# Nitish & Naidu: Men of the moment


The stance of the two leaders from Andhra Pradesh and Bihar will be crucial for any govt at the Centre

New Delhi, June 4

**WITH THE BJP** likely to fall behind the majority mark, the formation of a new Narendra Modi government will now depend on the support of two veteran kingmakers—the Telugu Desam Party or TDP's Chandrababu Naidu and Janata Dal (United) or JD(U)'s Nitish Kumar, both partners of the BJP in the NDA.

According to trends released by the Election Commission of India (ECI), at 4.15 pm, the BJP was leading or had won 240 seats, almost 30 seats short of the majority mark of 272. The TDP was leading or had won on 16 seats, all in Andhra Pradesh, and the JD(U) was leading or had won at 14 seats, all in Bihar.

If these numbers do not change significantly, Naidu and Nitish could be the men who would prop up Narendra Modi in New Delhi. Here's a short history of these two leaders and their remarkable political trajectories over the years.



**CHANDRABABU NAIDU**

NAIDU, WHO CONTESTED

the Lok Sabha polls and the Assembly polls in Andhra in alliance with the BJP and the Jana Sena party, has been a kingmaker on many occasions in the past.

In 1996, when the electorate delivered a fractured mandate in the Lok Sabha polls, Naidu, as the convenor of the United Front, a coalition of parties not aligned with either the Congress or the BJP, propped up the H D Deve Gowda government with outside support from the Congress.

**WHAT IS POSSIBLE:**

Emerging once again as the largest NDA partner of the BJP, Naidu could again be kingmaker and herald the resurgence of his party that has suffered some serious setbacks in the past few years.

**NOTE OF CAUTION:**

However, it may be remembered that in a hung Parliament, there are no fixed loyalties. TDP, though formed on a plank of anti-Congressism, has earlier done business with the grand old party where it not only contested the Telangana Assembly polls in alliance with the Congress but even tried to stitch an Opposition alliance with the Congress in the lead ahead of 2019 polls.



**NITISH KUMAR**

A VETERAN OF SOCIAL JUSTICE politics in Bihar, Nitish Kumar was briefly the Union Minister for Railways and Minister for Surface Transport and, later, the Minister for Agriculture in 1998-99 in the NDA government of Atal Bihari Vajpayee. He again got the portfolio in the Vajpayee government of 2000-2004.

For the longest time, Nitish remained the senior partner in the NDA in Bihar and was the BJP's biggest ally in 2009 winning 20 seats in the state when the saffron party did poorly at the national level.

However, of late Nitish's politics has been characterised by a series of flip flops. In 2014, he broke away from the NDA preceding the rise of Narendra Modi and contested the Bihar Lok Sabha polls alone, but won only two seats. Following this, he joined hands with Lalu Yadav for the 2015 Assembly elections and the alliance swept the polls.

Within two years, however, he broke away and joined the NDA again and the alliance swept Bihar Lok Sabha polls winning 39 of the 40 seats. However, after the JD(U) fared poorly in 2020 Bihar Assembly polls despite the alliance winning the elections, Kumar became increasingly uncomfortable with the BJP and broke the alliance in 2022 to form a government with the RJD. However, just ahead of 2024 polls, Kumar again joined the NDA.

**WHAT IS POSSIBLE:**

IDU's better showing than its alliance partner in Bihar in these polls has once again brought Kumar to the Centrestage and given a new lease of life to his party.

**NOTE OF CAUTION:**

Nitish's famous reputation of switching sides, which has given him the reputation of "Palu Ram" in Bihar. The more cynical observers would say he could go anywhere.

## 2 jailed candidates have won LS polls

**THE VICTORY** of two candidates who are in jail on terror charges has brought up a unique situation. While the law will keep them away from attending proceedings of the 18th Lok Sabha, they also have a Constitutional right to take oath as members.

In the results declared by the Election Commission on Tuesday, jailed Sikh preacher Amritpal Singh has won from the Khadon Sabih seat, while incarcerated Sheikh Abdul Rashid, also known as Engineer Rashid, emerged victorious from the Baramulla constituency.

Engineer Rashid has been lodged in the Tihar jail since August 9, 2019 on charges of alleged terror financing, while Singh has been booked under the National Security Act and sent to the Dibrugarh jail of Assam.

UNITED NATIONS SECRETARY-General Antonio Guterres

general PJD Achari emphasised the importance of following the Constitutional provisions in such cases.

Being sworn in as a member of Parliament is a constitutional right, he said.

But because they are currently in jail, Engineer Rashid and Singh must seek the permission from the authorities to be escorted to Parliament for the oath-taking ceremony.

"We can't officially comment until all the voting, all the

counting has been done. But we understand that the counting is still taking place. We hope to have much more official statement once everything has been said and done," Florence Soto Nio, Associate Spokesperson for the Secretary-General, said at the daily press briefing in response to a question on the results of the Indian elections.

"We of course want to congratulate the people of India for engaging in this massive exercise of democracy as they are the largest democratic elections

in the world," she said.

The BJP, whose candidates had contested in the name of Modi, won or was ahead in 240 seats to emerge as the single largest party in the 543-member Lok Sabha.

BJP's key allies TDP and JD(U) were leading or winning 16 and 12 seats in Andhra Pradesh and Bihar respectively.

With the support of its other allies, the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) was

on course to reach the 272-majority mark.

## 5 leaders crush highest victory margin, Indore's Lalwani tops the chart

AT LEAST FIVE POLITICAL LEADERS, including four from the BJP, crushed the previous record of the highest victory margin in the Lok Sabha polls, with Indore's incumbent MP Shankar Lalwani topping the chart with a winning margin of more than 1.17 million votes.

Home Minister Amit Shah, former Madhya Pradesh chief minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan and BJP's Gujarat leader CR Patil were also leading with more than seven lakh votes each from their respective constituencies at the last count. Congress's Rabib Hussain is also leading from Dhubri in Assam by a margin of more than 73,000 votes.

Before their record-crushing spree, the record for the highest winning margin was held by Trimant Munde, also from the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), who had won a bypoll in October 2014 from Beed in Maharashtra by more than 696,000 votes.

Patil, a three-term MP from Navsari, held the record for the second-highest margin after he won the poll contest by 689,000 votes in 2019. He has now broken his own record and was leading by 767,000 votes at 4:30 pm.

Chouhan was ahead from Vidisha by more than 7,96,000 votes. Shah was leading the poll race in Gadchiroli by a margin of more than 737,000 votes while Aviation Minister Jayant Sinha was ahead from Tripura West by a margin of more than 540,000 votes.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi was leading by more than 149,000 votes from Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi was also leading from Wayanad in Kerala by a margin of more than 364,000 votes. Former Tripura chief minister Biplob Kumar Deb of the BJP was leading from Tripura West by a margin of more than 326,000 votes.

BJP's Brinjamohon Agrawal was leading by a margin of more than 443,000 votes from Raigarh.

Hema Malini of the BJP who is seeking a 'hot' ticket from Mathura, was leading by 261,000 votes while Mahesh Sharma was leading by 557,000 votes from Noida.

In Haryana, Congress's Kumari Selja and Deepender Singh Hooda are ahead from Sirsa and Rohtak by 267,000 votes and 301,000 votes respectively.
