Annexure A

I. Status of Material Litigations

In the ordinary course of business, there have been various regulatory, tax, civil and other proceedings filed, which are pending before various authorities, tribunals and courts and are at various stages of adjudication. The necessary disclosures have been made in the Prospectus dated September 27, 2023 filed by the Company with Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI). In accordance with the listing regulations, the brief details of the material litigations are mentioned below:

1	Supreme Court of India	Our subsidiary South West Port Limited (SWPL) have filed a special leave petition (SLP) before the Supreme Court of India against the order dated September 14, 2023, passed by High Court of Bombay at Goa, dismissing the writ petition filed by SWPL challenging the constitutional validity of the Goa Cess on Products and Substances Causing Pollution (Green Cess) Act, 2013 (“Green Cess Act”). In this connection, SWPL have received a notice dated 12.10.2023 under Section 29 of the Goa Value Added Tax Act, 2005 read with Section 4 of the Green Cess Act . The SLP is currently pending. 2	High Court of Bombay	Our wholly owned subsidiary JSW Jaigarh Port Limited (JSWJPL) was required to make appropriate levelling and filling of land, for the purpose of making its port which was to be done by shifting soil from one place to another place on the port. A notice dated September 17, 2014 was issued by the Collector, Ratnagiri to JSWJPL wherein it was alleged that JSWJPL was involved in excavation of minor minerals. JSWJPL has filed a writ petition before the High Court of Judicature at Bombay <i>inter alia</i> challenging the order passed by the Special Executive Officer (Appeals and Revisions), Department of Revenue, Maharashtra whereby the matter was remanded back to the Collector of Ratnagiri for fresh adjudication and the order of the Additional Divisional Commissioner, Konkan Division, to the extent confirming the imposition of royalty of a sum of ₹30.87 million, which has been already paid by JSWJPL. 5	High Court of Bombay at Goa	Sherwyn Filipe Francisco Correia & ors. have filed a public interest litigation against our Subsidiary, South West Port Limited, Town & Country Planning Department, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Mormugao Port Authority and other port operators <i>inter alia</i> seeking to obtain an order directing the closure of operations of coal/coke handling at Mormugao Port Authority (Port) on the grounds <i>inter alia</i> that of an alleged pollution caused by the import and handling of the coal cargo at the Port and has also prayed for a writ of mandamus for an order to cancel any permissions and clearances granted for coal/coke handling at the Mormugao Port. SWPL has filed its replies <i>inter alia</i> reiterating that the operations of SWPL at its berths do not cause any pollution and that it has deployed state-of-the-art and mechanised equipment for the purpose of its handling operations. 6	High Court of Madras	Ennore Port Limited (now known as Kamarajar Port Limited) (KPL) has filed an appeal before the division bench of the High Court of Madras praying to set aside the order of dismissal of the arbitration petition filed by KPL to the extent KPL had sought to set aside the directions (i), (iv) and (v) (mentioned below) passed by the arbitral tribunal in its Award, whereby the arbitral tribunal had <i>inter alia</i> partially allowed the claims of Ennore Coal Terminal Private Limited (ECTPL), our step down subsidiary and (i) restrained the KPL from demanding revenue share in consultancy income; (ii) rejected the Refund of speedy evacuation charges; (iii) restrained the KPL from demanding revenue share in windmill income; (iv) allowed the KPL to demand revenue share only to the extent of 40% of the tipper income; and (v) directed ECTPL and KPL to fix the lease rentals according to the directions contained in the award.
