## India's manufacturing critical to fighting COVID-19: Gates

New Delhi, Oct. 20: India's research and manufacturing will be critical to fighting COVID-19 especially for making vaccines on a large scale, billionaire philanthropist Bill Gates said on Monday. Addressing the Grand Challenges Annual Meeting 2020, Gates delved upon the difficulties in vaccine development and diagnostics of COVID-19.

The American business magnate said India is "very inspiring" as it has made huge strides in improving the health of its people in the last two decades.

"And now, India's research and manufacturing will be critical to fighting COVID-19 especially when it comes to making vaccines at large scale," he said.

Gates said scientists all over the world are involved in a particular 'grand challenge' - ending the current pandemic.

He said researchers are breaking

down silos and rather than waiting to go through the publication process, they are sharing data on a daily basis.

"Since the pandemic began, scientists have shared 137,000 viral COVID-19 genomic sequences," the Microsoft Corp co-founder said. Even the pharmaceutical companies are cooperating on production ways that really have never been seen before, he added.

Talking about the challenges in vaccine development, he said mRNA vaccine is an area where many have seen "great promises".

"Probably, the first approved vaccine for COVID-19 will be mRNA," he said but added that the vaccine cannot be counted on alone because it is very hard to scale up and has a logistical problem because it requires a proper cold chain.

Gates expressed hope that the mRNA platform matures in the

years ahead so that its vaccines can be scaled up that can bring down the costs as well the cold chain requirement.

He also stressed on the need for innovation in diagnostics platforms.

"Even when sometimes people are tested, results come back negative because some of the tests are not sensitive to the small nano virus," he said, adding, this also leads to infection.

"So, the diagnostics are letting us down," Gates said, stressing on the asymptomatic nature of the infection.

"Right now, the current business model is identifying people with symptoms and we need to change that. We need sensitive and specific diagnostic tests which matter and we need to make it easy to access," he said.

## CSK skipper Dhoni @ 200 testing time for fans

### Youngsters lack spark, feels beleaguered captain

Abu Dhabi, Oct. 20:

Chennai Super Kings skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni on Monday said the youngsters in his squad did not show the spark needed to break into the playing XI at the expense of the veterans. The match marked the 200th appearance of Mahendra Singh Dhoni in IPL but, as is his wont, the skipper played down the milestone and said he was oblivious to it.

Three-time winners CSK, who have been criticised for continuing with their old warhorses, suffered their seventh defeat in the ongoing IPL, this time to Rajasthan Royals.

"You don't want to chop

and change. Insecurity is something you don't want to prevail in the dressing room. Fair enough, this season we weren't really there," Dhoni said at the presentation ceremony after suffering the seven-wicket loss.

"Also the youngsters, we didn't see the spark to push the guys. But what this result has done is give those youngsters a chance in the rest of the tournament.

"Maybe going forward we bring them in and they play without pressure." RR restricted CSK to a modest 125 for five after being invited to bowl and then overcame the target in 17.3 overs, thanks to a 98-run fourth wicket

partnership between Jos Buttler (70) and skipper Steve Smith (26).

Dhoni said, "There was a bit for the fast bowlers and the reason I brought (Ravindra) Jadeja was to see how much it was stopping and it didn't as much as the first innings. So I went with the fast bowlers. I don't think the spinners got as much bite.

"It's not always supposed to go your way. We have to see if the process was wrong. Result is a by-product of the process, but the fact still remains that if you're focused on the process then the undue pressure of result doesn't enter the dressing room."

RR captain Smith was relieved to have secured a crucial win at an important stage of the tournament.

"The wicket was stopping, wasn't easy for batting. Strange game but nice to be on the winning side.

"I thought we bowled pretty well in the powerplay and the spinners did a good job in the middle with their leggies and googlies and squeezing," he said.

"Buttler's innings took the pressure off me at the other end. It was a really good innings on a wicket that wasn't the easiest," Smith added.

## Eighth-grader Anika hits on treatment for COVID

Texas, Oct 20 14-year-old eighth grader Anika Chebrolu, an Indian-American from Texas, has won the 2020 3M Young Scientist Challenge for work on a potential drug to treat COVID-19. Chebrolu has been awarded \$25,000 for her research to find a treatment for the virus. The teenager has developed a molecule that can bind to a certain protein of the coronavirus and prevent it from functioning.

Talking about the developed molecule, the eighth-grader said it can bind to a certain protein on the SARS-CoV-2 virus.

Anika who received the title of America's Top Young Scientist will also get a 'one-of-a-kind 2 day/1-night destination trip'

She had participated in the '3M Young Scientist



Challenge' and her quest to find a treatment for the virus has fetched her this award.

"I have always been amazed by science experiments since my childhood and I was drawn towards finding

effective cures for Influenza disease after a severe bout of the infection last year," Anika has said.

An eighth-grader Indian-American has been awarded a grand prize of USD 25,000 for her

attempt to find a possible cure for the COVID-19 outbreak.

When asked about her favorite invention, she quickly says is the Internet. She says it is her favourite because it allows us to explore so much with just a few clicks. I find it a treasure trove of information and it has become a valuable asset in pursuing knowledge and conducting research from anywhere and at anytime. I am amazed at how vast and profound it is and cannot imagine a world without the internet. When coupled with proper judgement and use, we can achieve so much more and I am enthused at its potential each time I use it."

Her ambitions is she hopes to be a medical researcher and professor.

## Trump goes full ballast, calls health expert 'idiot'

Prescott, Oct. 20: President Donald Trump came out swinging Monday against Dr. Anthony Fauci and polls that show Trump trailing Democrat Joe Biden in key battleground states, as he tried to buck up his campaign team two weeks out from election day.

Back on the trail after his COVID-19 infection, Trump was facing intense pressure to turn around his campaign, hoping for the type of last-minute surge that revived his candidacy four years ago and plunging into an aggressive travel schedule despite the pandemic.

But his lack of a consistent message, newly surging virus cases and his attacks on experts like Fauci could undermine his final efforts to appeal to voters outside his most loyal base.

Trump insisted to supporters that he believes he will still win another term, though allowing that he didn't have that same sense of confidence two weeks ago when he was hospitalised for treatment for the virus.

Seeking to shore up the morale of his staff, Trump blasted his government's own scientific experts as too negative, even as his handling of the pandemic that has killed nearly 220,000 Americans remains a central issue to voters.

"People are tired of hearing Fauci and all these idiots," Trump said of the government's top infectious disease expert. "Every time he goes on television, there's always a bomb, but there's a bigger bomb if you fire him. But Fauci's a disaster," Trump said.

The doctor is both respected and popular, and Trump's rejection of scientific advice on the pandemic has already drawn bipartisan condemnation.

Fauci, in an interview with CBS's 60 Minutes that aired on Sunday, said he was not surprised that Trump contracted the virus after he held large events with few face coverings. Fauci also objected to the President's campaign using his words in a campaign ad.

I was worried that he was going to get sick when I saw him in a completely precarious situation of crowded, no separation between people, and almost

nobody wearing a mask, Fauci said of the President.

Trump's comments drew a defense of the scientist from Tennessee GOP Senator Lamar Alexander, who praised Fauci as "one of the nation's most distinguished public servants".

Biden was off the trail on Monday, but his campaign said in a statement: "Trump's closing message in the final days of the 2020 race is to publicly mock Joe Biden for trusting science and to call Dr. Fauci, the leading public health official on COVID-19, a 'disaster' and other public health officials 'idiots'."

## Murali asks Vijay Sethupathi to opt out; actor obliges

Chennai, Oct. 20: Sri Lankan cricketer Muttiah Muralitharan on Monday requested Tamil actor Vijay Sethupathi (VSP) to opt out of his biopic '800' considering opposition and the star acceded saying 'thanks.' The actor has been under tremendous pressure from some quarters to withdraw from the biopic project, the iconic cricketer said in a statement.

"I don't like an outstanding artist from Tamil Nadu to be affected because of me. I request him to step aside since he should not face unnecessary hurdles in his career in future," Muralitharan said.

Tagging the cricketer's statement on his twitter handle, Sethupathi said, 'Nandri (Thanks)...Vankkam.' Asked on his 'thanks' tweet, the

actor confirmed that it meant him opting out of the movie.

"It's all over and that is the meaning," he told reporters.

Muralitharan said obstacles were nothing new and he was not tired of it, adding all his achievements became a reality only after overcoming them. The legendary sportsman said he agreed to a biopic on him as it would give enthusiasm and determination to future generations in addition to young cricketers and such an initiative too has confronted impediments. Expressing confidence that hurdles would be overcome, he said the producers have assured him that an announcement could be expected soon, apparently indicating that another actor shall be picked to

reprise his career. He thanked those who stood by him and the Tamil people in this regard. The ruling AIADMK had said the actor should reconsider his decision to be a part of the movie.

The actor's proposal to play the lead role also became a matter of heated debate in the social media. Parties, including the MDMK, PMK and veteran Tamil filmmaker Bharathirajaa were among those who had urged the actor to disassociate from the biopic.

They had alleged that Muralitharan was a betrayer of the Tamil people and supported the then Sri Lankan President Mahinda Rajapaksa during the 2009 civil war.

## Firebreak lockdown

Wales, in the south-west of the United Kingdom, on Monday announced a firebreak complete lockdown for just over two weeks starting this Friday amid a continued spike in coronavirus infections across the UK. The short, sharp shock of the temporary measures, to last until November 9, will take Wales back to the UK-wide tough restrictions introduced in March at the peak of the pandemic, with most businesses shutting, and people being told to stay at home and work from home where possible.

Non-essential shops, tourism and hospitality businesses will have to close, except for takeaways, along with community centres, libraries and places of worship other than for funerals and weddings. "It will have to be sharp and deep in order to have the impact we need. Everyone in Wales will be required to stay at home. All non-essential businesses will have to close," First Minister Mark Drakeford said at a press conference.

## Marriage in hospital!

An Israeli man hospitalised with the coronavirus has been granted the rare chance to take part in his son's wedding after the Jerusalem hospital hosted the ceremony on its grounds, beneath the man's hospital room window. A video of Sunday's event by the Hadassah Medical Centre showed the bride, escorted by two women holding candles, walking to a traditional wedding canopy set up on the hospital campus.

As a live singer crooned Hebrew music, the couple, from an ultra-Orthodox family in the southern Israeli city of Arad, was surrounded by their guests, a handful of ultra-Orthodox men wearing masks, as well as several photographers. Looking on from a window above the ceremony was the groom's father, 56, who has been hospitalised in serious condition with COVID-19 since September, according to the hospital. In the video, he is seen with an oxygen mask on his face, lying in a hospital bed near the window.

## Israel human trials soon

Israel has named its COVID-19 vaccine candidate 'Brilife' and its human trials will begin by October-end, according to an official press release. The prospective vaccine is being developed by the Israel Institute of Biological Research (IIBR) that was established in 1952 as part of the Israel Defence Forces' Science Corps, and later became a civilian organisation.

Israel had claimed in August that it already has the vaccine against the coronavirus "in hand" but it has to go through regulatory processes that would begin with human trials following the autumn holidays. Defence Minister Benny Gantz on Monday visited the IIBR and described the process of beginning of human trials as a "very significant moment" and "source of national pride" that can bring great news for Israel and the rest of the world. Gantz was briefed on relevant details related to the vaccine's production and the anticipated timetable.

## 10 die in nursing home

A coronavirus outbreak has killed 10 residents in a nursing home in a northwestern Kansas county that proportionally already had the nation's largest increase in cases over two weeks. The health department in Norton County reported Monday night that all 62 residents and an unspecified number of employees at the Andbe Home in Norton had tested positive for the novel coronavirus. The agency also said one Andbe Home resident was hospitalized, while the remaining 51 were being treated at the home.

Steps are being taken to prevent any further outbreak, including quarantining residents in their rooms and not allowing outside visitors into the facility, the county health department said in a statement Monday evening. The outbreak at the nursing home came after the state Department of Health and Environment last week reported more than 100 cases at the state's prison in Norton over the two weeks ending Wednesday.
