Rajasthan Chief Minister Gehlot welcomes Sachin Pilot at his official residence

When Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot met his former deputy Sachin Pilot on Thursday at the former's official residence on his invitation, both were all smiles. But the question being asked in political circles was: would it be possible for them to forget their bitterness?

Senior party leaders KC Venugopal, Ajay Maken, Ran-deep Singh Surjewala, Avinash Pande, and PCC chief Govind Dotsara were present during the meeting. Even though the Congressmen tried to project a unified front, there was stiffness in their body language. The meeting was held a day before the special assembly session scheduled to begin on



Rajasthan CM Ashok Gehlot along with Sachin Pilot and other senior Congress leaders in Jaipur.

Friday. Gehlot has said that his government will move a vote trust to prove its majority.

Gehlot has been keeping his numbers safe and the over 100 MLAs supporting him are still put up at Hotel Fairmont.

After the homecoming of Pilot and 18 rebels, it takes the Congress tally close to 125. This is enough to ensure that the government is comfortably safe.

A meeting of all legislators was also held after the meet-

ing between Pilot and Gehlot. Addressing the CLP meet Sachin Pilot thanked Congress president Sonia Gandhi and CM Gehlot for appointing him deputy chief minister in 2018.

"Let us put it behind us

whatever happened. We would have proved our majority even without these 19 MLAs, but that would not have given us happiness. Because family is family," said Gehlot addressing the CLP.

Speaking to the media, Vishvendra Singh said, "We have been called by the chief minister. We are loyal Congressmen and have shown our loyalty to the party. We had to leave for a month as there was a threat to us."

In another important development, both Bhanwarlal Sharma and Vishvendra Singh's suspension from the party was revoked. This was announced by state in-charge Avinash Pande on microblogging site Twitter. The move is being taken as the party high command's initiative to end tension.

BJP still wants to prove a point

BJP has decided to move a no-confidence motion in the Assembly. Leader of Opposition Gulab Chand Kataria said this in Jaipur after a legislators meeting was held at the BJP office on Thursday. The special Assembly session is scheduled to begin on Friday.

Union Minister Narendra Tomar, senior leader P Murlidhar Rao and state in-charge Avinash Rai Khanna were present to oversee the meeting proceedings. Former chief minister Vasundhara Raje was also present at the meeting.

Raje said that the Gehlot government has run out of time and will not last for long. Kataria also expressed similar sentiments and said that the peace in Congress won't last for long.

The BJP has claimed that the Ashok Gehlot government does not have adequate numbers and will fall in the eventuality of a floor test. The BJP is probably still banking on the possibility of chinks in the Congress unity and the subsequent inability of Gehlot to manage enough numbers.

Rajasthan Assembly has total 200 seats, out of

which 107 are with Congress. It also has the support of independents and other parties taking its tally to almost 125. Whereas BJP has 72 and along with its ally RLP's 3 seats its numbers reach 75. The number required for a majority is 101 and in the present scenario the Congress appears to be in a comfortable position to prove majority.

Country braces for more rain in next 2-3 days

Delhi witnessed its heaviest spell of rains this season on Thursday, and heavy down-pour lashed parts of Mumbai and neighbouring areas, while the meteorological department predicted more rainfall in the country over the next two-three days.

In Uttar Pradesh, two members of a family were killed and as many seriously injured when a wall of their 'kutcha' house collapsed due to heavy rains, and in Madhya Pradesh, the weather office issued an 'orange alert' of very heavy rainfall in eight districts till Friday morning.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) said large parts of the country are likely to receive heavy to very heavy rainfall during the next two-three days. Fairly widespread rainfall with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places are very likely over major parts of north India - Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh and Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, east Rajasthan - during the next two days, the IMD said.

Early warning system for floods

A tool to alert local authorities in Guwahati about flash floods and heavy rainfall was launched on Thursday.

Developed under The Energy and Resources Institute's (TERI) project supported by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) in collaboration with the IMD and the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA), the Flood Early Warning System (FEWS) can be replicated to predict urban floods in any part of the country.

WATERLOGGING IN DELHI

Several areas of Delhi saw waterlogging on Thursday after heavy rains lashed the national capital. Over 40 locations in north Delhi got inundated due to the downpour, including areas in Mukherjee Nagar, Fateh Puri, Burari, Rohini, Narela and West Patel Nagar, according to the North Delhi Municipal Corporation (NDMC). The monsoon report shared by the NDMC mentioned that waterlogging took place at 41 locations. Besides, parts of buildings collapsed at eight places and trees fell at seven locations, it said.



Now, gratuity after 1 year to contract workers

NEW DELHI: The Payment of Gratuity Act mandates a minimum five years of continuous service for one to be eligible for gratuity, but the Centre now plans to reduce it to just one year in case of the employees with the fixed-term contracts. This provision is proposed to be inserted in the draft Industrial Relations Code. The government informed the parliamentary standing committee on labour about its plan to reduce the ceiling. An employee gets gratuity at the rate of 15 days' wages for every year completed.

The committee members, however, sought extension of the benefit to all sections of the employees as pressed by the trade unions. The committee, headed by the BJD's Bhruhari Mahtab, has sent a resolution to the government recommending the benefit of the reduced ceiling to all types of employees. The government is, however, keen to give it to the fixed-term workers whose employment ends with the lapse of the contract. They are mostly the low-ranked staff such as labourers, factory operators, helpers and drivers. The labour secretary says the contract workers are so far deprived of any gratuity that the government seeks to remedy by making a provision specifically for them. —OUR BUREAU

IAF chief flies MiG-21, reviews op readiness

Indian Air Force (IAF) chief RKS Bhadauria on Thursday flew MiG-21 Bison during a visit to a fighter squadron at a frontline airbase in Western Air Command.

"The IAF chief flew a MiG-21 Bison fighter aircraft during the visit where he interacted with the aircrew and reviewed the operational preparedness," IAF officials said.

Officials said the flying by the IAF Chief in a MiG-21 indicates the high operational readiness of the force amid the tension with China in Eastern Ladakh over territo-

rial issues. Bhadauria also reviewed the operational preparedness of the base.

The IAF chief met the aircrew, combat crew from the squadrons and units stationed at the frontline base. Bhadauria, a test pilot, has flown the under-development HTT-40 basic trainer aircraft and the LCA Tejas after taking over to show his support for indigenous defence hardware and has backed several important DRDO projects also.

Last month, Bhadauria went to Ambala to receive the batch of first five Rafale combat aircraft arriving from France.

Income limit for SC students' foreign scholarship scheme increased

New Delhi: The annual family income limit for the National Overseas Scholarship Scheme for Scheduled Castes students has been increased from Rs 6 lakh to Rs 8 lakh, the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment said on Thursday.

The major change in the scheme will apply with effect from selection year 2020-21, said a ministry statement, adding students securing admission in higher ranking institutions internationally will be given preference.

Also, the minimum qualifying marks have also been increased from 55 per cent to 60 per cent and the maintenance allowance has been linked with progress of the awardee.

"Various verification processes have been simplified. Police verification has been done away with and self-declaration has been introduced," it said.

With the changes, the selection process has become simplified and all the slots are likely to be filled up in a short period as compared to the last year, as per the ministry.

So far, 42 out of a total of 100 slots have been filled, based on the applications received during the first quarter.

Pak fulfilling all int'l obligations relating to Jadhav, claims its Army

ISLAMABAD/ NEW DELHI:

Pakistan is fulfilling all its international obligations relating to Indian death-row convict Kulbhushan Jadhav, the Army claimed on Thursday. Jadhav, a retired Indian Navy officer, was sentenced to death by a Pakistani military court on charges of espionage and terrorism in April 2017.

Weeks later, India approached the International Court of Justice (ICJ) against Pakistan for denial of consular access to Jadhav and challenging the death sentence. The ICJ, then, restrained Pakistan from executing him.

In July last year, the Hague-based court ruled that Pakistan must undertake an "effective review and reconsideration" of the conviction and sentence of Jadhav and also to grant consular access to India without further delay. Responding to a question on Jadhav, Pakistan Army spokesman Major General Babar Iftikhar said, "The decision of the ICJ on Kulbhushan is being implemented." "We are following international law. Consular access was given to fulfil obligations under the ICJ verdict," he said in Rawalpindi.

Pakistan provided consular access to Jadhav in July, days after it claimed that he had refused to file an appeal in a court here against his conviction. However, India expressed its disappointment over Pakistan not providing an "unimpeded, unhindered and unconditional" consular access to Jadhav.

The Islamabad High Court on August 8 constituted a larger three-member bench to hear the petition filed by the government to appoint a legal representative for Jadhav.

Pakistan claims that its security forces arrested Jadhav from the restive Balochistan province on March 3, 2016 after he reportedly entered from Iran.
