Chinese Origin Singaporean Jailed And Fined For Assaulting Indian Woman

SINGAPORE : (AGENCY)

A Chinese-origin man was given three months in jail on Monday for having racially insulted and kicked a 57-year-old Indian-origin woman in the chest in May 2021. Wong Xing Fong, 32, had attacked Madam Hindocha Nita Vishnubhai near the Northvale condominium in Choa Chu Kang housing estate on May 7, 2021, amid the Covid-19 pandemic. Ordering Wong to pay the victim SGD13.20 as compensation, District Judge Shaifuddin Saruwan stressed that racial and religious hostility can have dire consequences in Singapore's society.

Before handing down the sentence on Monday, the judge said that a deterrent sentence is paramount in this case and noted that Wong committed the offences in a brazen manner and had displayed a lack of remorse. After a nine-day trial which started in January, Judge Shaifuddin convicted Wong in June of

one count each of assault and wounding the victim's racial feelings. During the trial, Wong denied using racial insults.

multi-racial Singapore. Nita testified on the first day of the trial that on May 7, 2021, she was brisk walking to Choa Chu Kang Stadium, where she worked at a fast-food restaurant when she heard someone shouting. She turned and saw Wong and his fiancée Chua Yun Han, whom she

did not know. The couple told her to "mask up", as her mask had been pulled down. Mask-wearing, due to COVID-19 spread, was then compulsory but people participating in sports including brisk walking were excused. Deputy Public Prosecutors Marcus Foo and Jonathan Lee said in

their submissions that Nita explained to the couple that she was brisk-walking, and gestured to show she was exercising and sweating. The prosecution said, "The accused instead scooped the complainant (and verbally insulted her). To de-escalate the matter, the complainant responded: 'God bless you.' "The accused, however, kicked the complainant in her chest area. He and (his fiancée) then jogged off," The Straits Times reported the judgement, citing hearings from court proceedings. Nita also testified in January that she would cry if she returned to the site of the attack. Her voice cracked at the time as she told the judge, "(The incident) affects me emotionally... I feel sad and scared. Is it wrong to be Indian? I didn't choose to be Indian... I wish this didn't happen. 'Till today, you (take) me to that road, I will cry.

World's Largest Ferris Wheel Mysteriously Stops Turning in Dubai

Two years ago, Dubai's skyscraper-studded skyline welcomed a Ferris wheel touted as the world's largest, but it mysteriously stopped turning just months after opening. The much-touted Ain Dubai (Dubai Eye) was designed as a tourist-luring landmark in the United Arab Emirates' glam-hub, which is home to the world's tallest building.

But now it stands idle for undisclosed reasons, its extravagant light fixtures the only parts seemingly still working. "Ain Dubai remains closed until further notice," says an official website for the attraction.

"We continue to rigorously work on completing the enhancement works that have been taking place over the past months." The wheel was supposed to close for just a month but its reopening has since been postponed indefinitely.

Imran Khan's Lawyers Launch Legal Challenge Against 3-Year Jail Sentence

ISLAMABAD : (AGENCY)

Former Pakistan prime minister Imran Khan's lawyers were on Monday attempting to launch legal challenges against his three-year-sentence for graft that has ruled him out of contesting national elections. The former international cricket star was arrested at his home on Saturday and taken to jail for charges he has previously said are politically motivated. His lawyers have so far been denied access to him at Attock Jail, established 100 years ago on the outskirts of historical Attock city, around 60 kilometres (40 miles) west of the capital, Islamabad.

On Monday, petitions were being filed in Islamabad and Lahore High Courts demanding power of attorney for the jailed former leader, which would allow lawyers to challenge his conviction.

A petition has also been filed to request that Khan be held in an 'A-class' cell, more comfortable than other quarters and usually reserved for VIP inmates.

At a court hearing Khan did not attend Saturday, a judge found him guilty of graft in relation to gifts he received while prime minister and sentenced him to

three years in jail. Anyone convicted of a criminal offence is disqualified from contesting elections in Pakistan, and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said Sunday that parliament would likely be dissolved on Wednesday -- days ahead of the end of its natural term.

This would give the incoming interim govern-



ment until mid-November to hold an election, but there is already speculation it could be delayed following the release Saturday of the country's latest census data. Law minister Azam Nazeer Tarar told a local television channel that constituencies would have to be redrawn according to the new census, warning there could be a delay to polls of up to two and a half months.

Khan's arrest and detention for three days in connection with the same case in May sparked deadly violence when his supporters took to the streets in the tens of thousands, clashing with police.

Rishi Sunak Unveils Social Media Partnership To Curb Illegal Immigration

Prime Minister Rishi Sunak has unveiled a voluntary partnership between social media companies and the UK government to accelerate action to tackle people smuggling content online, such as criminals sharing information about illegal English Channel crossings. In an announcement over the weekend Mr Sunak said the move would help meet his "stop the boats" target of clamping down on illegal migrants being charged large sums by human traffickers to make dangerous crossings across the high seas. The online content being targeted by the new partnership would cover discount offers for groups of people, free spaces for children, offers of false documents and false claims of safe passage - all of which the government says target vulnerable people for profit and put people's lives at risk through dangerous and illegal journeys.

"To stop the boats, we have to tackle the business model of vile people smugglers at source," said Mr Sunak in a statement released by 10 Downing Street. "That means clamping down on their attempts

to lure people into making these illegal crossings and profit from putting lives at



risk. This new commitment from tech firms will see us redouble our efforts to fight back against these criminals, working together to shut down their vile trade," he said.

Figures from the UK's National Crime Agency (NCA) claim that over 90 per cent of online content linked to people smuggling is taken down when social media companies are notified. The new partnership between tech firms and the UK government is aimed at driving forward efforts to further crackdown on the tactics being used by criminal gangs who abuse the internet to lure people into paying for crossings.

and with law enforcement. Alongside the partnership, the government will also set up a new centre led by the NCA and Home Office to increase the capacity and capability of law enforcement to identify this content on social media platforms.

Known as the "Online Capability Centre", backed by 11 million pound state funding, its work will focus on undermining and disrupting the business model of organised crime groups responsible for illegal crossings and using the internet to facilitate these journeys by intensifying efforts to combat their online activity.

The move comes as UK media reports indicate that the first set of migrants will begin being housed on a barge docked in Portland, south-west England. The 'Bibby Stockholm' large floating accommodation has remained empty as reported health and safety concerns of housing asylum seekers aboard were assessed. Now, reports indicate that the government believes the barge is ready to house migrants as part of efforts to cut down on soaring British taxpayer-funded hotel bills. Mr Sunak has made "stop the boats" one of his government's

services and charge people thousands of pounds to make the illegal journey into the UK in unsafe boats. "They must not succeed," said UK Home Secretary Suella Braverman. "This strengthened collaboration between the National Crime Agency, government and social media companies will ensure content promoting dangerous and illegal Channel crossings doesn't see the light of day," she said. Under the new initiative, social media companies will look to increase cooperation with the NCA to find and remove criminal content and step up the sharing of best practices both across the industry

Donald Trump Seeks Different Judge To Oversee Historic Criminal Trial

Trump's latest target: US District Court Judge Tanya Chutkan, appointee of Barack Obama who was randomly assigned to the case in Washington.

Former US president Donald Trump said Sunday he will petition to have a different judge oversee his historic criminal trial and for the case to be moved out of Washington.

The twice-impeached Republican, who is seeking a return to the White House in 2024, has unleashed a stream of invective against those prosecuting him or running the case in which he faces charges over attempts to overturn the 2020 election results and defraud the United States.

His latest target: US District Court Judge Tanya Chutkan, the appointee of Democratic former president Barack Obama who was randomly assigned to the case in Washington.

"There is no way I can get a fair trial with the judge 'assigned' to the ridiculous freedom of speech/fair elections case. Everybody



knows this, and so does she." Trump, using all capital letters, posted on his Truth Social platform. "We will be immediately asking for recusal of this judge on very powerful grounds, and likewise for venue change," out of Washington -- a majority Black city that leans heavily Democratic,

Trump continued. His lawyer John Lauro however denied later Sunday that any final decision had been made. Lauro confirmed that they would be seeking a change of venue, but only after "some polling" and "quantitative analysis in terms of how people are reacting to the indictment."

Chutkan, 61, is one of a dozen judges on the Washington federal district court bench. Her nomination to her post in 2014 was approved unanimously by the Senate. She has a legal history with Trump, having ruled against him in a November 2021 case in which she notably declared

old, who is now competing against his former boss for the Republican presidential nomination. Leading up to the January 6, 2021 joint session of Congress, Trump had called on Pence to use his position as presiding officer to block the certification of Joe Biden's election win. Pence ultimately refused to do so.

Lauro argued on Sunday that Trump's requests were not orders, and were therefore legal under free speech clauses of the Constitution. "Asking is aspirational. Asking is not action. It's core free speech," he told CNN.

The indictment last week revealed that Pence had taken "contemporaneous" notes of his meetings with Trump, which had been given to special prosecutor Jack Smith. Trump's trial date in the election case is expected to be announced on August 28 at a hearing before Chutkan.

2 Cops Among 4 Killed, 11 injured In Iran Building Collapse: Report

TEHRAN : (AGENCY)

Four Iranians including two police officers have been killed and at least 11 other people injured when several buildings collapsed in the capital Tehran, local media reported Monday. The policemen were securing the planned demolition on Sunday of "unauthorised buildings" in the city's southwest. ISNA news agency said that day, reporting at least three deaths in the incident. Tasnim news agency on Monday said "four people including two policemen and two civilians died following the collapse of unauthorised buildings in the southwest of Tehran." Rescue operations were underway to find others who may be trapped under the rubble, ISNA and Tasnim reported. According to ISNA, authorities had begun the demolition of one building when five others collapsed. The report quoted a police statement saying the buildings which collapsed did not comply "with construction safety measures".

Typhoon In Japan Forces Nagasaki Bombing Commemorations To Move Indoors

TOKYO : (AGENCY)

Typhoon Khanun was on course Monday to dump prolonged, heavy rain on one of Japan's main islands this week, forecasters said, forcing commemorations of the Nagasaki atomic bombing to be held inside. The typhoon last week reportedly killed at least two people, injured more than 100 and cut off power for several hundred thousand people in the southern Okinawa region before barreling towards Taiwan. The weather system has since swung back to the Okinawa area and was expected to rumble northwards to the west of Kyushu on Tuesday and Wednesday before veering towards South Korea, the Japan Meteorological Agency said in a televised press briefing.
