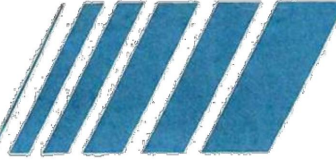

Min awarded one-year simple imprisonment



State MSME Minister Rakesh Sachan heads to surrender in the court of ACMM (III) on Monday

State MSME Minister Rakesh Sachan was awarded one-year simple imprisonment and a cash fine of Rs 1,500 by the court of ACMM (III) Alok Yadav here on Monday. At the same time the court also ordered to release him on personal bond of Rs 20,000 by accepting his bail application. Earlier, the minister had surrendered before the court which after closing its doors and completing the hearing of

the case has announced the judgement. Heavy police force remained deployed outside the court room during the proceedings. Earlier, around 12.30 pm, State MSME Minister Rakesh Sachan reached the collectorate and sat in the chamber of Kanpur Bar Association President Naresh Chandra Tripathi for about two-and-a-half hours. Meanwhile, counsel Ramendra Katiyar submitted application

in the court of ACMM (III) relating to a case of illicit arm pending against minister Rakesh Sachan urging to complete the hearing on Monday itself instead of August 10 fixed for it. When the court refused to hear the case in the absence of the accused on pretext of his ill health, Sachan had to surrender before the judge who after hearing the pleadings of the counsel announced the judgement.

CSAU&T V-C launches tree plantation drive

Vice-Chancellor of Chandra Shekhar Azad University of Agriculture and Technology (CSAU&T) Dr DR Singh while launching a comprehensive tree plantation drive on the campus on Monday said it was highly essential to plant more and more trees on account of dangerous increase in global warming and the present climate stood testimony to it. He said today millions have come to realise that if global warming continued at the current speed then there could be dangerous consequences not only for human beings but for animals, birds, marine animals and trees too.

He said it had been scientifically proved that today to counter the increasing heat on account of vehicular pollution and air conditioners the only way was to plant more and more trees so that they can clean the air and also reduce the harmful impacts. He said trees give off oxygen that one needed to breathe and also reduced the amount of storm water runoff which reduced erosion and pollution in the waterways and may reduce the effects of flooding. He said many species of wildlife depended on trees for habitat as it also provide food, protection and is home to many birds and mammals.

Addressing the drive Dr Satyendra Kumar Gupta of Indian Institute of Pulses

Research said afforestation was a well-known problem and many forests are being exploited for commercial gains. He said single wild forest provided its plants with different nutrients and stability to the soil to help the growth of other plants as it was also the key to the water cycle. He said people enjoy many benefits from trees as they provided fresh air, clean the air from harmful airborne particles and gaseous pollutants by absorbing them.

He said it was the duty of agriculture universities to promote awareness and said tree

provided oxygen and in one year two acres of mature trees can provide enough oxygen for 36 people. He said trees also saved water as they transpired they increased the atmospheric moisture. He said non-mature trees needed fewer gallons of water and they always gave back more than they took.

Dr Gupta said exposure to high levels of air pollution can cause a variety of adverse health outcomes and it increased risk of respiratory infections, heart disease and lung cancer. He said research showed that visiting a forest had real, quantifiable

health benefits, both mental and physical. He said even five minutes around trees or in green spaces may improve health. He said exposure to forests boosted immune system as when we breathe in fresh air, we breathe in phytoncides, airborne chemicals that plants give off to protect themselves from insects.

He said phytoncides had antibacterial and antifungal qualities which helped plants fight disease and when people breathed in these chemicals, bodies responded by increasing the number and activity of a

type of white blood cell called natural killer cells.

Soil scientist Dr Khalil Khan said spending time around trees and looking at them reduces stress, lowers blood pressure and improves mood. He said numerous studies showed that both exercising in forests and simply sitting looking at trees reduced blood pressure as well as stress-related hormones cortisol and adrenaline.

Dr Manoj Katiyar, Dr Arvind Kumar Srivastava, Dr Akhilesh Mishra and many others took part.

'Govt making every effort to strengthen digital agriculture'

Assistant Director, Agriculture, PK Agnihotri, while addressing a meeting at Vikas Bhawan on Monday said the UP government was making every effort to strengthen digital agriculture so as to ensure best profits of farming to farmers.

He said Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath had directed that database of farmers must be accomplished latest by August 15. He said digital technology included Internet, mobile technologies and devices, data analytics, artificial intelligence, digital-delivered services and apps which are changing agriculture and the food system.

He said digital technologies can also help governments improve the efficiency and effectiveness of exist-

ing policies and programmes and to design better ones. He said the freely available and high-quality satellite imagery dramatically reduced the cost of monitoring many agricultural activities. He said this can allow governments to move towards more targeted policies which pay farmers based on observed environmental outcomes.

He said in addition to monitoring compliance with environmental policies, digital technologies enabled the automation of administrative processes for agriculture and development of expanded government services, such as in relation to extension or advisory services.

Agnihotri said digital technologies can support trade in agriculture and food products by connecting private sector suppliers to new markets and enabling new ways for governments to

monitor and ensure compliance with standards and to provide faster and more efficient border procedures that were essential for perishable products. He said technological advances can support the goal of achieving more resilient, productive and sustainable agriculture and food systems which better met consumer needs.

He said current focus was how can government policies and programmes appropriately facilitate the adoption of digital technologies by agriculture and food sectors.

He said policymakers will need to consider potential benefits, costs and risks and to understand the factors affecting technology uptake so that interventions can be targeted to where there was a market failure or a public interest.

He said it also required

understanding how technology can help in different components of the policy cycle and may require government bodies to expand their skillsets, invest in technology and training or partner with others.

Dr Agnihotri said digital technologies can change the roles of government and on the one hand, digital technologies may create new roles or responsibilities for governments, including to enable the digital infrastructure but on the other hand, if technology can reduce information asymmetries and transaction costs, less government intervention may be needed.

The challenge before the UP government was as how to shape policy and regulatory settings so that they facilitate opportunities offered by digital technologies.

'BJP played vital role in enhancing Backward Class share in politics'

VARANASI (PNS): UP Minister of Jal Shakti and UP BJP chief Swatantra Dev Singh on Monday said that the BJP played a key role in enhancing the share of Backward Class in the active politics. Contrary to this, the Congress Party, Samajwadi Party (SP) and Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) used this class as a vote bank, he blamed.

While addressing the party workers on the second day of three-days training programme being organised by the Backward Class cell of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) at a hotel in Cantonment area here, Singh said that the BJP-led government at Centre and in the state as well were working to materialise the dream seen by party ideologue Pt Deen Dayal Upadhyay to ensure the upliftment of the last person of the society by providing the facilities of toilets, houses, power, drinking water and gas connection.

The working style plays a key role in chalking out any plan and the BJP is the strongest organisation in the world because of its working style, Singh said, adding that the success of any work depends upon four things- drafting out any plan, its implementation, monitoring and review. There should be team spirit while working in the organisation and there should be respect for each other, he said adding that there should be discussion before taking any decision. The important work of any organisation is to make a worker, he said further.

Later, the minister took part in a cleanliness drive in Bhairav Ward of City South assembly constituency of the district and claimed that it was the result of the cleanliness drive launched by the state government under the leadership of Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath with the inspiration of the Prime Minister Narendra Modi that the infection disease Japanese Encephalitis was effectively controlled in this eastern belt of the state and added that the infection from corona virus was also controlled effectively because of the cleanliness drive.

Locked house burgled

A locked house was burgled in Panki police station area early on Monday morning. Miscreants stole cash and jewellery worth around Rs 5 lakh from there. The incident took place when the family members had gone to Bithoor for bathing in the Ganga on the occasion of last Monday of Shrawan. On return the victim found the locks of his house broken and household goods ransacked. He lodged a complaint with the police which have started investigation with the help of CCTV cameras installed in the locality. Sidharth Yadav, a bank mitra in Bank of Baroda, lives near Mirzapur canal in Panki police station area. Early on Monday morning when he had gone to Bithoor with wife Kamla Devi for bathing in the Ganga miscreants broke into his house and committed the theft. On return around 10 am he found the magnet bolt of main gate broken. On entering the house he found locks of almirah and box also broken. Sidharth said he had proceeded from house with wife around 4 am. SHO Anjan Kumar Singh said after lodging an

FIR, CCTV footages of cameras installed in the nearby houses are being examined.

LOOT CASE WORKED OUT: The Bithoor police worked out a loot case and arrested two persons with the bike used for committing the crime. Raids were on to nab their third accomplice. Milkman Saurabh Mishra of Paigupur, Bithoor, was robbed of Rs 20,000, mobile phone and documents by three bike-borne miscreants on Ganga Barrage road under Nawabganj police station area late on August 1 night.

These robbers had also looted another milkman Wasi of Gabraha village, Chaubepur, near Pratappur Hari village. Bithoor police arrested two robbers involved in both the loots with their bike used in the crime while the third accomplice was still absconding. The accused were reported to be relatives of a public representative. After committing the crime when all the robbers were eating Maggi at the Ganga Barrage on August 5 suddenly heated argument took place which soon turned into a scuffle.
