With reference to the subject matter of delay in filing Audited Financial Results for the quarter/year ended 31.3.2020, we had addressed a letter to you on 31.7.2020, a copy of which is enclosed as **Annexure A**. Being alive to our responsibility, but for permittable difficulties in the finalisation of the Accounts due to COVID-19 related issues we had addressed on the subject as per Annexure A.

The delay in compliance with SEBI extended date of July 31, 2020 under Regulation 33 of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure) Requirements, Regulations, 2015 was due to the following reasons:

- 1. There was a complete lockdown of all the Offices and Organizations in Tamil Nadu from 24.3.2020 to 10.5.2020. Hence, no activities were possible during the period.
- 2. Subsequently, our office was functioning with reduced staff members, adhering to the Standard Operating Procedures and guidelines issued by the respective Governments. The relevant notification of the Government is enclosed as **Annexure B**.
- 3. Due to number of positive cases among our office had to remain closed from 9.7.2020 to 22.7.2020. it may be kindly noted that the concerned officers themselves were affected and unable to function. Our notice of closure for the period 9.7.2020 to 22.7.2020 is enclosed as **Annexure C.**

- 4. The reported cases of COVID-19 positive in our office included our Chief Financial Officer, Sri S Seshadri, he was hospitalised for about 10 days and further quarantine for a fortnight apart from other staffs. This had totally crippled the finalisation of the Audit process. We enclose herewith as Annexure D, the records relating to the illness of Sri S Seshadri our Chief Financial Officer.
- 5. Sri N Krishnaraj, Company Secretary was also on isolation for possible COVID-19 health condition.
- 6. Our Auditors are M/s Deloitte Haskins & Sells LLP, Sri M N Balaji, Chartered Accountants is the Auditors who was attending to the scrutiny of our records for the purpose of certification, being based in Bangalore, he had no access to the Company Accounts and records maintained at the Registered Office in Coimbatore. This made communication difficult and time consuming to provide necessary clarifications. This made the audit process a tough task.

We respectively submit that the several factors were mentioned above and supported by the enclosure were beyond our control and whereof force majeure nature.

There were no way that it could be avoided or got over. The factors obviously even SEBI had recognized the difficulties and provided extension for compliance with Regulation 33. Such extension happened to be insufficient to our case because of the disability of the Principal Officers and closure of the office itself.

In this circumstances the delay of 11 days cannot be viewed as a serious breach for imposition of fine.

Accordingly, we request that the proposed fine kindly may be waived taking into consideration the facts that we have submitted with evidence.

NOTIFICATION

WHEREAS in the reference first read above, the Government have issued orders extending restrictions in the territorial jurisdictions of the State of Tamil Nadu upto 17.05.2020 to contain the further spread of COVID-19. Further in the reference second read above, amendment is also issued for the above orders.

NOW THEREFORE the Government based on the proposal of Principal Secretary/Commissioner of Revenue Administration issues following

amendment to the GO.Ms.No.217, Revenue and Disaster Management (DM-II) Department, dated 3.5.2020 read with G.O.Ms.No.219, Revenue and Disaster Management, dated. 04.05.2020, with effect from 11.05.2020.

- A) the following sub-clause shall be added under Clause VI
- x. **Petrol pumps** will function from **6:00 am to 6:00 pm**.
- xi. Private Offices (Standalone Air conditioners only permitted) including construction companies & real estate developers back office will function from 10:30 am to 6:00 pm with 33% staff. Not more than 5 employees permitted for Post production activities like Editing, Dubbing, DI, Re-Recording Sound Design/Mixing and VFX/CGI (10 to 15 persons only) for Television & film content from 10:30 am to 6:00 pm. Permission should be obtained from Commissioner, GCC/ District Collector for employees.
- B) the sub-clause v and viii under Clause VI shall be replaced as
- v. **Shops selling essential goods** including Tea Shops (Parcel only) will function from **6:00 am to 7:00 pm.** In the Tea Shops, the Social distancing norms to be followed strictly. The tea shop should be maintained clean and hygienic by disinfecting five times a day. No customers should be permitted to consume food items inside the tea shops. Any violation of these conditions, the tea shops will be sealed immediately.
- viii. All standalone and neighborhood shops (except barber shops, salons, spa & beauty parlours), shops selling construction hardware, cement, construction materials, sanitary ware, electrical materials and standalone shops selling and servicing mobile phones, computers, household appliances, motors, spectacles will function from 10:30 am to 6:00 pm

- C) the following sub-clause shall be added under Clause VII
- xx. **Shops selling essential goods** including Tea Shops (Parcel only) will function from **6:00 am to 7:00 pm.** In the Tea Shops, the Social distancing norms to be followed strictly. The tea shop should be maintained clean and hygienic by disinfecting five times a day. No customers should be permitted to consume food items inside the tea shops. Any violation of these conditions, the tea shops will be sealed immediately.
- xxi. **Petrol pumps** will function from **6:00 am to 8:00 pm**.
- xxii. Private Offices(Standalone Air conditioners only permitted) including construction companies & real estate developers back office will function from 10:00 am to 7:00 pm with 33% staff. Not more than 5 employees permitted for Post production activities like Editing, Dubbing, DI, Re-Recording Sound Design/Mixing and VFX/CGI (10 to 15 persons only) for Television & film content from 10:00 am to 7:00 pm. Permission should be obtained from concerned District Collectors for employees.

D) the sub-clause xiv, xv, xvi and xix under Clause VII shall be replaced as

- xiv. **Shops** selling construction hardware, cement, construction materials, sanitary ware and electrical items shall be permitted to function from **10:00 am to 7:00 pm** in both urban and rural areas. There shall be no restriction on transport of construction materials.
- xv. All standalone **shops** selling and servicing mobile phones, computers, household articles, motors, spectacles shall be permitted to function from **10:00** am **to 7:00** pm in both urban and rural areas.
- xvi. All standalone **shops** (except barber shops, salons, spa & beauty parlours) in Rural areas will be permitted to function from **10:00 am to 7:00 pm.**
- xix. District Collector may decide on opening of all other standalone shops (except Malls and Market Complexes) in Corporations and Municipal Limits based on the prevailing conditions from 10:00 am to 7:00 pm (barber shops, salons, spa & beauty parlours are not permitted)

- E) the following sub-clause shall be added under Clause IX
- xx. **Petrol pumps on National and State Highways** will function **24 Hours**.

WHEREAS in the reference first read above, the Government have issued orders extending restrictions in the territorial jurisdictions of the State of Tamil Nadu upto 17.05.2020 to contain the further spread of COVID-19. Further in the reference second and third read above, amendments were also issued for the above orders.

NOW THEREFORE the Government based on the note dated 13.05.2020 received from Additional Chief Secretary, Finance/ Chairman Expert Committee constituted to work out a phased exit strategy on Lockdown issues amendments to the GO.Ms.No.217, Revenue and Disaster Management (DM-II) Department, dated 3.5.2020 read with amendments issued thereon as detailed below:

- A) the sub-clause (i) under Clause VII shall be replaced as follows
- i. The functioning of all industrial units including textile units could be permitted in <u>urban areas</u> excluding Chennai City Police Commissionerate Jurisdiction with 50% of workers in shift by duly observing Standard Operating Procedures. All industrial activities shall be allowed in Village and Town Panchayat areas (including Textile industries)
- B) the sub-clause (ii) under Clause VII shall be omitted.
- C) at the end of sub-clause (iii) under Clause VII the following words shall be added:

Export oriented unit with 50% strength in all areas across the State excluding Chennai City Police Commissionerate Jurisdiction.

- D) the sub-clause (xix) under Clause IX (a) shall be replaced as follows:
- xix. The proportion of persons employed in MGNEREGS in rural areas shall be increased from 33% to 50%.

NOTIFICATION

WHEREAS based on the review meetings held on various dates, particularly views expressed by the District Collectors in the meeting held on 13.5.2020 through Video Conference, views expressed by the Medical Experts and Public Health Committee on 14.5.2020 and based on the decision taken in consultation with the Senior Ministers to contain the spread of Corona Virus, Government ordered to extend the State-wide lockdown from 00:00 hrs of 17.5.2020 till 24:00 hrs of 31.5.2020 under the Disaster Management Act, 2005 with various relaxations ordered in GO.Ms.No.217, Revenue and Disaster Management (DM-II) Department, dated 3.5.2020 and amendments issued thereon with the further guidelines and relaxations in the GO.Ms.No.244, Revenue and Disaster Management(DM-II) Department, dated 17.5.2020.

WHEREAS the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs in its order dated 17.5.2020 has issued orders extending the lockdown upto 31.5.2020 with detailed guidelines.

NOW THEREFORE, the State Government of Tamil Nadu in supersession of the orders issued in GO.Ms.No.244, Revenue & Disaster Management (DM-II) Department, dated 17.5.2020, issues the following orders:

The State-wide lockdown is extended from 00:00 hrs of 17.5.2020 till 24:00 hrs of 31.5.2020 under the Disaster Management Act, 2005 with various relaxations ordered in GO.Ms.No.217, Revenue and Disaster Management (DM-II) Department, dated 3.5.2020 and amendments issued thereon with State specific existing restrictions and new relaxations as detailed below:

- The following activities will continue to remain prohibited until further orders during the lockdown period.
 - i. All domestic and international air travel of passengers, except for domestic medical services, domestic air ambulance and for security purposes or purposes as permitted by MHA.
 - ii. Metro rail services.
 - iii. Schools, colleges, educational / training / coaching institutions etc. will remain closed. Online / distance learning shall continue to be permitted and shall be encouraged.
 - iv. Hotels, restaurants and other hospitality services, expect those meant for housing health / police / Government officials / healthcare workers / stranded persons including tourists and for quarantine facilities; and running of canteens at bus depots, railway stations and airports. Restaurants shall be permitted to operate kitchens for home delivery of food items.
 - All cinema halls, shopping malls, gymnasiums, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars and auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places. Sports complexes and stadia will be permitted to open; however, spectators will not be allowed.
 - vi. All social / political / sports / entertainment / academic / cultural / religious functions / Others gatherings and large congregations.
 - vii. All religious places / places of worship shall be closed for public. Religious congregations are strictly prohibited.
 - viii. Taxi, Auto and Cycle Rickshaws except for the permitted area and purpose.

- ix. Inter-State public transport.
- X. Malls, Barber shops in urban areas, Salons, Spa and Beauty Parlours.
- xi. Air-conditioned showrooms selling jewels, cloths and Air-conditioned departmental stores.

II. National Directives for COVID-19 Management specified below should be strictly followed throughout the State.

- i. Wearing of face cover is compulsory in all public and work places.
- ii. Spitting in public & work places shall be punishable with fine, as may be prescribed in accordance with its laws, rules or regulations by the State.
- iii. Social distancing shall be followed by all persons in public places and in transport.
- iv. Marriage related gathering shall ensure social distancing, and the maximum number of guests allowed shall not be more than 50.
- v. Funeral/ last rites related gathering shall ensure social distancing, and the maximum numbers allowed shall not be more than 20.
- vi. Consumption of liquor, paan, gutka, tobacco etc. in public places is not allowed.
- vii. Shops will ensure minimum six feet distance among customers and shall not allow more than 5 persons at the shop.

Additional Directives for work places

- viii. As far as possible, the practice of work from home should be followed.
- ix. Staggering of work/ business hours shall be followed in offices, work places, shops, markets and industrial & commercial establishments.
- x. Provision for thermal scanning, hand wash and sanitizer will be made at all entry and exit points and common areas.
- xi. Frequent sanitization of entire workplace, common facilities and all points which come into human contact e.g. door handles etc., shall be ensured, including between shifts.
- xii. All persons in charge of work places shall ensure social distancing through adequate distance between workers, adequate gaps between shifts, staggering the lunch breaks of staff, etc.

III. Use of Aarogya Setu

- i. Aarogya Setu enables early identification of potential risk of infection, and thus acts as a shield for individuals and the community.
- ii. With a view to ensuring safety in offices and work places, employers on best effort basis should ensure that Aarogya Setu is installed by all employees having compatible mobile phones.
- District authorities may advise individuals to install the Aarogya Setu application on compatible mobile phones and regularly update their health status on the app. This will facilitate timely provision of medical attention to those individuals who are at risk.

IV. Existing Restrictions:

- In the 12 districts viz Chennai, Kancheepuram, Tiruvallur, Chengalpattu, Villupuram, Cuddalore, Ranipet, Thirupathur, Kallakurichi, Tiruvarnamalai, Ariyalur and Perambalur, all the present restrictions will continue without any relaxations.
- > Tourists travel to Nilgiris District, Kodaikanal and Yercaud Tourist Places will be prohibited.
- No activity will be permitted in the Containment Zones across the State, during the lockdown period
- > The activities already allowed in areas falling under the jurisdiction of Greater Chennai Police will continue (Except in containment zones).
- > The activities already allowed in **all the areas across the State**, **except for areas under the jurisdiction of Greater Chennai Police** will continue (Except in containment zones).

V. New Relaxations:

Based on the recommendations of the Expert Committee to arrive at the exit strategy on lockdown the following relaxations are allowed:

- In respect of 25 districts viz., Coimbatore, Salem, Erode, Tiruppur, Namakkal, Karur, Tirunelveli, Thoothukudi, Tenkasi, Kanniyakumari, Theni, Madurai, Sivaganga, Virudhunagar, Ramanathapuram, Dindigul, Pudukottai, Tiruchirappalli, Thiruvarur, Thanjavur, Nagapattinam, Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Vellore and Nilgiris the following relaxations are allowed:
 - For Intra-district movement within concerned district without TN e-pass.

- People are requested to use transport facility within concerned district for essential services and for permitted works only.
- For the movement from one district to another district, the existing system of using TN e-pass will continue.
- Not more than 20 persons in a Government/Private Bus, which are specially permitted for Government Works and Private industries, Not more than 7 persons in a Van, Not more than 3 persons in a SUV like Innova, Not more than 2 persons in a small Car (excluding driver) will only be permitted.
- Rental vehicles and Taxies must be used only for essential services like Agriculture, Business, Medical and Office purposes in these 25 districts (Intra district movement only) without TN e-pass. General public should avoid unnecessary movement from home.
- > The proportion of persons employed in MGNREGS in rural areas will be increased from the present 50% to 100%.
- ➤ In relaxation to earlier orders, the permission to operate industries are relaxed further and permitted to operate with 100% of employees in the industries working with less than 100 persons and 50% of employees or a minimum of 100 persons in the industries working with more than 100 persons in all Corporations, Municipalities and Town Panchayats in all areas across the State, except for areas under the jurisdiction of Greater Chennai Police.
- > In rural areas (Village Panchayats), all industries are allowed to operate with 100% of employees except for the areas under the jurisdiction of Greater Chennai Police.
- > The private and business organisations which are temporarily closed due to lockdown are allowed to use minimum staff for essential maintenance.
- ➤ Works relating to 12th class (+2) examination valuations are exempted.
- > Training from independent coaches for the persons who prepare for National and International Sports events are exempted. However permission should be obtained from concerned District Collector/Commissioner, Greater Chennai Corporation in Chennai.
- > Taxi and auto rickshaws are permitted for urgent medical treatment with TN e-pass within the district, in respect of 12 districts where Intra district movements are otherwise not permitted.
- > Barber shops in Rural areas.

General

All District Collectors and Municipal Commissioners are instructed to ensure that the staff and workers are wearing the masks as advised by the Governments, follow social distancing, wash their hands by soaps two times a day and use sufficient disinfectants and strictly follow the Standard Operating Procedure issued by Government. As the Lockdown is continuing, assembling of more than five persons in public places shall not be allowed.

Positive Results mean?

Results obtained using our technique are usually very specific when the sample is collected as per protocol, on the right day and the tests performed as per the norms. Only when both E gene and RdRp gene are detected in the sample, the patient is declared as positive for COVID-19

Negative Results because of?

On the contrary, an egative result might not always mean the absence of the COVID - 19 infection for the following reasons:



b. When the sample has been collected too early, say within 1 - 3 days of suspected infection, at a point when the patient has not started shedding sufficient amounts of the virus. In this case, it may be necessary to repeat the test in 3 to 7 days.

a. When the same sample is tested again, a negative result may be due to poor sensitivity of alternate kit used by the second lab. h. When another sample is taken from the same patient on the same day and repeated, a negative result may be due to improper

c. If the second sample is taken after a few days, the viral load could have decreased and the result could turn out negative. The test may be repeated after 24 hours to confirm a true negative report.

When does a patient tested NEGATIVE, test POSITIVE with repeat sample

a. When the patient gets tested too early the first time (say within 2 days of infection), there is a chance of the test turning out false negative. On repeat, he may get positive findings.

b. If the sample was not stored properly before testing the first time, the virus could have deteriorated and thereby yielding a negative report. If it is suspected that the storage conditions were not ideal, it is advisable to repeat the test with a fresh sample.

When is a patient declared VIRUS FREE?

When a patient is tested positive for COVID - 19, he / she is quarantined and treated as per the ICMR and State Government guidelines. After the recommended quarantine period, 2 RT-PCR tests should be done at an interval of at least 24 hours before declaring the subject virus free.

Can an ASYMPTOMATIC PERSON test POSITIVE for COVID - 19?

Yes, ICMR reports that 70 to 80 % of the COVID patients may be asymptomatic. But they may cause the infection to be transmitted to other susceptible individuals. If the person infected is immunosuppressed / immunocompromised, or suffers from other comorbidities like Diabetes, Hypertension, Malignancy, Chronic Kidney Disease, Cardiac adments etc., they can develop symptoms
