## Govt bans Bangladesh outfit that carried out '14 blast in Burdwan

Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen Bangladesh also blamed for Dhaka terror attack

THE GOVERNMENT has placed militant outfit Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) in the list of banned organisations under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA). The group was behind the October 2014 blasts in Burdwan in West Bengal and several of its members have also been charged by the National Investigation Agency (NIA).

The group shot to international headlines when its members were blamed for the terror attack at a cafe in Dhaka in 2016 in which 22 people including 17 foreigners were killed.

In a notification, the home ministry said the outfit has admitted and promoted acts of terrorism and has been engaged in radicalisation and recruitment of youths for terrorist activities in India. Therefore, the Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen Bangladesh or Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen India or Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen Hindustan and all its manifestations have been inserted in the First Schedule to the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967, the notification said.

The listing under the First Schedule of the UAPA means the outfit is now a banned organisation in India, a home ministry official said.

Twenty-two people, including 17 foreigners, were killed in

the attack at the Holy Artisan Bakery in Gulshan area of Bangladesh capital Dhaka on July 1, 2016. During a joint operation, police killed six of the attackers. Six days later, militants attacked police guarding the largest Eid gathering in Bangladesh and killed three more people.

The Bangladesh Police had blamed terror group JMB for the two terror attacks. Security agencies in India have also established the JMB's links with bomb blasts at Burdwan in West Bengal on October 2, 2014 and Goda Ghat on January 19, 2018.

The Assam Police has also found involvement of JMB in five cases registered by them and a total of 56 accused belonging to JMB were arrested.

According to the home ministry notification, the JMB came into existence in 1998 with the objective of establishing an Islamic state in Bangladesh.

The JMB and its formations like Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen India or Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen Hindustan and their manifestations have committed acts of terrorism, promoted acts of terrorism and have been engaged in radicalisation and recruitment of youths for terrorist activities in India.

The JMB was engaged in recruitment and raising funds for terrorist activities, procurement of explosives chemicals and assembling of Improvised Explosives Devices, it said.

## One of longest-surviving militants in Valley killed in Pulwama encounter

Head of Ansar Ghazwat-ul-Hind, Zakir Musa, was close aide of Burhan Wani

A FORMER Hizbul Mujahideen militant, who was close aide of slain militant Burhan Wani — Zakir Rashid Bhat — was killed in an overnight encounter in south Kashmir's Pulwama district on Friday.

Zakir Bhat, who was also known as Zakir Musa, was one of the longest-surviving militants in Kashmir Valley and was head of Ansar Ghazwat-ul-Hind outfit. His death has now almost eliminated the Ansar outfit in the Valley, according to security officials.

Calling the operation a "major success against terrorism in south Kashmir", a Jammu and Kashmir Police spokesperson said Zakir was the only surviving militant of the "renegade Burhan (Wani) group".

"He was active for the last six years and was involved several acts of terrorism," the police said. Following a cordoned search operation in Dadsara village of Tral in Pulwama district, an encounter began shortly after 7 pm on Thursday, security officials said.

According to local residents, the operation continued for nearly 12 hours and ended Friday morning. "Firing started in the evening, security forces set the house (where Zakir was hiding) on fire around midnight. He (Zakir) was killed early Friday morning," a Dadsara resident said.

Zakir was killed as soon he

came out of the two-storey house. The body was found in a small orchard close the compound, it was informed.

In the news spread, despite restrictions put up by the authorities may people from near and far arrived at Noorpara village close to Dadsara, where Zakir's family lives. Clashes were reported from several parts of the Valley on Friday.

Late Thursday evening, soon after the encounter began, the police picked up the owner of the house where Zakir was hid-

ing. The house owner, identified as Mudair Ahmad, was in custody of the security forces throughout the night, according to his family members.

A close relative of Mudair said: "Three women were in the house when the incident occurred. They had specific information that Zakir was hiding in the house. The family members (of Mudair) were asked to leave the area and then the encounter began."

At Zakir's three-storey house, women continued to pour in on Friday to meet Zakir's mother,

Shahzada, to pay their condolences. Outside, people were headed towards the funeral ground.

Shahzada told The Indian Express, "I had not seen him since 2016. I was waiting to see him for last time now today, but I could not. They brought him for every little time and took him away."

Shahzada said they learnt about his death in the morning. Zakir was studying at a Chandigarh college before he went missing in 2015 and joined the militant ranks.

## Meghalaya HC overrules own judge who called for Hindu India

IN DECEMBER 2018, the single bench of Justice S R Sen in the Meghalaya High Court had observed that Pakistan had declared itself an Islamic country and India should have also been declared a Hindu country but "remained a secular country".

Justice Sen also quoted a book, 'My People Uprooted: The Exodus of Hindus from East Pakistan and Bangladesh', authored by Meghalaya Governor Tathagata Ray and stated that he is "convinced that only this Government under Shri Narendra Modi will understand the gravity, and will do the needful."

Five months later, a division bench led by Meghalaya Chief Justice Mohammad Yaqoob Mir and Justice H S Thangkhair Friday overruled Justice Sen's order, holding it "legally flawed". "Inconsistent with the Constitutional principles" and offending the "secular colour of the country", Justice Sen, now retired, on December 10 last year while disposing a petition regarding the grant of a domicile certificate had observed that the Centre should bring a law to allow non-Muslim and tribal communities like Khasis from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan to live in India without any cut-off year and be given citizenship without any question or production of document.

Justice Sen had also called the process of updating the National Register of Citizens (NRC) in Assam "defective as many foreigners become Indians and original Indians are left out which is very sad".

He had also dwelt on themes of citizenship since he felt that while hearing a case of domicile certificate, he will "fall in his duty" if he does not "project the original India and its partition".

Within days of his order,

Justice Sen had issued a clarification saying that does not "belong to any political party" nor did he have "any dream to get any political berth after my retirement and neither is my judgement politically motivated or influenced by any party".

On Friday, the division bench set aside Justice Sen's order "in its entirety". "After bestowing our thoughtful consideration to the entire gamut of the matter we have reached to a firm conclusion that the judgment impugned dated 10.12.2018 is legally flawed and is inconsistent with the constitutional principles, the observations made and directions passed therein are totally superfluous, therefore, it is set aside in its entirety, as such shall be non-est," stated the order.

"Learned Advocate General was right in contending that in exercise of writ jurisdiction even otherwise direction for any policy framing is impermissible. According to him, in effect, while referring to the different faiths, observations have been made to bring a law so as to safeguard the interest of Hindus, Sikhs, Jains, Buddhists, Christians, Parsis, Khasis and Gars who have already come to India and who are yet to come from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan as well as persons of Indian origin who are residing abroad. These were not the issues at all and have a colour of offending secular colour of the country and the provisions of the Constitution of India."

## SC quashes Kolkata ex-top cop's plea for extension of protection

THE SUPREME COURT on Friday turned down former Kolkata police commissioner Rajeev Kumar's plea for further extension of protection from arrest in the Saradha chit fund scam case.

But a bench headed by Justice Arun Mishra said the courts were sitting and Kumar could go there to file his plea. "You can go to the High Court or the trial court as the courts are functional there," the bench told Kumar's counsel Sunil Fernandes.

Fernandes contended that the courts were not sitting on account of the lawyers' strike. The bench corrected him: "You are wrong. The courts are sitting there... Your client is a former commissioner of police and he knows the law better than many young lawyers."

The bench also took exception to Kumar approaching it with the petition

even after his prayer had already been dealt with by Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi. "You have already moved an application for extension of protection before the CJ. Do you want harsh comment from us? It is not proper for you to file the petition and then request for urgent listing when the CJ had already declined urgent listing of your applications. Don't misuse our generosity like this," the bench said.

When Fernandes submitted that the protection granted to Kumar would end today, the court added "what can be done? Do we have the jurisdiction to hear this? Your problem may be anything but your petition under Article 32 is not maintainable."

Hearing a plea by the CBI, seeking his custodial interrogation, a bench headed by the CJ had on May 17 with- drawn its earlier order of February 6 granting Kumar protection from arrest.

It, however, allowed the protection to continue for seven more days from May 17 so as to enable him to approach the competent court for relief.

Hours after the Supreme Court declined to entertain Kumar's plea, a court in West Bengal cancelled the anticipatory bail plea by the former police commissioner on the ground of "faulty application".

Around 4 pm the court turned down Kumar's anticipatory bail plea which was faulty, and some documents were missing. He had filed it late and without any proper affidavit, so the court cancelled the defective application and he has been asked to file a fresh plea. For now the application stands cancelled," public prosecutor Sushov Mitra told reporters outside Barasat court.

The Election Commission had in the meanwhile ordered removal of Kumar, who was posted as Additional Director General, CID, in West Bengal for allegedly failing to control incidents of violence in the state and had asked him to report to the Union Home Ministry.

## SC refuses petition challenging order on Maratha reservation

THE SUPREME COURT on Friday refused to entertain a plea challenging the Maharashtra order introducing reservation for Marathas in admissions to Postgraduate medical and dental colleges.

A vacation bench headed by Justice Arun Mishra gave liberty to the petitioner students to approach the High Court after they expressed desire to withdraw the plea.

"The learned senior counsel appearing for the petitioners seeks leave to withdraw these writ petitions with liberty to approach the High Court in appropriate proceedings. With liberty as above, the writ petitions are disposed of as withdrawn. In case the petitioners approach

the High Court, we request the High Court to consider the matter as early as possible. Pending interlocutory application(s), if any, is/are disposed of as ordered. The Bench also comprising Justices BR Gavai and Surya Kant ordered."

The petitioners, three open category students, had challenged the ordinance a day Governor Ch. Vidyasaagar Rao signed in Maharashtra which was motivated by "political interests" and that there was "malafide intent".

On May 2, the Nagpur Bench of the Bombay High Court had ruled that the 16% Socially and Educationally Backward Classes (SEBC) quota cannot be applied to PG admissions for the current academic year.

The State challenged this in the SC which however upheld the High Court order.
