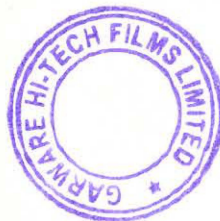

## New era of transparency for univs

Higher institutes will now have to disclose info about fees, teachers, etc, before admissions

Higher education institutes in the state, including private and deemed universities, will now have to publicly disclose information about their fees, teachers, available facilities and other such information on their website at least 60 days before their admissions. On Thursday, the state government issued the instructions for mandatory disclosure in line with the University Grants Commission (Students Grievance Redressal) Rules 2023, issued in April last year. The move is aimed at bringing transparency in the education system and is part of the 'light but tight' regula-

atory framework envisaged under the National Education Policy 2020. The institutes are required to provide a list of all courses along with the broad outlines of the syllabus, the number of seats approved for each of

the academic programmes, the admission process as well as each component of fees deposits and other charges. They must also display details of their teaching faculty including their educational qualification if they

are regular appointees or guest teachers. The information brochure also has to include physical and academic infrastructure and other facilities such as hostel accommodation. The instructions come

weeks after UGC pulled up universities across the country, including 17 from Maharashtra, for failing to appoint ombudspersons to address students' complaints. Most public universities in the state found a mention in the default list except the University of Mumbai (MU) and Savitribai Phule Pune University.

"I firmly believe that this move will bring about transparency. Colleges will be forced to give accurate and correct data in the public domain. The expectation would be that no fake or misleading data is given by the colleges," said Gopal Kalkoti, a former principal.

## DA case: UBT MLA's wife and son seek pre-arrest bail

The plea contends that the case has been registered against Rajan Salvi and his family purely out of political vendetta

After the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) booked Shiv Sena (Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray) legislator Rajan Salvi and his family in connection with alleged disproportionate assets, the legislator's wife and son have approached the Bombay High Court seeking pre-arrest bail. Salvi has been shown as the prime accused and his wife Anuja and son Shubham have been shown as abettors. The ACB officials alleged that Salvi and his family possessed assets worth Rs3.5 crore more than his known sources of income. Salvi is a three-time legislator representing Rajapur Assembly constituency from the

Uddhav Thackeray-led faction. Their plea contends that the case has been registered against Salvi and his family out of political vendetta in view of ensuing elections and sought to be protected from arrest. The probe agency raided Salvi's residence and he has also been questioned earlier by the ACB. On Thursday, the plea was listed for hearing before Justice Sarang Kotwal. Advocate Rahul Arote told the court that senior advocate Sudeep Pasbola would argue the mat-

ter and since he was not available, urged the court to keep the plea for hearing on February 12. Justice Kotwal asked Arote whether he wanted to argue on ad interim relief, he said that Pasbola would argue. Justice Kotwal recorded that "no ad interim relief" is granted as the same was not pressed for by the advocate for the accused. In a pre-arrest bail plea, an interim relief, in terms of no arrest or no coercive action, is sought for till the court decides on the plea.

## Zero tolerance in India towards racial discrimination: HC

The Bombay High Court has frowned upon a 44-year-old man for claiming that he illegally brought his minor daughter to India from the Netherlands as they both were facing "racial discrimination" there by the family members of his former wife, a Dutch national. The court directed the man to return the five-year-old to her mother.

The court said that India is known for its zero-tolerance policy towards racial discrimination, but the plea of racial discrimination adopted by the man was "completely hollow and a sham".

"India is undoubtedly known for its zero-tolerance policy towards racial discrimination. The Respondent No.2 (man), however, dared to take the shelter of the defence of racial discrimination; that too against the Petitioner, who once was his wife and spent considerable years with him," a division bench of Justices Ajey Gadkari and Shyam Chandak said on Wednesday.

"This way, Respondent No 2 has lowered the image of India and its citizens in the view of the petitioner and her fellow nationals. We record our displeasure for this conduct as according to us, it is unethical," the bench added.

The court was hearing a petition filed by the woman seeking custody of her five-year-old daughter alleging that her former husband violated an order passed by a court in the Netherlands, which had granted her child's custody.

In August 2023, he al-

legedly brought the child to India and refused to return the child. He later filed a petition in the family court in Mumbai seeking permanent custody of the child. He contended that he and his daughter were subjected to racial discrimination and hence the child has now developed a fear and was not willing to return to the Netherlands.

Refusing to believe his contention, the bench said that the claim of racial discrimination was a "sheer afterthought" adopted by the man only to defeat the orders passed by the Dutch court.

The bench directed the man to hand over custody of the child to her mother so that she could be taken back to Netherlands.

It noted that if the child was not returned to the Netherlands to her mother then there was a possibility of polluting the child's mind against her mother. Advocate Anagha Nimbalkar appeared for the Dutch woman.

"This is the doctrine of 'Parental Alienation Syndrome' that is the efforts made by one parent to get the child to give up his/ her positive perceptions of the other parent," the bench said. This puts the child in the middle of a loyalty contest and then makes the child to blame one parent. The woman said that the child had been living with her since birth and that she is a Dutch national by birth. It that the overriding consideration in such cases must be the interest and welfare of the child and while deciding this, the view of one parent alone cannot be taken into consideration.

## Jarange-Patil threatens to 'challenge' Mandal panel

Quota activist Manoj Jarange on Thursday said he will "challenge Mandal commission" if Maharashtra leader minister and OBC leader Chhagan Bhujbal created hurdles in the way of reservation for the Maratha community.

He also warned that if the government did not implement its assurance to give Kumbi caste certificates to "sage-soyare" or blood relatives of those who have already established themselves as belonging to the Kumbi community, he would launch a fresh hunger strike from February 10.

"Just like you have sons and daughters, we too have sons and daughters. We do

not want to challenge the Mandal commission. You live and let us live. But if you created hurdles in the path of our reservation, our patience will run out and we will have to challenge the Mandal commission," Jarange-Patil told reporters.

"State food and civil supplies minister and OBC leader Chhagan Bhujbal has created problems for the Maratha reservation thrice. He should stop it," Jarange-Patil said.

"The proposed hunger strike from February 10 is for the implementation of the 'sage-soyare' order. The demand of revocation of criminal cases filed against Maratha agitators has also not been fulfilled," the activist further said.
