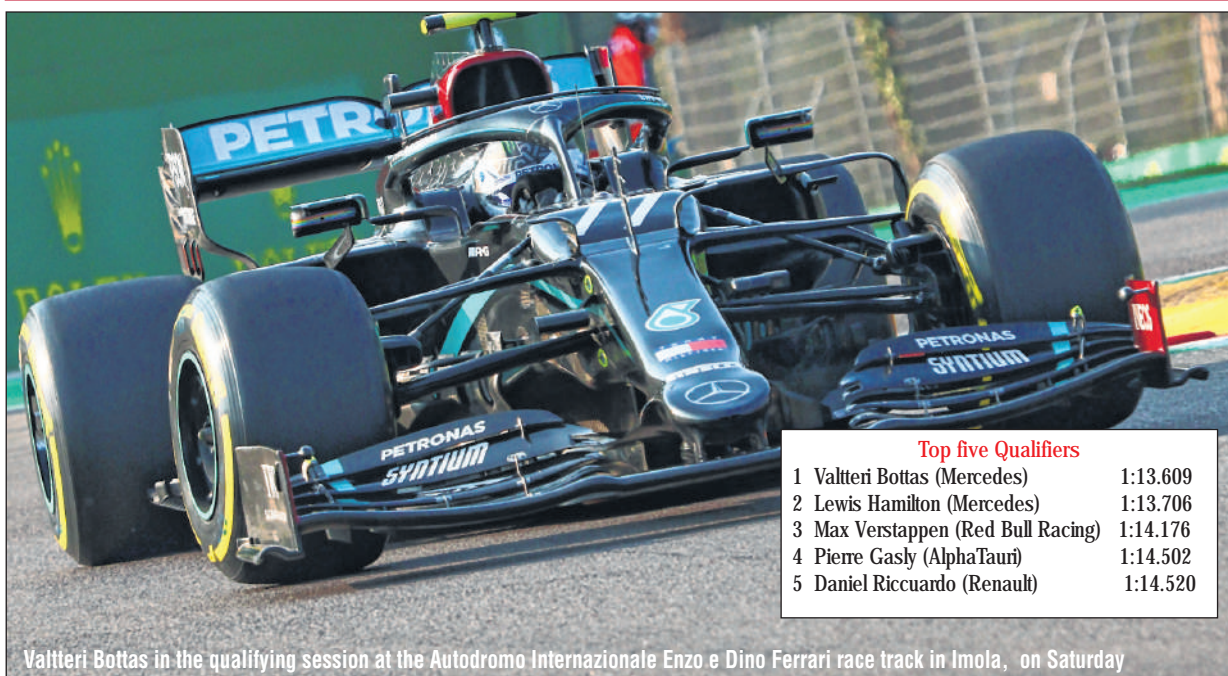
Pips champion Lewis Hamilton by 0.1 seconds

Beating Lewis Hamilton is no easy feat these days, but his Mercedes team mate Valtteri Bottas found a way to do just that at Imola as he took a sensational pole position for the Emilia Romagna Grand Prix.

The Finn trailed Hamilton by just 0.031s after the first runs, but having topped both opening segments of qualifying, Bottas found the time when it mattered, lighting up the timesheets to take pole by 0.1s.

Mercedes were in a class of their own at the historic and picturesque Italian track, with Max Verstappen unable to get within half a second of the silver cars, but fortunate to get to Q3 at all after encountering a power issue in Q2.

Pierre Gasly, announced at AlphaTauri for 2021 ahead of the weekend, was in scin-

tillating form all afternoon, the Frenchman comfortably in the top four throughout and crossing the line to end up fourth quickest to equal his career best start.

Renault's Daniel Ricciardo was fifth, his fourth top-five start this season, ahead of Alexander Albon who seemed unhappy with the car, but found a way to at least start inside the top six, albeit it 0.4s adrift of team mate Verstappen.

Charles Leclerc couldn't repeat his heroics of the last couple of races, but the Ferrari driver was still a solid seventh with Daniil Kvyat making a rare appearance in Q3 for AlphaTauri.

The McLarens didn't have the pace to compete in the final shootout, with Lando Norris edging ahead of team mate Carlos Sainz for only the second time in the last eight races to complete the top 10.

AFI chief warns athletes, coaches

The re-elected Athletic Federation of India sends a stern warning for athletes and coaches against using banned drugs, with COVID-19 excuses.

Age frauding, food supplements and drugs, were the three important subjects, the re-instated chief of the AFI, Adil Sumariwalla stressed while addressing the Annual General Body meeting soon after the election.

"If an individual thinks of their individual performance by taking banned drugs, they forget it the entire country which will face the consequences," said Sumariwalla, who has been asked to continue in office for yet another term.

Talking to Free Press Journal, Mumbai soon after the Annual General Meeting, Sumariwalla from Gurgaon, raised the possibility of more athletes outside the national camp taking to banned drugs and laid a lot of blame on the district and state-level coaches.

"NADA (National Anti-Doping Agency) is not doing testing now (due to COVID-19 pandemic). But I am telling the athletes and coaches to not think that because of this they can take banned drugs and get away," Sumariwalla said.

Sumariwalla, who was elected unopposed as president for his third and final four-year term, came down heavily on the coaches outside the national camp, laying blame on them for intentionally giving banned drugs to their wards.

"Coaches at the district and

state level give drugs to their wards and promoting doping. These are government coaches. If their wards do well, these coaches will get financial incentives and they will remain at their home station, will not get transferred.

"So, they (coaches) do all these for their benefit but it is harming Indian athletics. Everyone should be responsible. Please educate the coaches at your districts and states," Sumariwalla said while addressing the district and state-level officials.

He warned against the contaminated food supplements available in the market and asked the athletes not to buy them from outside the camp.

"I am told that the food supplements imported from outside the country might have come clean but I think these are re-packed again in India and these may be contaminated. I am appealing to my athletes to be very careful and not buy from outside. Please consult doctors before using these food supplements," the AFI chief said.

The former Olympian, Sumariwalla also brought up the long-standing problem of age-fudging by athletes at the age-group events. Here also coaches are hand in glove with the athletes, he revealed.

Earlier, incumbent Adille Sumariwalla was elected president of the Athletics Federation of India (AFI) for his third term while legendary long jumper Anju Bobby George was made senior vice-president. Ravinder Chaudhary, who has served AFI for a long time in various capacities, was elected secretary.

Gasly reveals Senna tribute helmet ahead of F1's Imola return

For many F1 fans, Imola will always conjure up memories of Ayrton Senna, who lost his life along with Austrian racer Roland Ratzenberger at the circuit back in 1994. And ahead of the track's return to the F1 calendar in 2020, AlphaTauri's Pierre Gasly has revealed a special Senna tribute helmet that he'll be sporting for the Emilia Romagna Grand Prix.

Gasly spent time on his Friday morning track walk at Imola visiting the crash sites at Tamburello and Villeneuve corners where Senna and Ratzenberger lost their lives, before later in the day revealing the Senna tribute helmet on his social media accounts.

"Tribute to Ayrton this weekend," he wrote. "Remembering one of my idol[s] with this special helmet. Legends are never forgotten."

Gasly's tribute helmet features Senna's distinctive 'auriverde' Brazilian flag colour scheme, while the Honda legend adorning the visor will be evocative to many F1 fans, with Senna having been powered to all three of his world titles by the Japanese firm's engines.

Gasly's is not the first Senna tribute helmet to have been seen in F1, meanwhile, with Lewis Hamilton having sported several designs paying homage to the Brazilian over the years - including most recently at the 2019 Brazilian Grand Prix - while

Rubens Barrichello also incorporated his fellow countryman's colours into his helmet design at the 1995 and 2011 Brazilian races.

Lewis Hamilton was a nine-year-old karting driver when he learned his idol Ayrton Senna died after crashing into a concrete wall during the 1994 San Marino Grand

Prix. More than a quarter of a century later, Hamilton still has vivid memories of when his father broke the news as the pair repaired his kart.

"I remember I had to walk away from my dad, because my dad would never let me cry

in front of him," Hamilton said on Friday while preparing for his first Formula One race on the Imola track where Senna lost his life.

"I had to go to a different place and it was not so easy," Hamilton added, his voice quivering with emotion.

"But I remember trying to challenge that sadness into adrenaline and I think I won that weekend. But the following weeks were tough."

This weekend's Emilia Romagna GP marks the first F1 race at Imola since 2006, when Hamilton raced in GP2 at the circuit. He returns as F1's new holder of most grand prix wins, after eclipsing Michael Schumacher last weekend by winning a record 92nd race in Portugal.

"It's just something we'll always remember," said Hamilton, who was given one of Senna's race helmets by Senna's family at a Brazilian GP.

"I went around today and it was a really special lap just going around seeing this historic track, passing the hard reminder of where Ayrton crashed."

"It is very surreal still for me when I go to places, where you drive through the tunnel in Monaco or you drive at the British GP where you know that the greats in the past have raced at those places," the Mercedes driver added.

"That's heartwarming to know that I was able to be here and do what he was doing 26 years ago."

Panghal, Sanjeet strike gold

World silver-medallist Amit Panghal (52kg) and Sanjeet (91kg) struck gold in their first competition after a coronavirus-forced break, claiming the top honours at the Alexis Vastine International Boxing Tournament in Nantes, France.

Amit, also an Asian Games champion besides being Commonwealth Games silver-medallist, defeated American Rene Abraham 3-0 with a dominating performance on Friday night.

Sanjeet, a former India Open gold-medallist, too put up a clinical show to get past Frenchman Soheb Bouafra in his summit clash and secure a gold.

In the 75kg category, Asian silver-winner Ashish Kumar also claimed a gold after his opponent, American Joseph Gerome Hiks, gave him a walkover due to injury.

However, Asian silver-medallist Kavinder Singh Bisht (57kg) settled for a silver medal after going down to local favourite Samuel Kistohurry in a split 2-1 verdict.

India had earlier secured

three bronze medals through four-time Asian medallist Shiva Thapa (63kg), Sumit Sangwan (81kg) and Satish Kumar (+91kg). All three of them lost in the semifinal stage.

This was the first international competition that Indian boxers featured in since the Olympic qualifiers in Jordan in March.

In that event, nine Indians, five men and four women, qualified for the Tokyo Olympics, postponed to next year because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Indians' competition calendar as well as training schedule has been severely hampered by the shutdown that followed the spread of the pandemic which has caused a bar on sparring at the national camp in Patiala.

The camp resumed in August amid strict health safety protocols and was open to only the Olympic-bound and hopefuls.

The Indians are currently on a 52-day training trip to Europe during which they have been primarily based in Assisi, Italy.

The boxers and their support staff left for the trip on October 15.

Djokovic stunned

Novak Djokovic won just three games in a lackluster quarter-final performance at the Erste Bank Open, losing 6-2 6-1 to 42nd-ranked Lorenzo Sonego.

It was only Djokovic's third loss of the year, after being disqualified for hitting a line judge with a ball at the U.S. Open and losing the French Open final to Rafael Nadal.

"I came here with the intention to try to earn more points and secure the No. 1 in the end of the year. I have done that, so I move on," Djokovic said.

"I am happy, I am pleased, I am healthy, and hopefully I can have a strong finish (at the ATP finals) in London."

Djokovic lacked power in his groundstrokes and produced a string of mistakes from the start. He soon dropped 4-0 behind, winning just five points on Sonego's serve in the opening set.

Djokovic slightly improved in the second, but missed all six break points before conceding his service game for a fifth time when Sonego closed out the win with a passing shot.

"I have done what I needed to do and why I came here. I am completely fine with today's result and looking forward to the next chapter," Djokovic said.
