India carries out military drill with US off Andaman sea

New Delhi, July 21: In the midst of India's border row with China, a fleet of Indian naval warships on Monday carried out a military drill with a US navy carrier strike group led by nuclear-powered aircraft carrier USS Nimitz, off the coast of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, officials said.

Four frontline warships of the Indian Navy participated in the "PASSEX" exercise when the US carrier strike group was transiting through the Indian Ocean Region on its way from the South China Sea, the officials said.

The USS Nimitz is the world's largest warship and the exercise between the two navies assumed significance as it took place in the midst of China's renewed military assertiveness in eastern Ladakh as well as in South China Sea.

The US Navy carrier strike group comprises USS Nimitz, Ticonderoga-class guided missile cruiser USS Princeton and Arleigh Burke-class guided missile destroyers USS Sterrett and USS Ralph Johnson, the officials said.

India carried out similar exercises with the Japanese navy last month.

The Indian Navy has increased its surveillance missions and beefed up operational deployment in the Indian Ocean region in the wake of the country's bitter border standoff with China in eastern Ladakh.

The Indian Navy is also ramping up its operational cooperation with various friendly naval forces like the US Navy and Japan Maritime Self Defense Force in view of the fast evolving regional security landscape, the officials said.

Navies from the US, India, Australia, Japan and France have been deepening their mutual cooperation in the Indo-Pacific region in view of China's growing attempt to expand military influence in the resource rich region.

Following escalation in tension between India and China in eastern Ladakh, the government put all the three forces on high alert.

The Indian Navy was asked to raise its alert-level in the Indian Ocean Region where Chinese Navy has been making regular forays. While operating together, the US and Indian naval forces conducted high-end exercises designed to maximize training and interoperability, including air defense, the US 7th Fleet said in a statement.

It said Nimitz carrier strike group's operations are designed to provide

security throughout the region while building partnerships with friends and allies.

"It was a privilege to operate with the Indian Navy," Rear Adm. Jim Kirk, commander, Nimitz carrier strike group, was quoted as saying by the 7th Fleet.

It said such Naval engagements improve the cooperation of the US and Indian maritime forces and contribute to ability of both sides to counter threats at sea, from piracy to violent extremism.

"These engagements also present opportunities to build upon the pre-existing strong relationship between the United States and India and allow both countries to learn from each other," it added.

The 7th Fleet is the largest of the forward-deployed US fleets.

Virus spreads to 2nd city

China's latest coronavirus outbreak has spread to a second city in the northwestern region of Xinjiang. One of the 17 new cases reported on Monday was in the ancient Silk Road city of Kashgar, the regional government said on its official microblog. The remainder were in the regional capital of Urumqi, where all other cases have been reported since the outbreak that has now infected at least 47 people emerged earlier this month.

Authorities in Urumqi have tried to prevent the spread by closing off communities and imposing travel restrictions. Xinjiang is a vast, thinly populated region of mountains and deserts and had seen little impact from the pandemic that emerged from the central Chinese city of Wuhan late last year and was largely contained within China in March. Another five new cases reported Monday by the National Health Commission were imported.

Union Ministers to address SRM-FICCI Industry-Academia conference

Kattankulathur, July 21: Union Railway Minister Piyush Goyal will inaugurate Industry-Academia Global Virtual Conference on "Emerging Economic Scenario - Identify and Create Competencies, on 23 July from 10 am to 2 pm.

The event is organised by SRM Institute of Science & Technology (SRMIST) and Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FICCI).

The second session - Collaborative framework for new-age learning - is likely have a keynote address by Minister for Human Resource Development, Ramesh Pokhriyal.

EU nations clinch virus aid deal

Brussels, July 21: Weary European Union leaders finally clinched an unprecedented 1.82 trillion euro (USD 2.1 trillion) budget and coronavirus recovery fund early Tuesday, somehow finding unity after four days and as many nights of fighting and wrangling over money and power in one of their longest summits ever. To confront the biggest recession in its history, officials said the EU had a consensus on a 750 billion euro coronavirus fund to be sent as loans and grants to the countries hit hardest by the virus.

That comes on top of the seven-year 1 trillion euro EU budget. At first the grants were to total 500 billion euros, but the figure was lowered to 390 billion euros.

Pilot camp MLA to work for leadership change

New Delhi, July 21: An MLA from Sachin Pilot's camp on Monday said the legislators supporting the former Rajasthan deputy chief minister will not join the BJP and their fight was to "save the party" by effecting a leadership change in the Rajasthan government.

Mukesh Bhakar, MLA from Ladnun, Nagaur, who was dropped as the state youth Congress chief last week, also appealed to the party high command that in order to save the Congress, they must act now and change the state leadership.

Asked if they could join hands with the BJP, he categorically denied any such plans and said, "We have not met any person from the BJP and neither anyone has contacted us." "We have said this earlier and our leader Sachin Pilot had also made it clear that we will not join the BJP and our fight is for a leadership change in our state," he said. These things are being said to tarnish the image of Pilot and his supporters, he said.

Trump team puts together 'war plan' to 'take down' China

Washington, July 21: The Trump administration has put together a "war plan" to first "confront" and then "take down" the Chinese Communist Party, said Former White House Chief Strategist Steve Bannon.

This "war plan" against China includes supporting allies in India on the borders of Chinese-occupied Tibet, Bannon said on Monday.

You're seeing an integrated war plan put together to confront first and then take down the Chinese Communist Party,

to call their bluff, he told Fox News in an interview.

Bannon said the president's "kind of war council" has laid out the "four horsemen of the apocalypse" -- the national security adviser, head of the FBI, the secretary of state, and then Attorney General Barr -- against the Chinese Communist Party.

The US National Security Advisor Robert O'Brien, FBI Director Christopher Wray and Attorney General William Barr have delivered

three major speeches in the last three weeks. Secretary of State Mike Pompeo is slated to deliver a speech on China later this week.

Those four individuals laid out an integrated and coherent war plan to confront the Chinese Communist Party on technological and information war and economic war, and then, with our allies, start to open up the South China Sea, and support our allies in India on the border of Chinese-occupied Tibet, he said.

President Donald Trump, he said, has a "coherent plan" against the Chinese Communist Party.

I would like the secretary of Treasury to join in there, and Treasury to start to drop the hammer. But you have seen a coherent war plan. I think you have just got to get that same level of coherence on the Chinese virus that's here, the CCP virus that has come to the United States, he asserted.

COVID handling hurts Trump's prospects; Biden benefits

Washington, July 21: US President Donald Trump faces an uphill task in his reelection bid in November with his approval rating hitting a record low and Democratic nominee Joe Biden taking a double-digit lead in key indicators, according to a survey conducted by the Washington Post and ABC News.

The opinion poll, conducted July 12 to 15, shows how the coronavirus outbreak has adversely affected Trump's prospects.

Now, the president's hopes of winning are pinned on his enthusiastic core base of supporters and showing the electorate that the pandemic is being dealt with

effectively. The Washington Post said in its report on the ABC News-Post poll.

Among registered voters, Biden, 77, leads Trump, 74, 55 per cent to 40 per cent. In the same category, Biden led Trump by just two points in March and by 10 points in May.

The survey found that traditional Republican and Democratic voters are treating the November polls as a referendum on Trump and not on whether Biden is a more suitable candidate, the report said.

Seventy-two per cent of Trump voters say reelecting the president is important, while 62 per cent of Biden voters say defeating Trump is the goal. The Washington Post-ABC News poll was conducted by phone among a random American citizens sample of 1,006 adults. Results may have error margin of plus/minus 3.5 percentage points.

The survey said 54 per cent of Americans believe Biden would handle COVID-19 outbreak better than Trump. Only 34 per cent felt Trump was doing well tackling the pandemic.

In handling of the economy, Biden has made giant strides and is nearly on par with Trump in the opinion poll, the ABC News reported. Biden edges out Trump by nine points in crime and safety, which has been a major topic in the US after hundreds of anti-racism protests in the last two months.

On race relations, Biden has a lead of 25 points over his Republican rival (58-33 per cent). Trump's job approval rating has plummeted in the last two months, standing at 39 per cent positive and 57 per cent negative. Biden is perceived to have a better personality and temperament to serve as President, holding 26 points advantage over Trump, the Washington Post reported.

South Africa minister in panic appeals for people's support

Johannesburg, July 21: As COVID-19 death toll in South Africa soared past 5,000, there was a tinge of desperation in the tone and choice of words of Health Minister Zweli Mkhize when he urged citizens to help the government in the fight against the deadly virus.

There are now 3,64,328 confirmed coronavirus cases, 1,91,059 recoveries and 5,033 deaths in the country. As Government,

we have mobilized every resource, every faculty and wherewithal at our disposal to effect the necessary interventions, Mkhize said on Monday as he called on citizens to play their part. "But government cannot manage this unilaterally. Every single South African now needs to focus on adhering to recommendations pertaining to non-pharmaceutical interventions," Mkhize said the emerging laxity

in basic measures was set to see soaring infections.

We are extremely concerned that fatigue seems to have set in and South Africans are letting down their guard at a time when the spread of infection is surging. We see poor or no social distancing in communities. Masks are being abandoned or not worn properly and there is laxity setting in around frequent hand-washing," the minister said. Mkhize predicted that this would cause a huge rise in infection numbers within the ensuing fortnight.

We must all appreciate that there is a direct causal link between the surge of cases and our ability, or inability, to adhere to these very basic principles," he said.

We do not have a vaccine. We do not have a cure. Our ability to break the cycle of infection depends on our willingness to remain focused and disciplined and take non-pharmaceutical interventions seriously, Mkhize said.

Mkhize said the cooperation between the government and the people would result in beating the pandemic.

T20 World Cup postponed

The ICC on Monday postponed the T20 World Cup in Australia owing to the COVID-19 pandemic, a long-anticipated decision which paves the way for the BCCI to organize the IPL during the October-November window. The ICC hasn't yet decided whether India and Australia will swap the 2021 and 2022 editions between them, both of which will be held in the October-November window.

"The International Cricket Council (ICC) today confirmed the ICC men's T20 World Cup in Australia 2020 has been postponed due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic," ICC said in a statement. The ICC T20 World Cup was scheduled Down Under from October 18-November 15 but Cricket Australia, in the month of May itself, had intimated ICC that it would be near impossible to stage a closed-door event of this magnitude which would also require quarantine arrangement for 16 international teams.

Effects of excessive screen time on your kids' eyes

Chennai, July 21: The current COVID-19 pandemic has dramatically changed the lifestyles of all ages across the globe. Even in the pre COVID-19 era, there were significant concerns regarding children eye health and gadget use.

Dr Jameel Rizwana Hussaindeen Assistant Professor- Elite School of Optometry, Research Coordinator - Srimathi Sundari Subramanian Department of Visual Psychophysics, HOD - Binocular vision/ Vision therapy clinic, Sankara Nethralaya talks about the impact of increased near work and gadget use on children eye health and ways to mitigate the same in the current situation from a scientific standpoint.

Digital eye strain refers to any kind of eye or visual issues due to excessive use of devices such as smart phones, tablets, I-pad, laptops, personal computers etc without

taking adequate breaks in between. An average adult spends about 5-12 hours on his/her gadget per day and 50-90% of these gadget users experience some form symptoms due to gadget use.

The second major concern is the impact of increased near work and gadget use leading to onset and progression of myopia. With hand held digital devices, children

are prone to take the devices closer and this would further increase the risk of myopia (photo). Apart from the need to wear glasses, high myopia is known to cause visual impairment due to complications in the retina. So controlling myopia is not just to do with the need for wearing or changing glasses but is also about protecting the eye sight from permanent damage.
