## Andhra Covid care...

"The hospital and the hotel staff members are safe. Six patients, who had very mild symptoms, were sent to their homes, while another 15 were admitted to hospital," they told reporters. Of the two committees constituted, one would examine whether the hospital management had requisite permission to run the CCC in a hotel and the other would probe the cause of the fire and related aspects.

## CISF official asked...

She has reached the national capital and she will be there for a few more days and has official engagements. "I would like to know from when being Indian is equal to knowing Hindi," she tweeted with the hashtag "hindiimposition." The Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) sought details from her soon after. "Warm greetings from @CISFHQs. We sincerely acknowledge your unpleasant experience. Kindly DM journey details; name of airport, location, date, and time of the incident for appropriate action in the matter," the CISF tweeted. Soon, the CISF said it has "ordered an Enquiry into the matter. It is not the policy of CISF to insist upon any particular language." The MP replied saying "Thank you for the immediate response and assurance to take action." Kanimozhi is the member of Parliament from Thoothukkudi in Tamil Nadu.

## 11 members of...

According Kewal Ram (35), they had dinner between 9 pm and 10 pm on Saturday and went to sleep. "I went to guard our crop from animals and slept there," he said. In the morning, when he came back, he found all his family members dead. "I then called my nephew who rushed to the spot with some other persons and informed police," said Kewal Ram, expressing his ignorance about the incident. Those, who died have been identified as Budharam (75); his wife Antara Devi; son Ravi (31); daughters Jiya (25) and Suman (22); grandsons Mukdash (17) and Nain (12); Laxmi (40) and three minor sons of Kewal Ram.

## Posting controversial pic...

The BJP leaders led by city president Gaurav Ranadive, MP Shankar Lalwani, MLAs-Ramesh Mendola, Akash Vijayvargiya and Malini Gaud had lodged a written complaint against Patwari with DIG Harinarayanchari Mishra to act against him under the sections of IT Act and arrest him for hurting the sentiments of people. "Patwari had posted a controversial photo of Modi on his official twitter handle in which the PM was shown with a bowl in his hand. The picture is tempered and the original picture is of the time when the PM was in Ayodhya for Ramjannbhoomi puja," Ranadive said. He also alleged that Patwari has hurt sentiments of thousands of people and also tried to defame the honorable Prime Minister. The police registered an FIR against the former minister under sections 188 and 464 of IPC.

## India bans import...

This is a big step towards self-reliance in defence. It also offers a great opportunity to the Indian defence industry to rise to the occasion to manufacture the items in the negative list using their own design and development capabilities or by adopting the technologies designed and developed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) to meet the requirements of the armed forces in the coming years. "The list was prepared by MoD after several rounds of consultations with all stakeholders, including the Army, Air Force, Navy, DRDO, defence public sector undertakings (DP-SUs), Ordnance Factory Board (OFB) and private industry to assess current and future capabilities of the Indian industry for manufacturing various ammunition / weapons /platforms /equipment within India," the MoD said in a statement. The list of 101 embargoed items comprises of not just simple parts but also some high technology weapon systems like artillery guns, assault rifles, corvettes, sonar systems, transport aircraft, light combat helicopters (LCHs), radars and many other items to fulfil the needs of the defence services. The list also includes wheeled armoured fighting vehicles (AFVs) with indicative import embargo date of December 2021, of which the Army is expected to contract almost 200 at an approximate cost of over Rs 5,000 crore. Similarly, the Navy is likely to place demands for submarines with indicative import embargo date of December 2021, of which it expects to contract about six at an approximate cost of almost Rs 42,000 crore. For the Air Force, it was decided to enlist the LCA MK 1A with an indicative embargo date of December 2020. Of these, 123 are anticipated at an approximate cost of over Rs 85,000 crore. The embargo on imports is planned to be progressively implemented between 2020 and 2024.

## Cong seen as...

Asked about growing voices in the Congress that Rahul must come back as party chief and if it was the best possible scenario that he returns, Tharoor said, "Of course, if Rahul is ready to resume the leadership, all he has to do is to withdraw his resignation. He was elected to serve till December 2022 and can just pick up the reins again." "But if he does not, we have to take action. My own personal view, which as you know I have been advocating for some time now, is that elections to the CWC and for the post of president would certainly have a number of beneficial outcomes for the party," Tharoor said. A participatory democratic process would significantly add to the incoming leader's credibility and legitimacy which, in turn, would be vital assets as they set about the significant organisational challenges associated with re-energising the rank and file of the party, the MP from Thiruvananthapuram said. Tharoor asserted that his larger argument was not about any individual but about advocating a process or a system through which the Congress can address existing leadership issues and then embark immediately on the process of revitalising and energising the party nationally. "Through his activities during this lockdown, whether it has been on the issue of the COVID-19 virus or Chinese transgressions, Rahul Gandhi has without a question and almost single-handedly done a remarkable job in holding the present government accountable for its actions and failures," he said.

## Covid hits 3,800 central security personnel in NE

**GUWAHATI/AGARTALA/AIZAWL:** As coronavirus spreads across the northeast, nearly 3,800 central security force personnel have so far infected by the disease in almost all the states in the region, officials said on Sunday.

According to the health officials, the eight north-eastern states have so far recorded around 75,000 Covid-19 cases, including 57,714 in Assam.

Of the 3,800 Covid cases among the central armed forces personnel, the highest number are in Nagaland, at 1,226, followed by 823 in Manipur, 738 in Arunachal Pradesh, 360 in Tripura, 350 in Mizoram and 300 in Meghalaya. Many of their family members, including children, were also infected.

A significant chunk of the coronavirus patients among the central forces are from the Border Security Force (BSF). Two BSF jawans in Tripura and one in Meghalaya also succumbed to the highly infectious virus.

Many Indian Army, Indian Air Force, and National Disaster Response Force personnel have also tested positive for coronavirus.

Mizoram Chief Minister Zoramthanga even made a plea to Prime Minister Narendra Modi to ensure suspension of Central Paramilitary Forces (CPMF) movement into the state till August 31, noting that around 70 per cent of Covid-19 positive cases in the state are from the military and paramilitary forces.

## Kerala landslide death toll touches 43

**KOCHI:** Even as Kerala grapples with a bout of heavy rainfall, the death toll in the landslide that took place in Idukki district two days ago rose to 43 after rescue officials retrieved 17 more bodies from the debris on Sunday, according to local media reports. Efforts are underway to trace the missing others—estimated to be nearly 20 - amid inclement weather conditions.

Authorities have decided to take the help of sniffer dogs to trace the persons buried under the debris, officials told news agency PTI. The rain-triggered landslide occurred in the early hours of Friday when a hillock at a tea plantation at Rajamala near Munnar came down, burying a row of quarters of estate workers—78 people living in 30 rooms. The workers and their families were sleeping and most of them could not escape.

Elaborating about the seating plan of the assembly, Dikshit on Sunday said the members will be seated leaving a seat between them vacant. Some of them will be seated in the lobby and the visitors' gallery, he said. "The MLAs will be thermally scanned before they enter the House. I am sure that members will come here wearing a mask. If they do not come wearing a mask, we will give them one," he said.

# ED sees Rhea brother as weakest link in chain

The Enforcement Directorate has decided to concentrate on the weakest link in the Rhea-Sushant chain—her brother Showik, who was known for his easy ways, penchant for clinging onto affluent friends and was more likely to have benefited from his sister's proximity to the deceased actor.

It is not surprising, therefore, that Showik Chakraborty was grilled for about 18 hours in connection with a money laundering case that ED suspects is linked to the death of actor Sushant Singh Rajput.

Showik left the central investigative agency's office in the Ballard Estate around 6:30 am after an overnight questioning session that began around



noon on Saturday. The grilling focussed mostly on his spending habits, the mismatch with his income, personal business and investments and financial transactions with his sister and Rajput. He was grilled by the agency for a few hours on August 7 as well, the day Rhea was questioned by the agency for the first time. According to officials, he has reportedly given "eva-

sive or unconvincing replies" to the ED team and is likely to be summoned again.

Rhea and her father Indrajit have been summoned to appear before the agency again on Monday. Also in the spotlight are Rhea's chartered accountant Ritesh Shah and business manager Shruti Modi, who also worked for Rajput.

Agency sources have said they "want more answers" from Rhea over the alleged discrepancies between her income, expenditure and investments. They said while Chakraborty had filed Income Tax returns declaring an income of about Rs 14 lakh, the value of her investments was reportedly higher.

Also under the ED's scanner is a property located in the city's Khar area and another in Navi Mumbai, both linked to Rhea.

## 3 villages' 73 years of wait for power ends

### THE VILLAGES ALONG LOC CONNECTED TO NATIONAL ELECTRICITY GRID

Negotiating months of heavy snowing and the Covid-19 lockdown, the Kupwara district administration connected three villages located along the Line of Control in Jammu and Kashmir's Keran area to the national electricity grid, ending a wait since Independence for power supply.

The job was not easy, officials said, recalling the acute shortage of manpower for the work after restrictions were imposed following the abrogation of Article 370 last year and the imposition of lockdown due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

It is an arduous five hours journey to Keran from here on a fair-weather road that meanders through apple and walnut orchards of the Kashmir Valley and the Pherkian Pass at 10,000 feet in the Shamasbari Ranges.

Keran remains cut-off for nearly six months due to heavy snow which can reach heights of nine to 12 feet. For three hours of electricity, the Keran area, with a population of 14,000 in four panchayats, was till recently

dependent on three old diesel generator (DG) sets, for which fuel was transported from the district headquarters.

"Installed over a decade back, the three DG sets were prone to frequent breakdowns further disrupting the meagre power supply, more so in winters when conducting repairs are next to impossible," Deputy Commissioner, Kupwara, Anshul Garg, told PTI.

In 2012, the area's residents were hopeful that a solution to their power problems was found. The plan was to extend power lines to Keran and establish a grid station at a cost of Rs 6.5 crore.

But hopes started to wither as no substantial progress was made on the project for nearly seven years, apart from the installation of some solar lighting systems that had limited efficiency even during the summers, some villagers in Keran said.

Not being directly connected to the national power grid threw Keran into extreme backwardness with lack of industries and limited access to medical facilities and television.

## Six Raj BJP MLAs leave for unknown destination

**AHMEDABAD:** Six BJP MLAs from Rajasthan who had arrived in Gujarat ahead of the crucial Assembly session in that state starting on August 14 left for an undisclosed location in the early hours of Sunday.

The Congress government in Rajasthan under Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot is in strife after Deputy CM Sachin Pilot rebelled and was sacked from the post.

The six BJP MLAs had reached Somnath from Porbandar on Saturday evening, with one of them telling reporters that the Congress government in Rajasthan was "harassing" opposition MLAs, and that they had come on a pilgrimage to Somnath to seek mental peace.

The forest guards spotted the cow elephant while they were on rounds and informed the veterinarian with the forest department, sources said. Dr Prabu went to the spot and found the elephant suffering from dehydration, the sources said.

## Disha not naked when body was found: DCP

Deputy Commissioner of Police (Zone-11, Mumbai) Vishal Thakur on Sunday refuted reports that the body of deceased Disha Salian, former manager of actor Sushant Singh Rajput, was found naked by the police team when they reached the spot.

The DCP's (Deputy Commissioner of Police) comments came in the wake of some portals running stories claiming that Salian's post-mortem reports said that her body was found in nude condition by the police team.

Upon reaching the spot, as per Thakur, the police team had conducted 'panchnama' of the body in the presence of her parents; they have also recorded statements of about 25 people thus far in connection with her death, including the

last person she had spoken to before her death.

"This is to clarify that the reports of Disha Salian's body being found naked is false. After the incident, the police immediately reached the spot and did 'panchnama' of the body. Her parents were at the spot," Thakur said.

Salian had allegedly jumped off the 14th floor of a building in the Jankalyan area of Mumbai's Malad region in June. "Disha had made last call to her friend Ankita whose statement has been recorded."

A Public Interest Litigation has also filed in the Supreme Court for court-monitored Central Bureau of Investigation probe into the Salian's death, stating that her death is inter-linked with that of Rajput's. Salian died on June 8, following which a few days later on June 14 Rajput was found dead at his residence.

## Heavy rainfall in most parts of Odisha in next 5 days: MeT

**BHUBANESWAR:** A fresh low-pressure area has formed over the Bay of Bengal on Sunday, which is likely to trigger heavy rainfall in most parts of Odisha in next five days, prompting the state government to direct all district administrations to remain prepared to deal with possible waterlogging and local flooding. Under the influence of Saturdays cyclonic circulation, a low-pressure area has formed on Sunday over northwest and adjoining west-central Bay of Bengal off Odisha- north Andhra Pradesh coast, the Meteorological Centre here said. The low-pressure area now lies over north-west Bay of Bengal off north Odisha-Gangetic West Bengal coast, it said. Many places in the state have already been battered by heavy downpour in the last few days under the influence of a low-pressure area over north Bay of Bengal and the new one is likely to bring more rainfall of varying intensity in several areas till August 13, it said. Forecasting strong surface winds with speeds reaching up to 40-50 kmph over west-central Bay of Bengal, the MeT Centre here advised the fishermen to refrain from venturing into deep sea till Tuesday.
