A recent incident in Ananta pur highlighted the dangers of unnoticed krait snake bites and the critical role of timely medical intervention. Un like typical snake bites that exhibit fang marks, swelling, and pain, krait bites often go undetected due to the absence of these immediate signs. Instead, they will show delayed symptoms like vomiting, abdominal pain and throat pain, which can escalate to neurological weakness and respiratory failure if left untreated.

Dr A Mahesh, paediatric specialist at KIMS Saveera Hospital, recounted the case of a 12-year-old boy, who was brought to the hospital in severe respiratory distress with an oxygen saturation level of only 66%. Initial chest X-rays showed pneumonialike symptoms, but the boy
