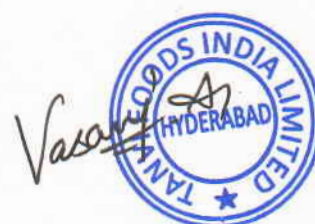

Notes to the Statement of Standalone Financial Results

1. The Financial results of the company have been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 as amended from time to time.
2. Total income for the Half year ended 31st March 2020 is Rs.4017.45 Lakhs, when compared to Rs. 3787.50 Lakhs for the corresponding Half year of the previous year. Total income for the Financial year ended 31st March 2020 is Rs. 8240.79 Lakhs, when compared to Rs. 7435.23 lakhs for the previous year.
3. The Profit before tax for the current half year is Rs.106.74 Lakhs when compared to Rs.57.90 Lakhs for the corresponding half year of the previous year. The Profit before Tax for the financial year ended 31st March 2020 is Rs. 213.53 Lakhs, when compared to Rs. 185.65 Lakhs for the previous year.
4. The Profit after tax for the current half year is Rs.86.83 Lakhs, when compared to Rs.68.74 Lakhs for the corresponding half year of the previous year. The Profit after Tax for the financial year ended 31st March 2020 is Rs. 168.96 Lakhs, when compared to Rs. 163.03 Lakhs for the previous year.
5. The above Financial Results and Statement of Assets and Liabilities were reviewed by the Audit Committee and then approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on July 30th, 2020. The Statement included the results for the Half year ended 31st March 2020 and 31st March 2019 being the balancing figure of the Audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published year to date figures upto the first half year of the respective financial years, which were subject to limited review.
6. The Earnings Per Share (EPS) has been computed in accordance with the Accounting Standard on Earnings Per Share (AS 20).
7. Depreciation on Tangible Assets is provided on Straight Line Method over useful lives of the assets. Depreciation for assets purchased / sold during the year / period is proportionately charged. The useful lives for the fixed assets are considered as specified in the Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.
8. The Standalone Financial results for the year ended 31st March, 2020 have been audited by the Statutory Auditors of the Company as per Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015. The Auditors have given an unqualified Report thereon.
9. The financial results for the Half year ended 31.03.2020 have been prepared following the same accounting policies as those followed for the Annual Financial Statement for the year ended 31st March, 2020 & 31st March, 2019.
10. The entire operations of the Company relate to only one segment. Hence segmental reporting as per AS 17 is not made.
11. Estimating uncertainty relating to Global Pandemic Covid 19 on operations;

The spread of Covid – 19 has severely impacted the businesses around the globe. In many countries, including India, there has been severe disruption to regular business operations due to lock downs, disruption in transportations, supply chain, travel ban, quarantines, social distancing and other emergency measures.

The company is able to continue its operations with lower work force and following all precautions and compliance of Covid – 19.



The management has considered the possible effects, if any, that may result from Covid-19 pandemic on amounts relating to Trade receivables and Inventories. In assessing the recoverability of receivables, the company has considered internal and external information upto date of approval of these financial results.

Consolidated Total income for the Financial year ended 31st March 2020 is Rs. 8452.72 Lakhs when compared to Rs. 7710.97 lakhs for the previous year.
3. The Consolidated Profit before tax for the current half year is Rs.70.16 Lakhs when compared to Rs. 37.88 Lakhs for the corresponding half year of the previous year. The Consolidated Profit before Tax for the financial year ended 31st March 2020 is Rs. 185.90 Lakhs when compared to Rs. 182.16 Lakhs for the previous year.
4. The Consolidated Profit after tax for the current half year is Rs. 54.41 Lakhs when compared to Rs. 44.12 Lakhs for the corresponding half year of the previous year. The Consolidated Profit after Tax for the financial year ended 31st March 2020 is Rs. 154.67 Lakhs when compared to Rs. 149.02 Lakhs for the previous year.
5. The above Consolidated Financial Results and Consolidated Statement of Assets and Liabilities were reviewed by the Audit Committee and then approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on July 30th, 2020. The Statement included the consolidated results for the Half year ended 31st March 2020 and 31st March 2019 being the balancing figure of the Audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published year to date figures upto the first half year of the respective financial years, which were subject to limited review by the respective auditors.

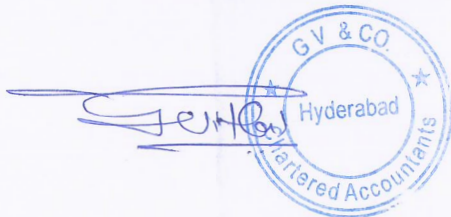
We have audited the accompanying Standalone Half Yearly Financial Results of **M/s Tanvi Foods (India) Limited** for the Half year ended **31st March 2020** and the Year to Date results for the period from **01st April 2019** to **31st March 2020**, attached herewith, being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us these standalone financial results:

Basis for Opinion :

For the other entities included in the consolidated Financial Results, which have been audited by other auditors, such other auditors remain responsible for the direction, supervision and performance of the audits carried out by them. We remain solely responsible for our audit opinion.

We communicate with those charged with governance of the Holding Company and such other entities included in the consolidated financial results of which we are the independent auditors regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit. We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

We also performed procedures in accordance with the circular issued by the SEBI under Regulation 33(8) of the Listing Regulations, as amended, to the extent applicable.


Other Matters

The Financial Results include the results for the Half Year ended 31st March 2020 being the balancing figure between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures up to the first Half Year of the current financial year which were subject to limited review by us.
