'Bihar's caste survey valid': HC paves way for stalled exercise

Junks 12 Writ Petitions Filed Against Survey

Patna: The Patna high court dismissed on Tuesday a batch of PILs challenging the validity of the Bihar caste survey, terming the state government's initiative "perfectly valid and legally competent", and paving the way for the stalled exercise to resume after almost three months.

The verdict delivered by the division bench of Chief Justice K Vinod Chandran and Justice Partha Sarthy means the interim stay ordered by the HC on May 4 automatically stands vacated.

The bench upheld the Patna government's contention that the Collection of Statistics Act, 2008, empowers it to conduct such an enumeration exercise in the interest of social justice. It also found substance in the state government's submissions citing assembly debates and the SC's landmark judgment in the Indira Sawhney case pertaining to the ratio-

nale for reservation based on caste.

"The aim and purpose of the caste survey is to identify Backward Classes, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes so as to uplift them and ensure equal opportunities—not only by affirmative action, but also providing employment, ensuring admission to educational institutions etc.," it said. "Such endeavours are in the nature of compelling public interest, which overrides the right to privacy...hence, such surveys cannot be brushed aside."

The bench also distinguished a caste survey from a census, observing that the former couldn't in any way be construed as "a coercive exercise" to divulge citizens' personal data since information such as age, sex,

JDU & RJD claim victory, say BJP stands exposed

Patna: BJP joined the Nitish Kumar-led Mahagathabandhan in Bihar on Tuesday in welcoming the Patna HC's verdict upholding the validity of the stalled caste survey initiated by the state government, only for the JD (U)-RJD combine to question if the saffron party was faking it after having allegedly tried to stall the exercise, report Manoj Chaurasia, Madan Kumar & Abhay Singh.

Soon after the state BJP welcomed the ruling, deputy CM Tejashwi Yadav accused the party of being a spoke in the wheel "when 80% of the survey task had been done". "There is poverty within every caste, and our initiative is not only aimed at doing a headcount of castes, but also finding out their economic status. The survey will help the state government prepare schemes for them," he said. Tejashwi's father, RJD chief Lalu Prasad, said the court had "opened the door for all-round progress of the poor."

NIA raids 31 sites over probe into UK mission attack

New Delhi: The NIA raided 31 locations across Punjab and Haryana to "unravel and unearth the full contours of the conspiracy behind the March 19 attack on the high commission of India in London".

Tuesday's raids across Moga, Barnala, Kapurthala, Jalandhar, Hoshiarpur, Tarn Taran, Ludhiana, Gurdaspur, SBS Nagar, Amritsar, Mukhtsar, Sangrur, Patiala, Mohali in Punjab and Sirsa in Haryana led to the seizure of digital data containing information related to accused involved in the attack, according to an NIA spokesperson.

₹9,400cr loan fraud: ED raids TDP neta's firm

Hyderabad: ED on Tuesday conducted searches on TDP former MP Rayapati Sambasiwa Rao-owned Transstroy India in nine locations in connection with an alleged loan fraud of Rs 9,394 crore, touted as one of the biggest loan scams in the country, reports U Sudhakarreddy.

Transstroy, which was the contractor for a multi-crore irrigation project, allegedly created bogus companies using the names of domestic help, sweepers and drivers as directors to divert funds, ED has alleged.

NRF will add to R&D funding, existing ones to continue: Official

Mumbai: Putting to rest fears over the possible reduction in government funding for research and development (R&D) in the country due to the National Research Foundation (NRF), Ajay Kumar Sood, principal scientific adviser to the Centre, said the existing government funding will remain untouched. Speaking on the sidelines of an event at TIFR Mumbai on Monday, Sood said NRF will only add to existing funding.

He said the fears are baseless. "The existing research funding through various departments will continue as it is, and NRF will only be adding to it," said Sood, who delivered the JRD Tata Memorial Lecture organised by the TIFR Alumni Association. While speaking to TOI, Sood said one of the objectives of NRF is to bring industry players into the R&D ecosystem along with government funding. "We are not expecting 100% funding from the industry in all the projects, but only looking at co-funding options. We have to see what is of interest to both in solving a larger problem," he said, adding the government is exploring options to involve private players through CSR activities. "We need to engage with industry bodies to find

out the best way to bring non-government investment into our R&D ecosystem," said Sood. Another objective of the NRF is to reach out to smaller universities which do not majorly benefit from government funding for R&D at the moment, said Sood.

A section of scientists, though, is wary about a centralised body for research support and say they believe government funding, which is crucial for basic research or curiosity-driven research, will not go up after NRF. Scientist Soumitro Banerjee, from Breakthrough Science Society, said support for individual research proposals may be affected depending on priorities set by the government. "Also, the government fund earmarked for NRF is not sufficient, when India needs to increase the support for scientific research from below 0.8% of the GDP to at least 3%," said Banerjee.

TN man in Iraq sends harassment clip, 'kills himself'

Dindigul: A construction worker from Tamil Nadu in Iraq has died, allegedly by suicide, hours after sending his wife a video complaining that he was harassed by some compatriots who made and uploaded "compromising clips" the woman said on Tuesday.

C Kokila said the circumstances surrounding the death of her husband P Chinnaiya, 45, were "suspicious" and appealed to the state government to help bring his body to their home in Dindigul district's Natham.

The mother of three submitted a petition to the local authorities. Chinnaiya had gone to Iraq in July 2022.

MP woman falls off S'pore-bound cruise liner, dies

Indore: A 64-year-old woman from Indore, Reeta Sahani, who would have celebrated her 65th birthday on Tuesday, died after falling overboard in the Singapore Straits while on a Caribbean cruise with her husband, reports Meenakshi Sharma.

Reeta and husband Jakesh Sahani were on the last leg of their four-day cruise to Singapore on 'Spectrum of the Seas' when she went missing on July 31. A family friend said, "They had a celebration on Monday after which they went to sleep. In the middle of the night, Jakesh woke up and did not see Reeta. He found the balcony door open and Reeta missing."

There was absolute breakdown of constitutional machinery in the state to the point that one could not record an FIR. Police couldn't make arrests. You (the state government) may be right that the police could not make arrests because the situation was out of control. A police officer could not enter a locality to arrest the accused," the CJI said. He added, "Assuming that the ground situation was such to prevent police from taking action against the accused, does it not point to the fact that there was a complete breakdown of the law and order machinery in the state? If the law and order machinery cannot protect the people, where do they go?"

SG Tushar Mehta said, "That last observation (breakdown of constitutional machinery and law and order machinery) may not be correct as we are a little away from that and the situation is coming back to normal now. The moment we came to know of the viral video, we not only transferred the probe to CBI but also requested the SC to monitor it."

He said the state police had registered around 6,500 FIRs for various offences during the ethnic strife. The bench pointed out that the CBI could investigate only a few heinous offences. "What about the rest? Can the state police investigate 6,000-odd cases? It is so obvious that they lost control over the situation," said the CJI.

When Mehta said such remarks without reading the status report could have serious repercussions for the already-tense situation in the state, the bench said in the 11 cases of serious crimes against women and children, on-

J&K LG vows swift repair of sufi shrine in tourism push

Charar-i-Sharief, Budgam: It's been 28 years since Charar-i-Sharief, one of the most revered Sufi shrines in J&K, was burnt down in a terrorist encounter, but despite its restoration, structural flaws in the restored buildings and delays in infrastructure development in Charar-i-Sharief town have kept the resting place of Sheikh ul Aalam from realising its full potential as a tourist and spiritual destination.

Keen to set this right, J&K Lt Governor Manoj Sinha on Tuesday visited the iconic centre of Sufism in Budgam district, and heard the grievances of spiritual leaders, public representatives and local residents and assured them Charar-i-Sharief would be transformed into a "model town" on the lines of Katra, the start point for Vaishno Devi pilgrimage.

Sinha directed the tourism department to rope in experts for the restoration of Jamia mosque that has developed cracks, following which two floors were declared unsafe.

Sinha on Tuesday reassured that utilities would also be ready by October 1. Besides, the district hospital in Budgam, upon completion, would cater to the needs of residents, he said.

The Centre and J&K administration are focused on promoting Sufi culture that has deep roots in Kashmir, which will also reduce the communal divide and radicalisation that has taken many youths towards terrorism.

J&K saw 1.3cr tourists so far' J&K registered 1.27 crore tourist arrivals this year so far, and the figure is expected to touch a record high by the year-end, Sinha said. — Saleem Pandit.

SC slams lethargy in filing of Manipur FIRs, calls DGP

New Delhi: The SC on Tuesday ordered the Manipur DGP to appear before it on Monday with a breakdown of FIRs based on gravity of offences while asking him about action taken against policemen who allegedly handed over two women to a mob who were stripped, paraded naked and sexually assaulted.

This direction came from a bench of Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and Justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, which took exception to the lethargy in recording of FIRs even in heinous crimes against women and apparent complicity or unwillingness to protect people from mobs.

The bench said, "One of the women has recorded a statement saying she was handed over to the mob by the police. According to her—I asked the police to start the vehicle, but the policeman said he has lost the key". Have those policemen been interrogated? Did the DGP care to find out in all these months whether these policemen handed over the women to the mob? What is he doing? This is his duty. What has he done?"

The state government, through soli-

ditor general Tushar Mehta, said 24 hours given by the Supreme Court to furnish data on FIRs was inadequate to give details of every case and requested the court for more time to provide every possible statistic on crimes during the ethnic clashes. "Let the CBI investigate the case and it will give a report to the SC," he said. When the SC said the CBI would be investigating only two of the 6,523 FIRs, the SG took instructions and said the 11 FIRs mentioned in the state's status report, which pertained to sexual assault of women and crimes against women and children, would be entrusted to the CBI for probe.

As the bench was ripping apart the Manipur government with remarks like "complete breakdown of constitutional and law and order machinery", AG R Venkataramani advised the judges to have patience by warning observations made without knowing the details of action taken by the state and central governments would be counter-productive for the state. "A larger picture also needs to be looked at, which is deeply disturbing. We are in the midst of a war of different dimensions," the top law officer said
