Planning airport in Palghar, says Aaditya Thackeray



“Even though everything was stalled due to Covid restrictions, a number of policy decisions were taken and tourism policy was formulated in consultation with all the stakeholders on how to develop the tourism industry (in the state) in the next few years. It has been decided recently to keep the CRZ area in Mumbai up to 50 metres



and a decision is expected to be taken by January regarding Konkarn CRZ,” Thackeray said. “In many important cities

of the world, life goes on 24 hours a day. Therefore, it is important to have ‘Mumbai 24 Hours’ all day of the week,” he said.

MAHARASHTRA TOURISM MINISTER Aaditya Thackeray on Friday said the state government would set up an airport in Palghar, considering that the Mumbai airport is being used to its full potential while the Navi Mumbai airport, which will be operational in future, might be insufficient to cater to requirements.

Thackeray added while a decision on the Konkarn Coastal Regulation Zone (CRZ) is expected to be taken by January, steps are being taken to set up a Bollywood and cricket museum in Mumbai.

He made the announcement at a tourism conclave, organised by Loksatta, the Marathi daily of *The Indian Express* group, to discuss the development opportunities of the tourism sector in the state.

Puneet Chhatwal, Chair-

man-CII National Committee On Tourism & Hospitality and MD & CEO, Indian Hotels Company Ltd was present as a special guest.

Thackeray, who inaugurated the conclave, also discussed various schemes being implemented by the government for the growth of tourism in the state.

“Compared to the facilities available in Mumbai, Palghar has less facilities and more attention is being given there. In future, there will be a lot of strain on the Mumbai and the Navi Mumbai airports and another airport is needed.” Considering the period of few years required to develop a new airport, planning has already started for the construction of an airport at Palghar,” he said.

He noted that the government is considering setting up a cricket museum at the Wankhede stadium and the search is on to find a suitable location for setting up a Bollywood museum.

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Amarinder: Decision to leave Cong final

PRESS TRUST OF INDIA CHANDIGARH, OCT 30

FORMER PUNJAB chief minister Amarinder Singh on Saturday dismissed reports of backend talks with the Congress, saying the time for rapprochement is over and his decision to leave the party is final.

Singh reiterated that he will soon launch his political party and said he wanted to build "a strong collective force in the interest of Punjab".

"Reports of backend talks with @INCIndia are incorrect. The time for rapprochement is over. The decision to part ways with the party was taken after much thought and is final. I'm grateful to (Congress president) Sonia Gandhi ji for her support but will not stay in Congress now," Singh's media advisor tweeted, quoting the former chief minister.

Singh was reacting to some media reports which suggested that some Congress leaders are engaged in backend talks to persuade him to remain in the party. "I will soon launch my own party and will hold talks for seat sharing with @BJP4India (BJP), breakaway Akali factions and others for the Punjab (Assembly) elections in 2022 once farmers' issue is resolved. I want to build strong collective force in interest of Punjab and its farmers," Singh

said. Farmers, mainly from Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh, are protesting at Delhi border points against three central farm laws, which were enacted in September last year, and are demanding these be repealed.

The former chief minister on Wednesday had said he would launch his new political party as and when the Election Commission clears the name and the symbol. He had also slammed the Congress while claiming that many people from the party are in touch with him.

Punjab goes to polls early next year. Singh had earlier said that he would soon launch his own party, and that he was hopeful of a seat adjustment with the BJP provided the ongoing farmers' stir against farm laws was resolved in their interest. He had resigned as Punjab chief minister last month.

Bypolls: Over 50% turnout reported from most states

A VOTER TURNOUT of over 50 percent was reported from most places where bypolls were held on Saturday. Elections were held for 3 Lok Sabha constituencies and 29 Assembly seats.

In Assam, five Assembly seats went to polls - Gossaigaon, Bhabanipur, Tamulpur, Mariani and Thowra. Voting was peaceful in the five seats with strict adherence to Covid-19 protocol, officials said.

The highest voter turnout of 76.71 per cent was recorded in Gossaigaon, followed by Thowra (75.07 per cent), Bhabanipur (74 per cent), Tamulpur (62 per cent) and Mariani (61.62 per cent), the official of the state Chief Electoral

Officer's office said. In Rajasthan, an average of 65 per cent voter turnout was recorded in the bypoll to Dhariawad and Vallabh Nagar assembly constituencies till 5 pm. The bypolls were necessitated due to the demise of Congress MLA from Vallabh Nagar Gajendra Singh Shaktawat and BJP legislator from Dhariawad Gautam Lal Meena.

In Haryana's Ellenabad constituency, over 73 per cent voter turnout was recorded till 5 pm, officials said. The bypoll was necessitated by Indian National Lok Dal (INLD) leader Abhay Singh Chautala's resignation as the MLA from the seat in January in protest against the Centre's new farm laws.

A total of three Assembly seats went for polls in Meghalaya. Chief Electoral Officer FR Kharkongor said an average of around 64 per cent turnout was recorded till 3 pm

"Voting picked up around noon and the turnout has improved in the second half of the day," the CEO told PTI. Bypolls were necessitated following the death of sitting MLAs.

Voting for the crucial Mandi Lok Sabha bypoll in Himachal Pradesh saw a relatively low turnout of 49.83 per cent till 5 PM, officials said. The voting numbers for the Jubbal-Kotkhai Assembly segment were the highest at 66.10 per cent.

In Dadra and Nagar Haveli, where the bypoll was necessitated by the death of seven-time independent MP Mohan Delkar, a turnout of 67 per cent was recorded till 5 pm. Delkar allegedly hanged himself at a Mumbai hotel on February 22 this year.

In Karnataka, where two Assembly constituencies -- Sindgi and Hangal went to polls - a turnout of 56.78 per cent was recorded till 3pm, officials said.

UP: BJP MLA, 6 rebel BSP legislators join SP

PRESS TRUST OF INDIA LUCKNOW, OCTOBER 30

SEVEN LEGISLATORS -- one BJP MLA and six suspended from the BSP -- joined the Samajwadi Party (SP) in Uttar Pradesh on Saturday in the presence of former chief minister Akhilesh Yadav, who attacked the Yogi Adityanath-led government and said the BJP and the Congress "are the same".

"The people of the state are so agitated that the BJP will be wiped out in the coming days and Bhajpa pariwar (the BJP family) will appear as Bhaagta Pariwar (runaway family)," the SP chief said in Lucknow. Yadav also indicated that other leaders from the BJP were in touch with him in the poll-bound state.

BJP MLA from Sitapur Rakesh Rathore and BSP rebel leaders Aslam Raini (Shrawati), Sushma Patel (Madiyahan), Aslam Ali (Hapur), Hakim Lal Bind (Handia), Mujtaba Siddiqui (Phoolpur) and Hargovind Bhargava (Sidhauli) joined the SP on Saturday.

Yadav said the BJP will not get enough ticket aspirants "even if it declares 403 chief ministers" as the party is starting at a defeat in the assembly polls due early next year. UP Assembly has a to-

tal of 403.

Rathore has previously courted controversy. A video released online earlier in the year purportedly showed him criticising Prime Minister Narendra Modi for asking people to clap and clang bells and plates to show solidarity with frontline and health care workers during the Covid-19 pandemic. Rathore was then asked by the BJP leadership to explain his purported remarks.

The Bahujan Samaj Party rebels who joined the SP were suspended by BSP President Mayawati after they opposed the nomination of the party's official candidate Ramji Gautam for

Rajya Sabha in October 2020. There was speculation that the BSP leaders had met Yadav earlier this year and hinted at a possible switch.

Yadav took a swipe at Union Home Minister Amit Shah for saying that 90 per cent promises of the BJP manifesto had been fulfilled by the ruling party.

"The first thing mentioned in it was for the farmers that a roadmap to double their income will be prepared by 2022 and they assured farmers in this regard from various platforms. I want to know what has happened to it," the SP leader said.

Yadav also distanced himself from the Congress.

TN minister eats with indigenous community after discrimination allegations

DAYS AFTER a video went viral on social media in which a woman of the indigenous Narikurava community is seen complaining of being denied meals at a food offering event at a temple near Mamallapuram, the Minister for Hindu religious and Charitable Endowments (HR & CE) P K Sekar Babu visited the temple on Friday and had lunch with the woman and her community members who allegedly faced the discrimination.

The purported incident took place at an Annadhanam event at the Sthalasayana Perumal temple on the outskirts of Chennai where a woman was denied food, allegedly for being a Narikurava. Narikurava are traditional hunters, mainly of rats and snakes, in urban neighbourhoods.

A senior HR & CE official said it was the office of Chief Minister M K Stalin that alerted them about the video.

AN OFFICER and a jawan of the Army were killed in a blast near a forward post along the Line of Control (LoC) in Rajouri district of Jammu and Kashmir on Saturday, officials said.

The blast took place in Kadal area of Nowshera sector when an Army column was on patrol duty as part of measures to check infiltration of terrorists from across the border, the officials said.

They said the two Army per-

sonnel, including a lieutenant, were critically injured in the explosion and immediately evacuated to a nearby military hospital where they died later. They said the area where the explosion took place is dotted with landmines planted by the Army as part of the counter-infiltration arrangement. The nature of the explosion was not immediately known, the officials said, without ruling out the possibility of the use of improvised explosive device (IED) by terrorists to target the patrol team. A defence spokesperson confirmed the explosion.

Drugs case: NCB team leaves Mumbai without statements of key witnesses

A SPECIAL team of the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) investigating the cruise ships drugs case left for Delhi on Saturday without recording the statement of witness Prabhakar Sail, who had raised extortion charges against Mumbai zonal director Sameer Wankhede, an official said. Bollywood actor Shah Rukh Khan's son Aryan is one of the accused in the case.

The five-member team, headed by NCB Deputy Director General (northern region) Gyaneshwar Singh, reached Mumbai on Wednesday to record statements after a departmental vigilance probe was ordered against Wankhede and others following Sail's claims that a pay off of Rs 25 crore was discussed in connection with the case of which Rs 8 crore was meant for Wankhede.

In the last three days, the NCB team recorded statements of eight people, including Wankhede, the official said. However, the team could not record the statements of Sail and KP Gosavi, another NCB witness in the case.

Sail, an independent witness,

has alleged that he overheard Gosavi, arrested by the Pune Police in a separate cheating case on Thursday, discussing the Rs 25 crore demand. Sail used to work as a bodyguard for Gosavi. Wankhede has dismissed all allegations against him.

Officials of the NCB team

had said that Sail was a "critical witness" in the inquiry and without his statement, the team will not be able to reach any conclusion.

DDG Gyaneshwar Singh had appealed to Sail through media to come forward to record his statement. Singh

had also written to Mumbai Police Commissioner Hemant Nagrale to convey to Sail to present himself before the NCB team on Saturday, but Sail did not turn up.

As both Gosavi and Sail were not available, the NCB team left for Delhi, the official said.

A SPECIAL court on Saturday sentenced Yogendra Sagar, a former BSP MLA, to life imprisonment and imposed a fine of Rs 30,000 in connection with the abduction and rape of a student 13 years ago. Sagar was the BSP MLA from Bilsa seat of Budaun district at the time of the incident. He was convicted by Judge Akhilesh Kumar for abducting an undergraduate student in 2008 from Bilsa, and raping her on multiple occasions, an official said. Two others accused in the case, Tejendra Sagar, and Neeraj alias Minu Sharma, were sentenced to life term earlier.
