As conflict intensifies in Ukraine, evacuated Indian students worry about their future Ahmedabad: 9 part of interstate child trafficking racket arrested



Ahmedabad : As the armed military conflict between Russia and Ukraine continues to intensify, the medical students from India who have escaped the war-torn nation and returned home have begun to worry about the future of their academic courses. Most of the students have begun to contemplate their future course of action following the heavy destruction of infrastructure in the ongoing conflict in Ukraine, among the most prominent foreign destinations for medical courses. Twenty-year-old Gyanisha Patel, a third-year medical student at Ternopil University who returned from Ukraine on March 3 via Poland after remaining stranded at the Shehni-Medya border for three days, has a pragmatic

Jagruti adds that although the focus has been on restoring the health of her daughter, who stayed in sub-zero temperatures at the border for three days without meals and water, there is also anxiety about the future. "We can only hope and appeal to the government of India to intervene and take steps to safeguard the future of these students... Most parents whose children are in Ukraine for medical education due to the exorbitant fee structure in private colleges in India and also because universities in Ukraine are extremely professional and academic. If the government of India can address the issue of medical education in colleges in the country, we will be most happy to enroll our children in colleges here. Otherwise, we will have to look for another country as an option," she said.

Even as the National Medical Commission (NMC), the regulatory body in India for medical education and professional standards, Saturday announced that MBBS graduates from Ukraine, who clear the Foreign Medical Graduate Examination (FMGE) would be allowed to complete their internships in India,

parents of final-year undergraduates from Ukraine are worried. A parent of a sixth-year student from Bukovinian State Medical University (BMSU) in Chernivtsi said, "My daughter was just about four months away from graduating as an MBBS and this has happened... We are extremely anxious as she might have to possibly also repeat the year even if she chooses to complete her MBBS from another country... We have already spent close to Rs 25 lakhs on the course and her stay in Ukraine for the last six years. It would be unfair if the students have to pay a price for this." The students cite 'expensive' medical colleges in India as the major reason behind the medical aspirants choosing UK as their preferred destination. Paresh Patel, whose daughter is a fifth-year MBBS student from BSMU Chernivtsi, says, "Many students who head to Ukraine are those whose families cannot afford to pay a fee of up to Rs 1 crore for medical colleges in India just because they were not able to get into government-aided colleges on the basis of entrance scores... The entire six-year course in Ukraine is about Rs 20 lakh. The quality of education cannot be compared in Ukraine. If they resume the university, whenever they do, I will definitely send my daughter back to complete her course. Right now, they are not in a position to conduct online classes either."

Nisarg Patel, 21, from Shihori village in Banaskantha district said, "Studies here are too costly with limited seats. I chose Ukraine because I wanted to become a doctor and it made sense to get a degree with one-fourth of the cost. Ukraine is a good country with peaceful citizens, zero crime and that is the reason so many girls, too, have enrolled there for studies."

Concerned about his future prospects, Nisarg says, "If the war is over, only then can I think of going back to complete my studies. But what if the university is bombed and not there? We will be on the roads. The Indian government should think of something for us. Why do we expect Ukraine to think about us if our own country is not?"

Nisarg has already paid his three-year college fee, which comes up to Rs 6 lakh annually. He is the first from his family to enroll in a medical.



Ahmedabad : A total of nine persons, including two from Hyderabad, were arrested by police in Ahmedabad on Saturday for their alleged involvement in an interstate child trafficking racket in which a four-month-old infant girl was abducted from roads in Ahmedabad and sold off to couples.

According to police, the child was sold twice in Vadodra and Hyderabad to agents for Rs 2 lakh and she was finally rescued from Surat by the police.

The arrested accused have been identified as Chirag Sadhu (21), Kinjal Sadhu (30) and Vijay Kumar Parmar (38), all three from Lakhvad in Mehsana, along with Somesh Pujari (28) and Urmila Parmar (44) from Ahmedabad, Ashwin Khasia Jindal, and his wife Varsha Khasia (38) from

Ahmedabad after the child was abducted from Gomtipur. Using the vehicle number registration data at Memco Toll Plaza, we found out that the vehicle belonged to Vijay Parmar from Mehsana," said Achal Tyagi, deputy commissioner of police, Zone 5, Ahmedabad Police.

"Initially, Parmar was not found but we arrested one accused Chirag Sadhu from Mehsana, who revealed the conspiracy to us. On February 16, Sadhu, Kinjal and Vijay travelled from Mehsana to Ahmedabad in order to abduct a child. They were joined by another accused Somesh Pujari in Ahmedabad and the four did recte to the footpath area in Gomtipur. On February 17 early morning, the accused abducted the child and brought her to Mehsana," Tyagi added.

Police said that from Mehsana, the child was taken to Vadodra by the two accused Kinjal and Vijay wherein they met another two accused Ashwin Khasia and Varsha Khasia.

"The four accused then travelled to Hyderabad where a woman named Ramya bought the child from them for Rs 1.10 lakh. The child was then sold off to a couple in Surat," added Tyagi.

29 cases in Ahmedabad, no death in past 6 days

AHMEDABAD: The city recorded 29 new Covid cases in 24 hours, a slight increase from 25 recorded on Saturday. For the sixth consecutive day, the city did not register a single Covid death. In the past seven days, the city has recorded one death; Gujarat has recorded seven deaths in the same period. On Sunday, the only mortality reported was from Surat district.

In the past 24 hours, Gujarat recorded 71 new positive cases - 10 higher than 61 on Saturday. Out of total, 65% were recorded from six major cities.

Except Ahmedabad and Vadodra (11), all other districts and cities recorded five or less daily cases. On Sunday, 21 out of 33 districts and two cities recorded zero new cases.

1,000 hospitalised due to food poisoning in Mehsana



Ahmedabad : Over 1,000 people who attended a wedding dinner in the Savala village of Vinsagar, Mehsana on Friday were rushed to health facilities following food poisoning. According to Vinsagar taluka police, an inquiry has been initiated and proceedings shall be initiated accordingly. According to police inspector BL Maheriya of Vinsagar taluka police station, the wedding of former Congress leader Wazir Khan Pathan's son was held on March 3 and the next day on March 4 a dinner was organised at Savala with "12,000-15,000 guests in attendance", of which around 1,057 guests started exhibiting symptoms of food

poisoning such as vomiting and diarrhoea and were admitted at various health facilities in Gandhinagar. SP Parthrajsinh Gohil said that after being informed of the incident by hospital authorities, police registered a 'janjagot' (station diary entry) and pursuant to the same, an inquiry by the police has been initiated. "FSL and FDCA has taken samples of sweets and other food items served at the dinner and the results are awaited. Health department too is working on this and have taken samples of the vomit and stool. Prima facie it seems the caterer may have been negligent and there could have

been adulteration in the food," Gohil said. "In such a scenario, registering an FIR would be upto the host (Pathan) or the victims... Aggrieved parties can file the caterer and seek compensation for treatment costs etc. Usually because of the civil remedy available, criminal actions are not initiated right away. Approximately 1,250 guests were affected with mild to moderate symptoms. There have been no deaths so far," he added.
