Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Statement of Standalone Financial Results of Mangal Credit & Fincorp Limited (the "Company"), for the three months and year ended March 31, 2022 (the "Statement"), being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").

Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matters.

Management's Responsibility for the Standalone Financial Statements

This Statement, is the responsibility of the Company's Management and approved by the Board of Directors, has been compiled from the related audited Interim condensed standalone financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2022. The Company's Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Standalone Financial Results that give a true and fair view of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Ind AS 34, prescribed under Section 133 of the Act, read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations.
