Report on the Audit of the Annual Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying annual financial results of **Dwarikesh Sugar Industries Limited** (the "Company") for the year ended March 31, 2024 ("the Statement") attached herewith, being prepared and submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 and 52 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid Statement:

(i) is presented in accordance with the requirements of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and (ii) gives a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable Indian Accounting Standards ("IND AS") prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"), read with relevant rules issued thereunder, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit after tax and total comprehensive income and financial information of the company for the year ended March 31, 2024.

Basis for Opinion
