

Ahmedabad witnessed over 75% uptick in office space absorption in Q2 2022

Ahmedabad, CBRE South Asia Pvt. Ltd., India's leading real estate consulting firm, today announced the findings of its latest office report, 'CBRE India Office Figures Q2 2022'. Ahmedabad observed leasing activity of about 0.3 million sq. ft. in Q2 2022. The report observed that the office sector in India witnessed a strong performance in Q2 2022, as leasing activity grew by 61% Q-o-Q to touch a record high of 18.2 million sq. ft. The engineering & manufacturing sector drove leasing in Ahmedabad with a share of about 67%, followed by BFSI (12%) and flexible spaces operators (11%). Small-sized deals dominated the transaction activity, with 97% of absorption recorded in non-IT spaces and 23% in IT. On the supply side, project completions were only in the non-IT segment. A few major leasing transactions in the city were recorded in Commerce House 6 and Stratum @Venus Grounds. Among the major cities, an on-again off-again absorption stood at +29.5 million sq. ft., recording a growth of 157% (Y-o-Y). In H1 2022, about 26.1 million sq. ft. of new completions were witnessed - increasing by 26% Y-o-Y. Bangalore, Delhi-NCR, and Hyderabad dominated absorption during the quarter, accounting for almost two-thirds of this transaction activity. (1-7)

Gujarat: Valsad, Navsari reel from monsoon fury

SURAT/AHMEDABAD: Over 700 people were shifted to safer places in Navsari and Valsad districts after continuous rain in south Gujarat led to water level in river swelling, inundating low-lying areas, on Sunday. Several low-lying areas of Valsad were flooded after the water level in Osang River sharply increased due to extremely heavy rain on Saturday night and Sunday morning. More than 400 people were evacuated in these areas. Rain water and that from the overflowing river gushed into several residential societies which were in knee-deep waters. Authorities in Navsari district were also on alert as the Kaveri and Ambika rivers started flowing above the danger mark. "We are shifting people from low-lying areas and over 300 have been evacuated to safer places. The operation is continuing with the help of a company of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF)," district collector Amit Prakash Yadav said. Chhota Udepur and Namada districts also recorded heavy rainfall, with rivers overflowing and low-lying areas getting flooded. The IMD Meteorological Department (INDM) has forecast heavy to very heavy rain with isolated extremely heavy showers during the next five days in Dang, Navsari and Valsad. Several other districts of south Gujarat and Saurashtra are also expected to receive heavy to very heavy rainfall during this period, the IMD bulletin said.

Surtis experience horror in city's waterlogged spots



SURAT: For any Surti, crossing through Kadarsa Ni Naal during the monsoon is a nightmare experience. The reason is the waterlogged roads and resulted in massive traffic jams. Two people died in rain-related incidents. Fire brigade pulled out a body floating in Aji River near Ramnathpara crematorium while another man died, reportedly due to hypothermia, in Ratanpar village near the city. At least 500 people were shifted to safer locations from Laludi Vokli and Manda Dunga. Four children had a providential escape when the wall of a house crumbled on a rickshaw in which they were playing. The Ghanchiwad area located on the river bank. While the kids escaped with minor injuries, the rickshaw and a car parked nearby were badly damaged. The roof of an old house crumbled on a rickshaw in Ramnathpara number 3, causing minor injuries to an old man. The traffic in the city went for a complete toss as thousands of vehicles were stranded at various places due to heavy waterlogging on the roads. Flooded underpasses. Vehicles were stranded for nearly five hours from 8am onwards on the four-km road from Saat Hanuman to Malvasan, which leads to Ahmedabad highway. As the work on an overbridge is on, the service road is used for commuting. But continuous downpours completely washed away the road and resulted in huge potholes too. Similarly, the road to Jaipur Malvasan from Malvasan too witnessed frustrating traffic snarls as it was badly damaged due to rain. A semblance of normalcy was restored after Rajkot Municipal Corporation (SMC) teams temporarily filled up the potholes.

Gujarat: Heroin worth Rs 376 crore seized at Mundra port

AHMEDABAD: The Gujarat anti-terrorist squad (ATS) on Monday evening seized 75.36 kg of heroin, valued at Rs 376 crore, from a container at Mundra port in Kutch district, an official said on Tuesday. The contraband, hidden inside fabric rolls to evade detection, had been sent from the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and was meant to be transported to Punjab, Gujarat DGP Ashish Bhatia said. If had Punjab police provided a tip-off to Gujarat ATS that a shipping container which had arrived at the Mundra port about two months ago may contain drugs and the cargo was to be delivered in Punjab, Bhatia said. Heroin worth Rs 376 crore, ATS team with a Punjab police sub-inspector, Kamalpreet Singh, reached Mundra and located the suspected container at a container freight station in the port. It had arrived at Mundra on May 13 from Ajman Free Zone in UAE, he said. The consignment was sent as textiles by a UAE-based company named Green Forest General Trading, said the officer. It was received by Jovial Container Lines, a West Bengal-based shipping agent, having an office at Gandhinagar in Kutch, he said. During close inspection of the 540 fabric rolls in the container, heroin powder was found inside 64 of them, he said. "Fabric was wrapped on long pipes made of cardboard. The drug smugglers had created a cavity by putting a plastic pipe of a larger diameter on these cardboard pipes. Heroin was filled in the cavity and sealed tightly with carbon tape so it would go undetected in an X-ray check," the official said. ATS recovered 75.36 kg of high-purity heroin, estimated to be worth Rs 376.5 crore in the international market, Bhatia said. The container was to be transported to Punjab, he said, adding that no arrest has been made yet. On why no action was taken against the Mundra port

Corporation's 'inheritance of delays' in solving plaintiffs runs into 208 years

AHMEDABAD: How many times has the civic body failed to meet its promise of solving public complaints within an assured time? You will be surprised to know that in the past six months alone, the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC) has accrued delays that run into 18.2 lakh hours or 208 years in solving civic issues. For the 20th year in a row, the AMC's accumulated delays since January have crossed 3.94 lakh hours or 45 years or half of a person's lifetime. Similarly, the AMC is running late by 44.4 years in addressing public complaints. The latest statistics are for 7.18 years in solving complaints made by citizens in Bodakdev. Breach of grievance redressal deadlines in Vejalpur has led to inherited delays reaching 12.6 years. But Jamalpur in the Ward No. 100 has the most neglected with the delays accumulating to 13 lakh hours, which is 148 years. A senior standing committee member explained, "The civic body has established service level agreement (SLA) for 202 different types of municipal complaints." The standing committee member added: "We have a Turn Around Time (TAT), which is a true indicator of efficiency, and it is affected each time an engineer or municipal employee struggles with a complaint, procrastinates or simply delays it." This standing committee member had received the SLA and TAT information from the control room for the Smart City. Since January this year, people across the city have lodged 2.9 lakh complaints with the AMC's comprehensive complaint redressal system (CCRS).
