Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik on Friday inaugurated the Deo irrigation project and the additional irrigation facility created in the Submarekha multipurpose irrigation project in Mayurbhanj district and said together the projects will provide irrigation to over 27,000 hectares benefitting over 2.60 lakh farmers.

Very heavy rain forecast in Odisha: Govt. rules out flood threat

Odisha is likely to experience another spell of heavy showers for the next two days due to the possible formation of a new low-pressure area even as heavy downpour in the past 48 hours has resulted in the rise in water level of all major rivers.

heavy rain forecast from tomorrow, said Bijay Kumar Mishra, engineer-in-chief, Water Resources department. The low pressure system is set to form over north Bay of Bengal during the next 24 hours under the influence of a cyclonic circulation, which lies over west Myanmar, the Bhubaneswar Meteorological Centre said on Friday.

The Met office issued an orange alert of very heavy rain in the districts of Khurda, Cuttack, Puri, Balasore, Bhadrak, Dhenkanal, Ganjam, Gajapati, Jajpur, Jagatsinghpur, Kandhamal, Kalahandi, Kendrapara and Nayagarh on Saturday.

Heavy rain occurred at some places in Sundargarh, Deogarh, Sambalpur and Kendrapara over a 24-period till 8.30 am on Friday, the Met said. Tensa in Sundargarh and Barkot in Deogarh received 113 mm of precipitation, followed by 90 mm at Kuchinda in Sambalpur.

It warned of extremely heavy precipitation at a few places in Kalahandi, Bolangir, Nuapada and Nabarangpur on Sunday, besides heavy to very heavy showers across the state.

Odisha is already reeling under the effects of a downpour, caused due to a depression. It led to flooding of villages and low-lying areas across many districts, collapse of several bridges over swollen rivers, and landslides disrupting road connectivity.

Fishermen have been advised not to venture into the sea off the coast till Monday.

However, the officials ruled out the threat of flood pounding upon the riverside villages.

Even though water level has gone up in almost all rivers in the state, it is yet to reach danger mark except Jalaka river.

There is no immediate threat of flood in any river. However, we are keeping close watch on the situation because of the

Odisha cabinet approves Rs 2,808 cr for Millets Mission

Mega pipe water projects, rain water harvesting subsidy for pvt buildings

The Odisha cabinet on Friday approved an estimated budget of Rs. 2808.39 crore for six years (2021-22 to 2026-27) financial years towards the Special Programme for Promotion of Millets in Tribal Areas. Currently, the State

government has its area of implementation from 84 blocks in 15 districts to 142 blocks in 19 Districts from 2022-23 onwards towards the Odisha Millet Mission. The Mission was launched by the government in 2017 to revive millets in farms and on plates. It emerged from a consultation between Govern-

ment, Academia (NCDS) and Civil Society Organisations (RRA Network, ASHA Network and local NGOs). It is first of its kind of agriculture programme with priority on increasing consumptions in Odisha. The programme is implemented through Women Self-Help Groups (WSHG) and Farmers Producer Organisa-

tions (FPOs) with support of NGOs and research institutions with oversight from the Department of Agriculture It Farmers Empowerment.

The programme is supported through State Plan, District Mineral Fund and Odisha Mineral Bearing Areas Development Corporation (OMBADC).

STANDALONE AND CONSOLIDATED NOTES :

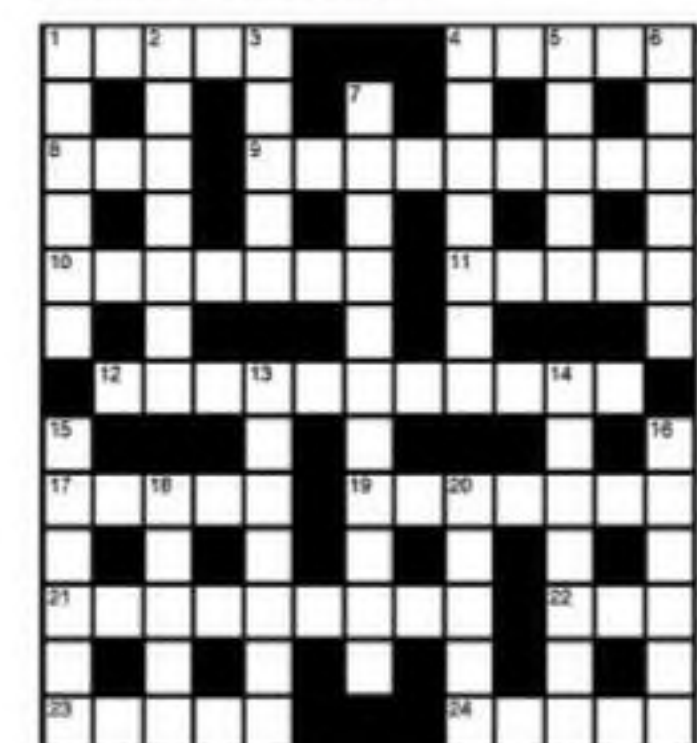
- The unaudited standalone and consolidated financial results of the Company for the quarter ended 30.06.2022 have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on August 12, 2022. The statutory auditors have carried out limited review under regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listed Obligations and Disclosure Requirement) Regulation, 2015 and expressed an unmodified opinion on these results.
- The financial results of the Company have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 as amended by the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) (Amendment) Rules, 2016.
- The company is operating under a single segment i.e., "Dairy Products - comprising Ghee, Milk Powder, Casein & Whey Powder" and therefore there are no reportable segments as per IND AS-108 "Operating Segment".
- Contingent Liabilities - Claims against the company not acknowledged as debts - Rs.78 Lakhs.
- Goods and Service Tax Department has generally verified the transaction of the dealers vis input tax credit. In this regard, they have also carried out the verification of ITC of our Four Dealers. The company has been cooperating in the investigating proceedings and has partially deposited a sum of Rs 16.27 Crores as Tax voluntarily deposited under protest. The amount paid to the department under protest is shown as GST recoverable in the financials of the company. Company has received a show cause notice from Moradabad Range in this regard for Rs.25 Crores and has filed its reply & order is expected shortly after the personal hearing. Legally, the company has been advised of its success as the entire payment to the dealers is made through banking channels for purchases which has been duly confirmed by bank. Company has not received any notice of demand from the department after the reply.
- The outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic has caused significant disturbance and slowdown of economic activities globally. The lockdowns ordered by most of the State Governments have resulted in the slowdown of economic activities. Besides this there has been increase in the Revenue from operations for the quarter ended 30.06.2022 by Rs 912 Lacs, there has been increase in the prices of various raw materials which could not be passed on to the customers due to their lower paying capacities and severe competitive conditions. All these factors resulted in increase in the loss of the company in the current quarter vis a vis corresponding quarter ended 30.06.2021 by Rs 80 Lakhs. The management has considered the effects which resulted from the pandemic and resultant increase in cost of inputs. Based on the current indicators of future economic conditions and company engaged in dairy business (essential services), the management expects to generate sufficient revenue (pre Covid 19 pandemic), recover the receivables and dispose of stocks. The management is closely monitoring the situation regarding any material changes in future economic conditions. Given the uncertainties, the final impact on Company's ability to recover assets in future may differ from that estimated as at the date of approval of these financial results. The Production Capacity of one plant remained under utilized due to less demand of ghee on account of Covid 19 pandemic. Management is of the view that this is the temporary phase and the plant will be substantially utilized for generating revenue when the demand of ghee increases in the subsequent quarters as the pandemic and inflation conditions improve. Considering all these factors impairment testing if any will be done at the year end.
- Provision for non moving inventory, if any, will be made at the year end.
- Previous period figures have been recast/regrouped/reclassified wherever necessary to make them comparable with those of current period.
