BJP mocks Rajasthan govt's free 100 units power consumption announcement

JAIPUR, JUNE 1/--/ Ridiculing the Rajasthan government's decision to provide 100 units electricity free per month to every household, the opposition BJP on Thursday claimed Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot keeps on making such announcements without fulfilling them.

Earlier, only households consuming up to 100 units got electricity free.

Gehlot had on Wednesday announced waiving charges for the first 100 units of electricity for households irrespective of total consumption per

month. BJP MLA and party spokesperson Ramlal Sharma said all three DISCOMs in the state are under heavy debt and the Congress government's latest offer will only add to their woes.

"Will the chief minister clarify from where the government will repay the debt of the DISCOMs which is more than one lakh crore rupees?" he asked.

"If not today, tomorrow this debt is going to put a burden on the people of the state. Therefore, instead of making such

announcements, it will be better if the chief minister seriously thinks about how to take the state forward," Sharma added. Countering the charges, state Congress chief Govind Singh Dotasra said the move is aimed at providing relief to people from inflation. "The announcement will certainly provide relief to people who are reeling under high inflation due to the policies of the central government. The Rajasthan government, on the other hand, is working on giving relief to people and carry out development work," he said. (PTI)

Bhopal to have public holiday on June 1 from next year for city's 'gaurav diwas': MP CM

BHOPAL, JUNE 1/--/ Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Thursday said people of Bhopal would get a holiday on June 1 from next year as part of 'Bhopal Gaurav Diwas' celebrations. Bhopal was merged with the rest of India nearly two years after the country got Independence on June 1, 1949.

Addressing a function to mark the foundation day of the state capital, the CM also said a research centre focusing on the history of Bhopal will be established.

"From next year on the occasion of Bhopal Gaurav Diwas on June 1, Bhopal will witness a public holiday so that people can celebrate the day," said Chouhan, who hoisted the national flag at Bhopal Gate and felicitated 100 cleanliness workers with shawls. "Bhopal became an inseparable part of the rest of India because of the sacrifices of innumerable persons and the struggle of brave men two years after the country got Independence on June 1, 1949," the chief minister said.

Chouhan, who lit a torch in honour of those who laid down their lives for the merger, said the new generation was unaware that Bhopal did not merge with India on August 15, 1947 because the then nawab (ruler) refused to accept accession to India. A protest began from Boras near Udayapura in Raisen district along the banks of the Narmada against the nawab, which culminated in Bhopal state becoming part of India on June 1, 1949.

The CM paid rich tributes to Uddhav Das

Mehta, Balkrishna Gupta and former President of India Dr Shankar Dayal Sharma for their struggle and those who were martyred during the protests in Boras. "A research centre focused on Bhopal's history will also be established so that future generations know about the city's background," Chouhan added. Madhya Pradesh medical education minister Vishvas Sarang, Bhopal Mayor Malti Rai and former mayor Alok Sharma were present on the occasion. (PTI)

Gujarat: Dalit man thrashed for wearing good clothes, sunglasses; seven booked

PALANPUR, JUNE 1/--/ A Dalit man was allegedly beaten up by a group of persons from an upper caste community at a village in Banaskantha district of Gujarat as the accused were upset with him for wearing good clothes and sunglasses, police said on Thursday.

The incident occurred at Mota village in Palanpur taluka on Tuesday night, they said, adding that the victim and his mother, who was also attacked by them, were undergoing treatment at a hospital at present.

A First Information Report (FIR) was filed against seven persons on the basis of a complaint lodged by the victim, Jigar Shekhalia, who accused them of beating him and his mother as they were displeased with him for getting dressed up and wearing goggles.

The complaint said that when the victim was standing outside his house on Tuesday morning, one of the seven accused approached him. He abused the victim and threatened to kill him saying he was "flying too high these days".

The same night, when the complainant was standing outside a village temple six accused from the community with Rajput surname came towards him. Armed with sticks, they asked him why he was dressed up and wore sunglasses. They then thrashed and dragged him behind a dairy parlour.

When his mother rushed to save him, they assaulted her as well and threatened to kill her. They even tore her clothes, the police said citing the complaint. The FIR against the seven accused was registered at Gadh police station under Indian Penal Code (IPC) sections pertaining to rioting, unlawful assembly, outraging the modesty of a woman, voluntarily causing hurt, using abusive language, etc. They were also booked under relevant sections of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act. No arrest has been made in connection with the incident so far, the police official said. (PTI)

Seizure of meth in Himachal leaves law enforcers worried

SHIMLA, JUNE 1/--/ A recent seizure of methamphetamine in Solan district has triggered concerns that adulterated heroin 'chitta', this recreational drug too is making inroads into Himachal Pradesh.

Although the amount recovered is small, this is the first time that the drug has been seized in the state, police said. The seizure of meth is a serious issue as entry of high-end drugs in

Himachal implies that the availability of 'chitta' has turned the state into a drug consuming market, and now new drugs are being introduced," SP, Solan, Virender Sharma told PTI. Three people, including two from Kharar in Punjab, were arrested last week with 1.56 gm of methamphetamine or meth and 22 gm of chitta in Parwanoo last week. The trio had come to hand over the drugs in Parwanoo for

Rs 10,000, he added. Meth is considered more lethal than other drugs as on an average, 4.8 percent of its users required emergency medical attention after consumption, according to the Global Drug Survey. Meth, which gives an instant high, is used in rave parties and mixed with other drugs to make them more addictive. Recovery of meth is an indication that either rave parties are being organised or the drug is being used for adulteration. Whatever may be the case, the situation is serious, former Director of the State

Forensic Science Laboratory (SFSL) Arun Sharma said. Earlier, meth was mixed with chitta along with other synthetic drugs but now it is coming in crystal form which is more dangerous and there is a need to understand the dynamics and roots of drug trafficking through inter-agency coordination, said former convenor cum advisor of HP Nasha Nivaran Board O P Sharma. "Recovery of meth is a pointer that smugglers might be aiming at producing chitta locally," he said. (PTI)

India will not fence cheetah habitats: Govt panel chief

NEW DELHI, JUNE 1/--/ India does not want fenced habitats for cheetahs like the ones in South Africa and Namibia as it is against the basic tenets of wildlife conservation, the head of the Centre's high-level committee set up to monitor the cheetah reintroduction project said on Thursday.

Experts from South Africa and Namibia, who are helping reintroduce cheetahs in India, have recommended fencing their habitats to prevent poaching, habitat fragmentation and minimise human-animal conflict.

However, experts in India say fences can disrupt natural animal movements and impede genetic exchange between populations. "It's absolutely bogus to think of fencing the habitats. It goes against the basic tenets of wildlife conservation. What happened in a fenced park there (in Africa) will not happen here. Our understanding is that regional networks of protected areas should merge into a national network of protected areas so that there is porosity for wildlife gene flow," said Rajesh Gopal, chairman of the 11-member cheetah steering committee.

"We have our own socio-cultural issues. We have been handling tigers for the last 50 years and we know

that the human-wildlife interface is. We can handle cheetahs too," he said.

South African wildlife expert Vincent van der Merwe, who is closely involved with the project, had earlier told PTI: "There has never been a successful reintroduction (of cheetahs) into an unfenced reserve in recorded history. It has been attempted 15 times in Africa and it failed every time. "We are not advocating that India must fence all of its cheetah reserves, we are saying that just fence two or three and create source reserves to top up sink reserves." Source reserves are habitats that provide optimal conditions for reproduction of a particular species. These areas have abundant resources and favourable environmental conditions. They can support self-sustaining populations that produce a surplus of individuals, which can then disperse to other areas.

Sink reserves, on the other hand, are habitats that have limited resources or environmental conditions that are less favourable for the survival or reproduction of a species. Sink reserves rely on dispersing individuals from source reserves to maintain their population numbers.

Several experts, even the Supreme Court, have expressed concerns over the lack of space and logistical support in the Kuno National Park and have suggested shifting cheetahs to other sanctuaries. Officials said the Gandhi Sagar Sanctuary, Madhya Pradesh, is being prepared as an alternative habitat for cheetahs by November.

Union Environment Minister Bhupendra Patel Yadav on Monday said officers and employees involved in the conservation and management of cheetahs will be selected and sent on a study tour to Namibia and South Africa as part of the project. The central government will provide all necessary support, including financial resources, for the protection, conservation, promotion and a cheetah protection force, he said. According to cheetah steering committee chairman Gopal, seven more cheetahs, including two females, will be released into the wild by the third week of June. Prime Minister Narendra Modi released the first batch of eight spotted felines from Namibia into a quarantine enclosure at Kuno in Madhya Pradesh on September 17 last year.

In the second such translocation, 12 cheetahs were flown in from South Africa and released into Kuno on February 18. Three cheetahs died in March and April. Of the 17 remaining adult cheetahs, seven have already been released into the wild. A female Namibian cheetah gave birth to four cubs in March. Three of them have died due to heat exposure and dehydration. Experts involved in the project say the mortalities are within the normal range. To address the issue of cheetah-people interface, Gopal said a GIS-based landscape fragmentation analysis will be conducted to help the state authorities identify vulnerable areas. (PTI)
