Patnaik inaugurates two irrigation projects in Mayurbhanj

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik on Friday inaugurated the Deo irrigation project and the additional irrigation facility created in the Subamarekha multipurpose irrigation project in Mayurbhanj district and said together the projects will provide irrigation to over 27,000 hectares benefitting over 2.60 lakh farmers.

The CM was visiting the district after a gap of three years. Despite being physically present, his pre-recorded speech was played on an audio visual mode in front of the huge gathering, mostly tribals.

Ministers Tukuni Sahu, Aswini Patra, MLAs Sudam Marandi, Rajkishore Das were present.

He referred to how a trib-

al lady from the district had scaled heights to be the President of India making everybody in the state feel proud.

Heavy rain occurred at some places in Sundargarh, Deogarh, Sambalpur and Kendrapara over a 24-period till 8.30 am on Friday, the Met said. Tensa in Sundargarh and Barkot in Deogarh received 113 mm of precipitation, followed by 90 mm at Kuchinda in Sambalpur.

Odisha is already reeling under the effects of a downpour, caused due to a depression. It led to flooding of villages and low-lying areas across many districts, collapse of several bridges over swollen rivers, and landslides disrupting road connectivity.

Jalaka river is in spate in Balasore and Baitaran in Bhadrak following heavy showers in the upper catchment areas. Intense rain has led to water logging in many areas of Keonjhar.

The Hirakud dam opened six more sluice gates to release excess water. Currently, the reservoir is releasing water through 20 gates.

It warned of extremely heavy precipitation at a few places in Kalahandi, Bolangir, Nuapada and Nabarangapur on Sunday, besides heavy to very heavy showers across the state.

Fishermen have been advised not to venture into the sea off the coast till Monday.

However, the officials ruled out the threat of flood pounding upon the riverside villages.

Even though water level has gone up in almost all rivers in the state, it is yet to reach danger mark except Jalaka river. There is no immediate threat of flood in any river. However we are keeping close watch on the situation because of the

heavy rain forecast from tomorrow, said Bijay Kumar Mishra, engineer-in-chief, Water Resources department.

The low pressure system is set to form over north Bay of Bengal during the next 24 hours under the influence of a cyclonic circulation, which lies over west Myanmar, the Bhubaneswar Meteorological Centre said on Friday.

Odisha is likely to experience another spell of heavy showers for the next two days due to the possible formation of a new low-pressure area even as heavy downpour in the past 48 hours has resulted in the rise in water level of all major rivers.

Ivory trade kingpin held



Odisha cabinet approves Rs 2,808 cr for Millets Mission
Mega pipe water projects, rain water harvesting subsidy for pvt buildings

The Odisha cabinet on Friday approved an estimated budget of Rs. 2808.39 crore for six years (2021-22 to 2026-27) financial years towards the Special Programme for Promotion of Millets in Tribal Areas. Currently, the State

government has its area of implementation from 84 blocks in 15 districts to 142 blocks in 19 Districts from 2022-23 onwards towards the Odisha Millet Mission. The Mission was launched in 2017 to revive millets in farms and on plates.

It emerged from a consultation between Govern-

ment, Academia (NCDS) and Civil Society Organisations (RRA Network, ASHA Network and local NGOs). It is first of its kind of agriculture programme with priority on increasing consumptions in Odisha. The programme is implemented through Women Self Help Groups (WSHGs) and Farmers Producer Organisa-

tions (FPOs) with support of NGOs and research institutions with oversight from the Department of Agriculture It Farmers Empowerment.

The programme is supported through State Plan, District Mineral Fund and Odisha Mineral Bearing Areas Development Corporation (OMBADC).
