday submitted that Sanjiv was lodged at Palanpur jail as an undertrial prisoner because he was facing a trial in the NDPS case. The arrangement to lodge him at Palanpur jail was made for convenience, as Sanjiv's presence was required during the trial, he added.

Shweta's petition has been moved under articles 14 (right to equality), 19 (right to freedom), 21 (right to life and liberty) and 226 of the Constitution as well as Section 482 (powers of high court to prevent abuse of court processes and ensure justice) of the Criminal Procedure Code.

TMC MP moves HC seeking quashing of cyber crime FIR

TRINAMOL CONGRESS national spokesperson and Rajya Sabha MP Saker Gokhale moved Gujarat High Court on April 1, seeking quashing of an FIR lodged against him in December 2022 by the Ahmedabad cyber crime police station, which has formed the basis of Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) proceedings against him.

Mentioned before the court of Justice H D Suthar on Wednesday, the matter will be heard on April 12.

The latest legal recourse taken by Gokhale comes after Ahmedabad rural court on March 1 rejected his plea seeking that the case arising out of the December 2022 FIR be dropped.

Gokhale is facing charges under sections 406 (criminal breach of trust), 420 (cheating), 465, 468 (forgery) and 471 (using forged document) of Indian Penal Code as well as under sections 66C (punishment for iden-

tity theft) and 66D (cheat by personation) of IT Act. Following the FIR, Gokhale was arrested by the ED on January 25, 2023.

He is also facing a PMLA case for alleged misuse of money received via crowdfunding based on this FIR lodged by the cyber crime police station. The ED had investigated the money trail of nearly Rs 1.07 crore in Gokhale's accounts, of which around Rs 76 lakh was received through online crowdfunding campaigns and Rs 23 lakh via cash transfers.

While opposing the discharge plea before the Ahmedabad rural court, the prosecution had alleged that Gokhale had obtained Rs 76 lakh in his bank accounts through crowdfunding platforms OurDemocracy.in and Razorpay and had used the same for personal purposes, thereby committing the alleged offence of cheating and breach of trust.

The court of Principal District Judge D M Vyas, while rejecting Gokhale's discharge plea on March 1, had ruled that prima facie case is made out to frame charges against Gokhale.

HC stays marital rape trial against Botad advocate

THE GUJARAT High Court on Wednesday admitted a petition filed by a practising advocate from Botad, who has been accused of marital rape by his wife, seeking quashing of the FIR. The HC also granted him interim relief while staying the proceedings of the trial at Botad.

An FIR was lodged at Botad town police station in 2023 for offences under sections 376(2)(n) (repeated rape) and 506(2)(c) (criminal intimidation) of the Indian Penal Code.

The accused, represented by senior advocate Yatin Oza and advocate Arjunde Zala, told HC that while the concept of marital rape is "unknown to the statute" and is not criminalised, the complainant in the case is a major and his legally wedded wife, and thus sexual intercourse with her or any sexual act performed by the accused would not constitute an offence of rape even if it was by force, violence or against her wishes. The plea added that the complaint had arisen of the woman's "mischievous intents".

The plea further said that the case was the result of a troubled marriage, "catalysed by the police authorities mindlessly lodging" the complaint.

The dispute had allegedly arisen over the woman wishing to live separately from the family of the accused. The plea said that after the offence was lodged, the woman had moved a petition under the Hindu Marriage Act, seeking restitution of conjugal rights.

Granting interim relief to the accused, the court of Justice H D Suthar observed that "prima facie it appears that their relationship was consensual" and also took into account that the woman is now seeking restitution of conjugal rights.

EC eyes 80% turnout in state: 1,100 camps at college campuses to woo first-time voters

FROM THE Rashtriya Raksha University (RRU) in Gandhinagar, which trains cadres from the security and police forces, to the Gujarat Vidyapith, founded by Mahatma Gandhi, in Ahmedabad -- officials of the Election Commission (EC) have been putting concerted efforts to motivate first-time voters in Gujarat to step out and exercise their franchise.

"Lack of awareness or interest", and "laziness" were among the reasons students cited during a session on Tuesday at the RRU as Gujarat Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) P Bharathi prodded them on exercising their right to franchise.

The CEO was presiding over the 'Camp at Campus' event for the first-time voters

The camps are a part of the Election Commission's efforts to increase voter turnout in the upcoming Lok Sabha elections. Gujarat saw a 64.11 per cent turnout in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, lower than the national average of 67 per cent. Bharathi blames the trend on "urban apathy". "Urban apathy is there. Ahmedabad is an example that records a low voting percentage," she told *The Indian Express*.

Eying a target of over 1,100 such events in the state, the Election Commission has held 700 camps in the last 25 days.

"There are around 1,100 campuses in Gujarat and one ambassador has been hired in each of these to hold camps," said

Rinkesh Patel, Additional Collector at the office of CEO.

The *Indian Express* attended two such camps at the RRU and Vidyapith. Appealing to the students to participate responsibly in the election process, the Gujarat CEO said that if the response is good, they may not need to hold such camps next time.

Bharathi said that the target for Gujarat has been set at an 80 per cent turnout for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections.

Speaking with the RRU stu-

dents, she said, "Why should we come to motivate you all? We have a job of conducting elections and not telling every single person to vote. Why should we do this? We have fundamental rights and duties in the Constitution; and in a democracy too, we don't have compulsory voting, we can't force anyone. If compulsory voting is there our job is finished. We don't have to waste one hour in reaching here and do this camp at campus and go back. The main job is to conduct elections."

Amid a lack of enthusiasm among students, Bharathi turned to the faculty members with the question -- "Why should we vote?" She was again greeted with silence. "Do you want to vote or not?" she continued, giving an example. "If there are 100 people and only 50 vote, then the majority of these 50 will form the government," said the CEO.

She went on to say, "Are you all happy that India is a democratic country or not? Or you should have something like China or some other country. Do you want democracy or not?"

Bharathi's address at Tuesday's camp was preceded by the Registrar Shishir Gupta's address and a presentation by SVEEP (Systematic Voters' Education and Electoral Participation) co-ordinator Yogesh Parekh who showed three relevant videos to students.

Inaugurated in 2010 by then chief minister Narendra Modi as Raksha Shakti University, the RRU was taken over by the cen-

tral government in 2020 by an Act of Parliament, renamed and designated as "an institute of national importance", specialising in national security. "Nearly 80 per cent of the students are from other states," Gupta told this paper. The varsity has been registering lower turnout among female students.

In Gujarat alone, the CEO told the stu-

9 students caught cheating during Board exams in Surat

NINE STUDENTS were caught cheating during the state Board examinations in Surat, officials said on Wednesday. Among them, six appeared for Class X and three for Class XII exams.

After the CCTV camera footages at the centres were scrutinised, the Surat District Education Officer (DEO) sent details of these students to the state education department to take further steps.

The Board exams had commenced in the state on March 11 and concluded on March 26. In Surat, two exam centres had been set up. Six teams of 20

members each were tasked with looking into the CCTV footages at the centres since March 13.

Surat DEO Bhagirathsinh Parmar said the students initially denied the allegations, but when they were shown CCTV footage, they broke down and confessed.

"We have taken statements of these nine students and they have confessed. We have also taken statements from the examination hall supervisor and school principal. We have prepared a report and sent it to the examination department of the state education board to take further steps," he added.

"The incidents had gone unnoticed by examination hall supervisors but were caught on CCTV cameras," said Parmar.

SC transfers case linked to Mundra port drug haul from Punjab to Ahmedabad court

New Delhi: In a relief to the NIA, the Supreme Court on Wednesday allowed its plea and ordered that a heroin smuggling case allegedly linked to the sensational Mundra port drug haul be transferred from a court in Punjab's Hoshiarpur to a special NIA court in Ahmedabad.

The Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) has filed a case in Gujarat and the second case is pending before a special court at Saket in New Delhi. The third case is pending before the court of the additional sessions judge in Hoshiarpur. The NIA wanted the Punjab case to be transferred to Ahmedabad for an effective trial. PTI
