# India, Argentina reaffirm commitment to deepen and diversify bilateral cooperation

**BUENOS AIRES, AUG 27 /--/** India and Argentina have reaffirmed their commitment to further deepening and diversifying their bilateral cooperation, expanding it in new domains by broadening their strategic partnership to address global challenges like terrorism and climate change.

In a joint statement following the Joint Commission Meeting between External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and Minister of Foreign Affairs International Trade and Worship Santiago Cafiero here on Friday, the two countries reviewed their ongoing cooperation in the strategic sectors of defence, nuclear energy and space and reiterated their commitment to work together for mutual benefit. The two leaders expressed satisfaction at the close cooperation between the two countries at the multilateral fora. "Both ministers agreed to closely cooperate in the United Nations and other multilateral organisations to address global challenges of terrorism, security, international and regional peace, climate change, biodiversity loss, equitable trade and sustainable development," the statement said at the conclusion of Jaishankar's maiden visit to Argentina. In a post-pandemic world, facing global geopolitical challenges, India and Argentina reaffirmed their commitment to further deepening and diversifying their cooperation, expanding it in new domains to meet emerging challenges through broadening and deepening their partnership, it said. Concurring that terrorism and extremism continue to pose a threat to regional and global peace, stability as well as the economic prosperity of societies and peaceful way of life, both countries renewed their resolve to fight against this grave challenge to



humanity, it said. The ministers called upon all countries to work towards rooting out terrorist safe havens and infrastructure, disrupting terrorist networks and financing channels and halting cross-border terrorism. "Terrorism in all its forms and manifestations, including cross-border terrorism, is completely unacceptable to the international community and must be combatted resolutely," they said. It was also agreed to enhance cooperation in the defence sector within the framework of the MOU on Defence Cooperation signed in 2019. Jaishankar, acknowledging Argentine interest in the Made in India TEJAS fighter aircraft for Argentine Air Force, highlighted the importance of the proposal in enhancing the strategic quotient of the bilateral relationship. "Both sides agreed to promote the exchange of visits between armed forces, defence training and collaboration for joint production of defence-related equipment," the statement said. It was agreed to explore areas for deeper cooperation for peaceful uses of nuclear energy under the Agreement signed between the Department of Atomic

Energy (DAE) of India and the National Atomic Energy Commission (CNEA) in 2010 as well as the MOU signed between the Global Centre for Nuclear Energy Partnership, under DAE, and CNEA in 2019. The two ministers also recalled close coordination and support extended to each other in the fight against the COVID pandemic, which yielded remarkable outcomes, both sides resolved to continue working together to fight the menace. India expressed interest in partnering with Argentina for the development of infrastructural projects of transmission lines, roads and highways, railways and in renewable energy including solar, wind, small hydel or biogas. India also offered the expertise of its public and private sector companies, which could also bring attractive financing options, subject to domestic regulations in Argentina. Noting the growing acceptance and popularity of Ayurveda and its potential to bring immense preventive health and commercial benefits, India requested for recognition of Ayurveda as a primary healthcare system in Argentina. Considering the increasing risks derived from climate

change and environmental degradation, and the growing number of vulnerable communities affected, both ministers noted their cooperation under the ambit of the Coalition of Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI) partnership that aims to promote the resilience of infrastructure systems to climate and disaster risks, thereby ensuring sustainable development.

Both sides appreciated the need for closer cooperation in conventional and renewable energy sectors. As Argentina has huge deposits of conventional as well as shale oil and gas, both sides agreed to expedite the conclusion of Indian investments in specific projects in this area, in accordance with the provisions of the relevant legislation in Argentina. With an intent to promote easy and swifter movement of professionals and businessmen to each other's country, the two sides agreed to expedite the finalisation of the social security agreement. Both sides expressed satisfaction at the continued healthy pace of growth in the bilateral trade, which despite the global disruption and challenges owing to the pandemic, reached an unprecedented level of USD 5.7 billion in 2021 making India the 4th largest trading partner of Argentina. To achieve balanced growth of trade, both sides agreed to diversify the trade basket and accelerate market access negotiations. Both ministers agreed to encourage their respective private sectors to further explore investments in each other's countries by providing an enabling climate, identifying and promoting specific investment opportunities and agreed to continue discussions between the two countries. # Staple foods unaffordable, severe malnutrition among highest in region: UNICEF on Lanka's economic crisis

**NEW YORK, AUG 27 /--/** As Sri Lanka continues to suffer its worst financial slump, staple foods have become unaffordable, severe malnutrition is among the highest in the region and it is the poorest, most vulnerable girls and boys who are paying the steepest price, UNICEF has warned. UNICEF Regional Director for South Asia, George Laryea-Adjei said nascent food insecurity has compounded the social issues already plaguing the island nation. Families are skipping regular meals as staple foods become unaffordable. Children are going to bed hungry, unsure of where their next meal will come from, he said in a statement on Friday. Noting that more steps should be taken to help Sri Lankan children affected by the economic crisis, Laryea-Adjei said: children need to be placed squarely at the heart of the solution as the

country works to resolve the crisis. Mass food insecurity will only further promote malnutrition, poverty, disease and death in the region, he said, adding that severe malnutrition in crisis-wracked Sri Lanka was already among the highest in the region. As the economic crisis continues to rattle Sri Lanka, it is the poorest, most vulnerable girls and boys who are paying the steepest price," UNICEF tweeted on Friday. The UN estimates that half of the children in Sri Lanka already require some form of emergency assistance. Education, one sector slammed by the economic crisis, has seen decreased student enrollment and a deficit in resources, in addition to commutes made dangerous by outdated infrastructure. Reports are already emerging of an increase in abuse, exploitation and violence against children

due to the mounting economic pressure, Laryea-Adjei said. Similarly, in Sri Lanka, there are already over 10,000 children in institutional care, mainly as a result of poverty. The current economic crisis has revealed the vulnerability at the heart of Sri Lankan social infrastructure, he noted. Continuity of learning must be ensured for girls and boys of all ages, so they can prepare for their future and are shielded from the threats of child labour, exploitation and gender-based violence. Central and primary health services must be prioritized, to protect women and children against life-threatening diseases and malnutrition, he said. If actions are not immediately taken to protect children against the worst effects of the global economic downturn, vulnerable children will be plunged further into poverty - and

their health, nutrition, learning and safety compromised. UNICEF said that Sri Lanka's emergency is a warning to other South Asian countries of the risk of not preparing for economic hardship. We cannot let children pay the price for crises not of their making. We must act today to secure their futures tomorrow, Laryea-Adjei said. Sri Lanka, a country of 22 million people, is under the grip of unprecedented economic turmoil, the worst in seven decades. The crisis has left millions struggling to buy food, medicine, fuel and other essentials. The country, with an acute foreign currency crisis that resulted in foreign debt default, had announced in April that it is suspending nearly USD 7 billion foreign debt repayment due for this year out of about USD 25 billion due through 2026. # Flood-ravaged Pak to deploy Army to assist in rescue and relief work

**ISLAMABAD, AUG 27 /--/** The Pakistan government has decided to call in the Army to help in the rescue and relief operations after many parts of the country were ravaged by the worst floods in more than a decade that has affected more than 33 million people, Interior Minister Rana Sanaullah said on Saturday. So far 982 people have been killed due to floods across Pakistan. As many as 45 persons died in the last 24 hours, according to the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA). Another 1,456 persons were hurt, with 113 injuries reported in the last 24 hours, it said. Interior Minister Rana Sanaullah said the armed forces were being deployed in the wake of the biggest floods in more than a decade. He said the troops have been called in under Article 245 of the Constitution which empowers the government to summon the Army in aid of the civilian administration to deal with an emergency. A formal notification issued on Friday read that the exact number of troops and area of deployment would be worked out by respective provincial governments in consultation with the military operations directorate and General Headquarters. The date of

de-requisitioning of said deployment will be decided subsequently after mutual consultation among all stakeholders, according to the notification. The calamity has badly hit the infrastructure of the country with the NDMA reporting that more than 3,161 kilometres of road were damaged and 149 bridges swept away, while 682,139 houses were totally or partially damaged in the floods. Floods triggered by unprecedented monsoon rains have submerged more than half of the country, leaving more than 5.7 million without shelter and food in 110 districts. Sindh and Balochistan provinces have been worst hit by the disaster and Pakistan Railway has suspended its operation at several places in the two provinces while Pakistan International Airlines also halted on Friday its flights to Quetta, the capital of Balochistan province, due to bad weather. According to Minister for Environment Sherry Rehman, the country normally witnesses about three to four spells of torrential rains every year. However, Pakistan has this year so far been hit by eight

monsoon spells and more downpour is expected. The NDMA data shows that during the last 30 years the average rainfall in the monsoon season was 132.3 mm while so far 385.4 mm of rains have been recorded since June 14 -- about 192 per cent more than the previous three decades. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in a meeting with a select group of Islamabad-based Ambassadors, High Commissioners, and other senior members of the diplomatic corps ambassador on Friday briefed on the flood situation in the country. He said that as per the initial damage assessment, the losses caused by the floods were comparable to those Pakistan suffered during the flash floods of 2010-11. The meeting was attended by Ambassadors and High Commissioners of Australia, Canada, China, Japan, Kuwait, UAE, Turkiye, South Korea, the US, Germany, and senior diplomats of Bahrain, the European Union, France, Oman, Qatar, the UK, and Saudi Arabia. The Country Representative of the World Food Programme (WFP) was also present at the meeting, according to the Foreign Office. The Prime Minister said that more than 33 million people had been badly affected by the flash

floods and torrential rainfalls. He said that Pakistan's carbon emission footprint was negligible but it was ranked at the 8th position among the countries exposed to the horrors of climate change. Noting that climate change has made flooding worse, the Prime Minister emphasised rehabilitation and reconstruction of climate resilient infrastructure in Pakistan. Sharif said that given the urgency of the challenge, the government had decided to reach out to friendly countries, donors, and international financial institutions for their continued cooperation at this difficult hour. He said that the Foreign Office and the NDMA were closely coordinating with the United Nations Resident Coordinator in Islamabad to launch a UN Flash Appeal on August 30. (PTI)

# Russia blocks final document at nuclear treaty conference

**UNITED NATIONS, AUG 27 /--/** Russia late Friday blocked agreement on the final document of a four-week review of the U.N. treaty considered the cornerstone of nuclear disarmament which criticised its military takeover of Europe's largest nuclear plant soon after Russian troops invaded Ukraine, an act that has raised fears of a nuclear disaster. Igor Vishnevsky, deputy director of the Russian Foreign Ministry's Non-Proliferation and Arms Control Department, told the delayed final meeting of the conference reviewing the 50-year-old Nuclear Nonproliferation Treaty that unfortunately there is no consensus on this document. He insisted that many countries, not just Russia didn't agree with a whole host

of issues in the 307-page the last draft. The final document needed the approval of all countries at the conference that are parties to the treaty aimed at curbing the spread of nuclear weapons and ultimately achieving a world without them. Argentine Ambassador Gustavo Zlauvinen, president of the conference, said the final draft represented his best efforts to address divergent views and the expectations of the parties for a progressive outcome at a moment in history when our world is increasingly wracked by conflicts, and, most alarmingly, the ever-growing prospect of the unthinkable nuclear war. But after Vishnevsky spoke, Zlauvinen told delegates, I see that at this point, the conference is not in a

position to achieve agreement on its substantive work. The NPT review conference is supposed to be held every five years but was delayed because of the Covid-19 pandemic. This marked the second failure of its 191 state parties to produce an outcome document. The last review conference in 2015 ended without an agreement because of serious differences over establishing a Middle East zone free of weapons of mass destruction. Those differences haven't gone away but are being discussed, and the draft outcome documents obtained by The Associated Press would have reaffirmed the importance of establishing a nuclear-free Mideast zone. So, this was not

viewed as a major stumbling block this year. The issue that changed the dynamics of the conference was Russia's invasion of Ukraine on Feb. 24, which brought Russian President Vladimir Putin's warning that Russia is a potential nuclear power and that any attempt to interfere would lead to consequences you have never seen.
