Mann had first levelled the allegations against Channi's nephew Jashan on May 22 but did not name the cricketer. On Wednesday, he produced Jass Inder Singh and his father Manjinder Singh at a press conference. "Jass Inder Singh is a team member of the Kings XI Punjab (Punjab Kings), although he did not get a chance in the playing 11," Mann said.

ha MP from Kadapa in Andhra Pradesh, not to leave the country without prior permission of the CBI, till the investigation was complete and he shall not tamper with the prosecution witnesses or alter any evidence.

"The petitioner shall cooperate with the investigation and shall appear before the CBI Police on every Saturday from 10 am to 5 pm., till the end of June, 2023 and shall regularly appear as and when he is required for investigation," Jus-

stice M Laxman said in his order. The petitioner shall be released on bail in the event of his arrest by the CBI, on execution of a personal bond of Rs 5 lakhs only with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the CBI, the order said.

NEW DELHI: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) said on Wednesday that it has completed its probe against former Deputy CM of Delhi Manish Sisodia for his alleged involvement in the Delhi excise policy case. The ED also mentioned this fact in its fourth supplementary charge sheet filed in connection with the case. The court has taken cognisance of the charge sheet. The ED has claimed that it has enough evidence to prove that Sisodia was involved in money laundering and had allegedly generated proceeds of crime to the tune of Rs 622 crore through various means. The ED has also alleged that Sisodia created legal facade and tried to derail the investigation. Additionally, the ED has accused Sisodia of destroying a crucial file pertaining to the legal opinions of two former Chief Justice of India and an Additional Solicitor General.
