SRI LANKA BEAT ENGLAND BY 8 WICKETS

After Glenn Maxwell and David Warner's brilliant show with bat, Australia's Adam Zampa spun a web around the Netherlands' batter as Australia achieved the biggest victory in WC history...



Earlier, Maxwell scored the fastest century (126 off 44 balls) of the World Cup to guide Australia to a mammoth 306/6. Maxwell reached one of the most extraordinary ODI centuries of all time in just 40 balls, breaking...

thrilling innings. Meanwhile, David Warner too had an impressive 104 runs off 53 balls. Warner made the ton more iconic by celebrating it in his famous 'Pongki' style at the almost packed stadium. It was his fifth ODI World Cup ton.

After declaring to bat first, Australia didn't get the kind of start they thought of as Mitchell Marsh (59) lost his wicket to Legan van Beek in the fourth over from there, Warner and Steven Smith (71) built up a solid 132 runs partnership to put Australia on the drivers' seat. Both the batters played some brilliant shots to entertain the cricket fanatics present in the stadium. However, Arjun Dutt dismissed Smith to break the partnership. At Lakshadweep (80) they joined hands with the opener Van Beek to frustrate the Netherlands bowlers. The duo stretched 64 runs together. At 244, Australia lost Labuschagne. New batter Josh Inglis (14) also failed to spend time on crease as he was sent back early by Jas de Seede. Soon after that, Warner also got out by Legan Van Beek. But from there Maxwell changed the gear and entertained the cricket fanatics with some brilliant eye-catching shots all over the ground.

Men's ODI WC: Try to put myself in their shoes and think about what this individual will be needing now, says Rohit Sharma

I have been a stellar 2023 Men's ODI World Cup for India captain and opener Rohit Sharma. Under him, India have won all five of their league matches so far and Rohit himself has been giving the team blistering starts in the first ten overs to set the base for successful chases.

With India set to play against defending champions England in Lucknow on October 29, Rohit shared his thoughts on leading the home side in the global event and how he is managing everyone in the team, stressing on knowing the individual first.

"I think when it comes to managing players, it's quite important that you understand the individual first and their requirements, what are the likes and dislikes of that particular individual because you know in a team sport it's just not about one or two individuals or few individuals, it's about everyone."

"We do understand as well that when you want to win championships, big tournaments, everyone needs to come to the party and play their part. So, it's important that you keep everyone in good mental space. So, it's very important to hear everyone out, understand what they want, how they want to operate and things like that and then you take everything into consideration and move forward and that is something that I always do," he said to Star Sports.



Men's ODI World Cup, Rohit has made 197 runs, with a strike-rate of 134, smashing 22 fours and 12 sixes, becoming an all-out attacker for India in the first ten overs of their innings. Rohit revealed that he practices empathy to get a sense of how to manage the team and its individuals, a practice which he says hasn't come to him naturally. "I try and put myself...

in their shoes and think about what this individual will be needing now. So, it's important to think like that and you know luckily, I have got good bunch of guys around me the players, the support staff are quite understanding in terms of the requirement of the team, the players and everyone."

"So, yeah that is something that I wouldn't say comes naturally to me, I've learned it over the years, even though my personal experience and understood what is needed for a team to be successful, I think what is needed to be successful is to understand everyone's need, their requirement and give them that space and freedom to go and execute their job and their roles. Because it can be quite daunting at times because when you are playing such a high-profile tournament, the pressure can get to you at times. So, it's important to just stay together as a team, understand what each one needs to be in that good zone where they can come out and play free cricket and not worry about what is happening outside," he concluded.

Manish Sureshkumar, Madhwin score upset wins enroute to quarters at Men's World Tennis

On a day when four seeds hit the dust, Manish Sureshkumar and Madhwin Karanth of India crossed fingers with an upset victory each en route to the quarterfinals of the ATP Challenger Open Men's World Tennis.

In the pre-quarterfinal matches played at the Yashwantrao Chavan Association grounds on Thursday, 24-year-old Manish edged past third seed Divyanshu Prasad Singh in a close encounter 7-6 (5), 7-6 (2) while qualifier Madhwin battled past fourth seed Florent Flux of France 7-6 (4), 6-7 (4), 6-4 in a match that lasted 13 hours and 13 minutes.

In the other upsets of the day, Karan Singh showed sixth seed SD Prasad Dev the door with a 6-4, 6-4 victory while in an upset, winner of the last leg, Rameshwar Ramanathan brushed aside the challenge of seventh seed Rishabh Agarwal 6-4, 6-3.



White Florent Flux, who had won the Ahmedabad leg of ATP 12K about 9 days ago, had confidence and experience in his anxious former Indian National Champion Madhwin had the determination and resilience. With a break in the fifth game and hitting onto his serve, the Indian...

went 4-2 up but soon Flux, not only levelled at 4 but went ahead 5-4. Both the players traded a break each before the set was decided via tie-breaker with the younger opponent winning at 4. The 23-year-old Madhwin whose roots belong to Mangalore in Karnataka has lives in Gujarat, capitalised on his rival's mistakes and raced to a 5-2 lead.

However, he lost his rhythm while on the cusp of grabbing the match as Flux saved two match points before winning the second set which was decided via tie-breaker.

The final set saw Madhwin taking control of the match with a 5-1 lead, courtesy breaks in the first and fifth games. However, the Frenchman clawed back into the game winning those consecutive games and reduced the margin to 4-1 before Madhwin served out for the match.

Asian Para Games: Pramod Bhagat, Sukant Kadam secure bronze in men's doubles

Asian para shooters Pramod Bhagat and Sukant Kadam secured bronze medals in men's doubles S1, S2, S3, 4 category at the ongoing Asian Para Games on Thursday.

World No 1 Pramod Bhagat and Sukant Kadam were seen fighting to the Indonesian pair of Setiawan Prady and Daryoko in a tight 3-games encounter. The Indians took the first set 22-20 and both the teams were not giving an inch and fighting tooth and nail for each and every point, the second set was also closely fought with the Indonesian pair claiming the game with a score of 21-23. Bit weird that I had to calm myself down for the first 20 odd balls and rebuild, says Maxwell

Australia's big-hitting all-rounder Glenn Maxwell admitted that it was a bit weird for him to calm himself down to the first 20 balls of his innings, before smashing the fastest hundred in Men's ODI World Cup history when he reached his century in 40 balls against the Netherlands.

At the Arun Jaitley Stadium on Wednesday, Maxwell broke the record of fastest ODI World Cup century held by South Africa's Aiden Markram, who reached three-figure mark off just 49 deliveries at the same venue earlier this month.

He eventually made 100 runs off 41 deliveries, hitting nine fours and eight sixes, to secure what is now overall the fourth fastest century in men's ODI cricket and the fastest ever handed for Australia.

"It's a bit weird that I had to calm myself down for the first 20 odd balls and rebuild. I think the circumstances of the setting of the...



wickets probably changed the way I would have gone about it if it was just me and Davey (David Warner) at the back end."

"I felt like I was just super selective. Even with the boundaries I was hitting, stuff I got to about 50 or 60, I was literally hitting them but through the gap or picking my spots pretty cleanly when I wanted to go and it was only the back end when I tried to just pump everything," he said in the post-match press conference. Maxwell reached his 112 in 27 balls and then took only 13 balls to get a second-breaking century in a break-taking assault over Netherlands' bowling attack. He also conceded that he had one eye on number of deliveries faced at the scoreboard during his debut match, citing the previous opportunity he missed during 2015 World Cup.

"I'm very aware of them. I'm very aware of balls faced. I love the fastest 50 and 100 records. I think they're pretty cool records. Sometimes in the deconstruct of myself, I've always probably pushed the boundaries a bit too much."

"I think against Afghanistan in 2015, I was 50 off 37 and I was like I'm getting into the next two balls I hit one straight to cover and hit another 4. I think I got my fastest 100 run game. So, it was I've been in those positions before I could make fast hundreds when I get on the run - I know I'm difficult to bowl to, it's just about getting past the first ball. The last 12 months had been a mixed bag for Maxwell, starting by being out of action for a long time after breaking his leg during a birthday party post the end of Australia's campaign in the 2022 Men's T20 World Cup. He admitted that the thoughts of the injury came back in his mind after he was out of T20I series against South Africa due to minor ankle injury."
